## CDC holders call off strike

### Express satisfaction with solutions provided by the Administration for their demands

Port Blair, July 6  
 Representatives of CDC holders and Sailors Union of India (SUI), today called on the Lt Governor, Lt Gen A K Singh (Retd.), at Raj Niwas and informed that they have called off their strike. They have also expressed their gratitude to the Lt Governor for his concern for the sea farers and his initiatives towards resolving their issues. On 5th July, the representatives of CDC holders alongwith Mr RP Veetil and Chairperson, PBMC had met the Lt Governor, who had asked the DSS to arrive at a mutually acceptable solution keeping in view interests of all stake holders. The CDC holders serving on regular contract basis with the Department of Shipping Services had communicated their demands to the Department of Shipping including permanent enrolment in the



departmental rosters on the basis of seniority and employment onboard mainland ships presently under SCI manning. These issues have been taken up by the Department of Shipping for suitable redressals and solutions. However as these are complicated issues and would require consensus building between all stake holders including all the sea farers, the SCI and the A&N Administration, would take some time to resolve. Whilst the Department of Shipping would continue its endeavours to engage the SCI for enrolment of local CDC holders in the SCI rosters and for their employment onboard mainland ships presently under SCI manning, to provide immediate relief to the CDC holders, their demand for contract engagement periods to be increased from present three months to six months has been agreed to prima facie by the Directorate of Shipping Services. This would soon be implemented after formal approval of A&N Administration. Further this will not affect the article periods of the already rostered crew who would continue to be employed on articles of nine months as hitherto. The A&N Administration is also working on revising the existing criteria for selection of candidates to be enrolled in the A&N Administration. A committee under the Secretary Shipping is

looking at all issues in this regard. After the draft is ready in this respect, it will be circulated to all stake holders for their comments and suggestions before formal approval. The above suggestions have emerged after detailed discussions between the Directorate of Shipping Services and representatives from the CDC holders. Mr. RP Veetil from Sailors Union of India (SUI) was also present.

"As we celebrate this day which marks the end of the holy month of Ramzan, we hope that the festival with its tradition of giving and sharing, enriches our lives with a spirit of brotherhood and empathy for the deprived", said the MP in a message received here today.

#### APPEAL

It is really a matter of serious concern that India accounts for the highest number of road accident fatalities i.e. about one and half lakh persons loose their precious lives in road accidents every year. Atleast 50% fatalities can be prevented if road accident victims receive medical attention within the first critical hour after the accident. Such fatalities can be prevented if bystanders lent a helping hand. But, the fear of getting embroiled in a police investigation and being subjected to the rigours of legal procedure often deters bystanders from getting involved in the rescue of accident victims.

Hon'ble Supreme Court has also taken serious note of it and pronounced a judgment vide Order dated 30-03-2016, providing comprehensive protection to Good Samaritans who assist road accident victims, from ensuring legal and procedural hassles.

As part of an effort to encourage people to offer assistance without the fear of any criminal or civil liability, the Govt. of India issued Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) vide Notification No. 25035/101/2014-RS dated 21st Jan., 2016 after publishing the guidelines vide Notification No. 25035/101/2014-RS dated 12-05-2015.

The main intent of the said guidelines is to ensure that no bystander rushing to the rescue of an accident victim should be subject to civil or criminal liability and/or be forced to be a witness. Any disclosure of personal information or offer to be a witness, in the event of the Good Samaritan also being an eyewitness to an accident, ought to be voluntary. Further, the examination of such a volunteer as a witness shall be done only on a single occasion and without harassment or intimidation. The State Governments also have been advised to institute a system of reward and compensation to encourage more bystanders to be Good Samaritans.

It is my appeal to all the citizens of the Islands, to come forward and assist and rescue the victims of road accident especially during the 'first critical hour' that can make the difference between life and death without the fear of getting into legal tangles.

Team India leave for West Indies



New Delhi, July 6

The 16-member Indian squad led by Virat Kohli left Mumbai for the West Indies to engage the hosts in a four-Test rubber later this month and in August. The team was accompanied by its newly appointed head coach Anil Kumble and other support staff. The squad will open the tour with a two-day game against the West Indies Cricket Board President's XI at Warner Park in Basseterre, St Kitts on 9th. and 10th. of this month followed by a three-day warm-up fixture at the same venue from July 14 to 16. The opening Test is scheduled at the Vivian Richards Cricket Ground in Antigua from July 21 to 25. The other three Test matches are scheduled to be held at Sabina Park in Kingston, Jamaica (Jul

30-Aug 3), Darren Sammy National Cricket Stadium in Gros Islet, St Lucia (Aug 9-13) and Queen's Park Oval, Port of Spain, Trinidad (Aug 18-22). India last toured the

Barcelona footballer Lionel Messi sentenced to 21 months for tax fraud

Barcelona, July 6 Spanish media say, Argentina and Barcelona footballer Lionel Messi has been sentenced to 21 months in prison for tax fraud. His father, Jorge Messi, was also given a jail term for defrauding Spain between 2007 and 2009.

The footballer and his father also face millions of euros in fines for using tax havens in Belize and Uruguay used to conceal earnings from image rights. They were found guilty of three

World Cup ticket prices have broken the \$1,000 barrier for the first time

Moscow, July 6

FIFA said Tuesday the top price for the 2018 final in Moscow will be \$1,100, up from \$990 for the 2014 final in Rio de Janeiro. Other tickets for the final will cost \$710 and \$455, with additional category 4 tickets which are sold exclusively to Russian residents costing 7,040 rubles (currently \$110). For international fans, tickets for first-round games range from \$105-210, except for the

opener, which costs from \$220-\$550. The first-round range for the 2014 tournament was \$90-\$175, meaning the cost of the least expensive seat has risen 16 percent. Prices are \$115-\$245 for the round of 16, \$175-\$365 for the quarterfinals and the third-place match and \$285-\$750 for the semifinals. Russian residents get sharply discounted rates, with their cheapest first-round tickets selling for 1,280 rubles (\$20),

an increase on equivalent prices for 2014 but roughly in line with prices for South African fans in 2010. FIFA secretary general Fatma Samoura says in a statement that "we wanted to make sure that we priced tickets fairly to make the events accessible to as many people as possible." World Cup ticket sales won't start until after the Confederations Cup in Russia next summer.

Sajan and Shivani to represent India at Rio Olympics in Swimming

Bengaluru, July 6

Sajan Prakash and Shivani Katariya will represent India in the swimming events at the 2016 Olympic Games, the Swimming Federation of India announced here on Tuesday. Kerala-born Sajan, 22, will swim in the men's 200m butterfly while 18-year-old Shivani will compete in the women's 200m freestyle.

Following the absence of a swimmer with an OQT (A time), India was awarded Universality places (one man and one woman) by FINA, after the qualification window shut on July 3. The SFI selection committee

chose Sajan ahead of Sandeep Sejwal, Viradhawal Khade, Aaron D'Souza and Saurabh Sangvekar, all of whom had participated in the 2015 World Championships in Kazan — a prerequisite for a swimmer taking a Universality place. Sajan's case was helped by his impressive performance at the Age Group Long Course swimming meet — Division 1 (Part 3) in Hong Kong on July 2, when he clocked 1:59.69 in the 200m butterfly, becoming the first Indian ever to dip under the two-minute mark.

Haryana's Shivani, meanwhile, was the only

Indian woman to compete at the Worlds and thus was the only one eligible. The two will be accompanied by National coach Pradeep Kumar. "Sajan has been a consistent performer this season. That's why he was selected when Pradeep, Wilson Cherian, the president (Digambar Kamat) and I met this morning. "Sandeep's performance in Hong Kong was not up to the mark while Viradhawal has not been able to fully devote himself to training owing to his job," said SFI secretary Kamlesh Nanavati, on the sidelines of the junior National meet here.
