New Delhi, Jun 06 Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi concluded his successful visit to Switzerland while it extended support for India's NSG membership. On black money issue, Switzerland announced that there is some progress made on India's concerns over the issue and a swiss delegation will visit India soon to further the progress made so far on the issue.

Police Fire Services prompt action saves life of 22 year old girl

Port Blair, June 06 On 6/6/2016 at about 0634 hrs, a Special Service Call was received from Police Control Room that a house had collapsed at Haddo village, Port Blair. In response, Fire Station Chatham's staff, along with Water Tender AN 01 C 0127 were rushed to the scene of occurrence.



On reaching, it was noticed that a latrine (Toilet) block made of RCC had deracinated from the land due to heavy rain and found derailed towards steep slope and in which a girl child was trapped in the collapsed Toilet block. Thus, there was no scope for the girl to get off from the toilet block as the situation was so dangerous as it was entangling towards the deep slope where a number of residential houses are located.

Immediately, rescue operation was started by using cutting and lifting tools. Keeping in view of rains and delicate situation, assistance of Rescue Tender and staff from Fire Station Aberdeen were also requisitioned and the rescue operation was carried out by the officers and staff of Fire Station Aberdeen and

Addressing media in New Delhi after chairing a quarterly performance review meeting with the chief executive officers of Public Sector Banks and Financial Institutions, Finance Minister Shri Arun Jaitley today said that bank have not only achieved previous year's target, but also distributed more than Rs 12,000 crore. After exiting the French Open at quarterfinal stage, Bopanna needed Marcelo Melo and Ivan Dodig to lose in the semi-finals to return to top-10. And they lost. Veteran Leander Paes, who also made the quarterfinals, gained five places to be placed at 46. Bopanna, being a top-10 player, not only gets a direct entry but also has the choice to pick his partner for the men's doubles event irrespective of his ranking. The next best players in the doubles for India are Purav Raja (103) Divij Sharan (114), Saketh Myneni (125), Jeevan Nedunchezhiyan (134) and Mahesh Bhupathi (164).

In the singles, out-of-action Yuki Bhambri has slipped six more places to 147 and is followed by Saketh (150) and Ramkumar Ramanathan (224). In the women's doubles chart, Sania Mirza

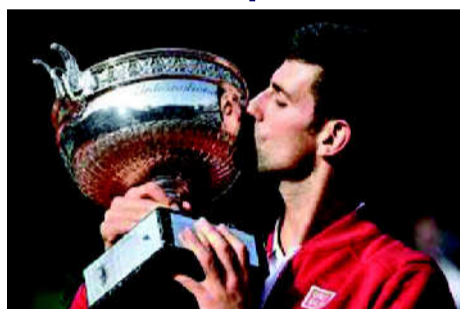
Birmingham to host World championship

Novak Djokovic beats Andy Murray to claim 1st French Open title

World number one Novak Djokovic beat Britain's Andy Murray 3-6, 6-1, 6-2, 6-4 to win his first French Open title and complete the career Grand Slam. Djokovic won his 12th major title and became the first man since Rod Laver in 1969 to hold all four Grand Slams at once. Second seed Murray played superbly to win the first set but could not convert a break point early in the second, and Djokovic took control to win in three hours. He becomes only the eighth man in history to have won all four of the sport's major singles



prizes - and could yet match Laver's achievement of winning all four in a calendar year.

India ranked 2nd on GRD index on ease of doing business: Study

New Delhi Jun 6,
India has jumped 13 positions from last year to rank second among 30 developing countries this year on ease of doing business. According to 2016 Global Retail Development Index (GRDI), which ranks top 30 developing countries for retail investment worldwide, a pick up in GDP growth and better clarity regarding FDI regulations have helped India achieve a second ranking.



India's retail sector has expanded at a compound annual growth rate of 8.8 per cent between 2013 and 2015, with annual sales crossing the USD 1 trillion mark, according to A T Kearney, a London-based business consultancy which brings out the GRD Index annually. The GRDI analyses 25 macroeconomic and retail-specific variables to help retailers devise successful global strategies to identify emerging market investment opportunities.
