Madrid Masters: Novak Djokovic, Rafael Nadal, Andy Murray cruise into quarter-finals

Madrid, May 6
World number one Novak Djokovic racked up his 30th win of a dominant season with a 6-2 6-1 destruction of Spain's Roberto Bautista Agut to reach the Madrid Masters quarter-finals on Thursday. The resurgent Rafael Nadal and defending champion Andy Murray also remained on course for a semi-final clash as they eased past Sam Querrey and Gilles Simon respectively in straight sets. Djokovic is playing in Madrid for the first time in three years, but hasn't taken long to adjust to the different conditions in the altitude of the Spanish capital as he has reached the quarters for the loss of just nine games. "After a long game at 2-2 in the first set, I managed to break his



serve. It was a flawless performance after that, everything worked very well," said Djokovic. "Today the way I played gives me a lot of satisfaction. I'm just hoping I can continue playing this well tomorrow." The Serb will continue his quest for a fifth title of the season against Milos Raonic as the big serving Canadian dumped out seventh seed Jo-Wilfried Tsonga 6-4, 6-

4. Nadal stretched his perfect start to the European clay-court season to 12 matches as he fought back from going down an early break to beat Querrey 6-4, 6-2. The 14-time Grand Slam champion is in fine form after victories in Monte Carlo and Barcelona and is seeking to break Guillermo Vilas' record with a 50th clay-court title in Sunday's final.

India-Japan to promote football b4 U-17 FIFA WC

New Delhi, May 6
With the U-17 FIFA World Cup set to be held in the country next year, India and Japan have decided to exchange players, coaches and sports experts to improve the standard of the game in both the nations in the run up to the tournament. It is also agreed that the two countries will play some friendly matches ahead of the tournament. The decisions were taken during a meeting between Sports Minister Sarbananda Sonowal and a 12-member delegation from Japan led by Hase Hiroshi, Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology, Government of Japan. Both the sides also agreed for exchange of sportspersons, coaches, sports experts, sports administrators, etc., and decided that they will sign a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) on

cooperation in the field of sports, a statement from the Sports Ministry said. The Japanese minister informed that the government of Japan has launched a programme named, 'Sport For Tomorrow' to promote sports among more than 10 million people in 100 nations between 2014 and 2020. In 2020, Tokyo will be hosting the Summer Olympics and Paralympic Games. The goal is to spread values learned through sports and increase awareness of the Olympic and Paralympic movement. Sonowal welcomed Japan's initiative and stated that India will certainly like to avail coaches and instructors in those sports disciplines, where Japan is strong. Sonowal also accepted the Japanese minister's invitation to attend 'World Forum on Sport and Culture' to be held in October 2016 in Tokyo.

Do's and Dont's

DO's

- Listen to Radio, watch TV, read Newspaper for local weather forecast to know if a heat wave is on the way
- Drink sufficient water and as often as possible, even if not thirsty
- Wear lightweight, light-coloured, loose, and porous cotton clothes. Use protective goggles, umbrella/hat, shoes or chappals while going out in sun.
- While travelling, carry water with you.
- If you work outside, use a hat or an umbrella and also use a damp cloth on your head, neck, face and limbs.
- Use ORS, homemade drinks like lassi, torani (rice water), lemon water, buttermilk, etc. which help to re-hydrate the body.
- Recognize the signs of heat stroke, heat rash or heat cramps such as weakness, dizziness, headache, nausea, sweating and seizures. If you feel faint or ill, see a doctor immediately.
- Keep animals in shade and give them plenty of water to drink.
- Keep your home cool, use curtains, shutters or sunshade and open windows at night.
- Use fans, damp clothing and take bath in cold water frequently.
- Provide cool drinking water near work place.
- Caution workers to avoid direct sunlight.
- Schedule strenuous jobs to cooler times of the day.
- Increasing the frequency and length of rest breaks for outdoor activities.
- Pregnant workers and workers with a medical condition should be given additional Attention.

DONT's

- Do not leave children or pets in parked vehicles.
- Avoid going out in the sun, especially between 12.00 noon and 3.00 p.m.
- Avoid wearing dark, heavy or tight clothing.
- Avoid strenuous activities when the outside temperature is high. Avoid working outside between 12 noon and 3 p.m.
- Avoid cooking during peak hours. Open doors and windows to ventilate cooking area adequately.
- Avoid alcohol, tea, coffee and carbonated soft drinks, which dehydrates the body.
- Avoid high-protein food and do not eat stale food.

Safety Tips:

- Install temporary window reflectors such as Aluminium Foil Covered Cardboard to reflect back outside.
- Cover window that receive morning and afternoon sun with drapes shades.
- Listen to local weather forecast and make your selves aware of upcoming temperature changes.
- Know those in your neighbourhood who are elderly, young, sick or overweight. They are more likely to become victims of excessive heat and may need help.
- Get trained in first aid to learn how to treat heat related emergencies.
- Never leave children or pets alone in closed vehicles. Stay indoors as much as possible and limit exposure to the sun.
- Stay on the lowest floor out of the sunshine.
- Eat well balanced diet and regular meals.
- Drink plenty of water even if you do not feel thirsty.
- Persons with epilepsy of heart, kidney or liver disease are on fluids restricted diets or have problem with fluid retention should consult a doctor before increasing liquid intake.
- Protect face and head by wearing a hat or cloth.
