President reviews International parade of fleet at Visakhapatnam

Visakhapatnam, Feb 6
International Fleet Review (IFR) gets underway in Vishakhapatnam Saturday morning with President Shri Pranab Mukherjee given 21-gun salute and the ceremonial Guard of Honour by 150 Navy personnel at the Naval Jetty.

Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi, Defence Minister Shri Manohar Parrikar, the three Service Chiefs, Andhra Pradesh Governor Shri ESL Narasimhan and Chief Minister Shri N. Chandrababu Naidu were present on the occasion.

Speaking on the occasion, President Shri Pranab Mukherjee said the fleet review signifies our common desire to use the seas to promote peace and



co-operation. The President also reviewed the Air Arm of the Indian Navy in full display with spectacular fly-past by several fixed wing and rotary aircraft comprising 15 formations of 45 aircraft including two formations

from the Indian Coast Guard. This also includes the latest acquisitions of the Indian Navy such as Carrier Borne Strike Fighter MIG 29K, Long Range Maritime Reconnaissance Aircraft, Illusion-38, Sea Harriers, P8I, Advanced Jet Trainer, Hawks and the AEW Helicopter KM-31, besides live demonstrations by Navy personnel. The enthralling waterfront activities, a display by Marine Commandos and Helicopter demonstrations enthralled the viewers.

People asked to desist from encroaching govt. land Check status of landed property before paying; be wary of unscrupulous elements: DCSA

Port Blair, Feb 6

The District Administration has, time and again brought to the notice of the general public to desist from encroaching on government land. In a press release received here today, the Deputy Commissioner, South Andaman has stated that many unscrupulous elements are of the view that encroachment over government land shall earn them the landed property by way of regularization and no action shall be taken against the encroacher.

It is brought to the notice once again that only pre-1978 encroachments were regularized and it was a one-time policy of the Government of India and thereafter no such scheme is in force, therefore, people should not be under the impression that if the encroachment on Government revenue land is done the same can be regularized.

Accordingly, the general public have been advised not to fall prey to unscrupulous elements who are luring them by selling encroached land at cheap rates. They may check the status of landed property before paying these elements their hard earned money. For this purpose they may get in touch with the respective Deputy Commissioner's Office to verify the title deed of the land.

People have been advised to desist from encroaching government land and also to pass on information of any unscrupulous elements doing so, to the District Control Room, Port Blair over phone to 1070, 238881, 240127, the release added.

Single shift KVs to work as NIOS Study Centre; ODE facility made available

The lotus shaped urn on the centre of Auroville is a symbolic gesture of human unity. It has a lush green landscape radiating out from its centre, the Matrimandir into four zones - the International, Cultural, Residential and Industrial with each focusing on an important aspect of community life.

The local media team went through the sprawling premises of Auroville, which was inaugurated on Feb 28, 1968. In the past 35 years, Auroville has grown into an expanding community consisting of about 90 settlements of varying size inhabited by nearly 1700 people from India and some

South Asian Games: India bag 13 Gold and 4 Silver medals on day 2

Guwahati, Feb 6
India today bagged 13 Gold and 4 Silver medals on the second day of the 12th South Asian Games being held in Guwahati and Shillong. Five Gold medals were won in Wrestling, three each in Weightlifting and Swimming, and two in Cycling. In Wrestling, all the Indian grapplers stole the show with a dominant performance. Women wrestlers Manisha, Archana and Priyanka won Gold medals in their respective categories.

In the Men's section, Ravinder beat Pakistan's Mohd. Bilal to win the coveted yellow metal in the Men's 57 kg category, with Rajneesh claiming the top honours in the 65 kg division. In Women's Weightlifting, Mirabai Chanu clinched the Gold in the 48 kg section making a new South Asian Games record, while Harshdeep Kaur brought laurels to the country in the 53 kg division. In the Men's section, India got a Gold in the 56 kg category through

Guru Raja. In Swimming, Sandeep Sejwal bagged the Gold in the Men's 200 metres breaststroke event, Shivani Kataria in the 200 metres freestyle and Damini Gowda in the Women's 100 metres Butterfly stroke. Saurabh Sangvekar took the Silver in the Men's 200 metres freestyle event, with Suriyo Mondal finishing second in Men's 100 metres Butterfly stroke. Earlier in the day, India had won 2 Gold and 2 Silver medals in Cycling.

Bidyaluxmi Tourangbam bagged the top honours in the Women's 30 km Time Trail event, with the Silver medal also going to India through Chaoba Devi Elangbam. In the Men's 40 km Time Trail event, the Gold was won by Arvind Panwar. Manjeet Singh took the Silver. In other events, Indian Men's team defeated Nepal in Kho-Kho in a round-robin match, while the Men's Badminton team beat Maldives, 3-0 in their group opener.
