## Dialogue is only way to overcome prejudices, divisions & conflicts: PM

New Delhi, Aug 6  
Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi has said dialogue is the only way to cut through deep rooted religious stereotypes and prejudices that divide communities across the world and sow seeds of conflict between nations and societies.

In a video message during the 2nd edition of Samvad-Global Initiative on Conflict Avoidance and Environment Consciousness yesterday, Shri Modi said the world are facing several questions like how to avoid conflict and ways to address a global challenge



like climate change and how to live in peace and harmony.

The two day conference took place in Yangon, in Myanmar. He said that it is

only natural that the search for answers should be led by the humanity's longest traditions of thought, rooted in various religions, civilizations, and multiple

streams of spirituality.

The Prime Minister said, he is a product of the ancient Indian tradition that firmly believes in dialogue on difficult issues. He said, the ancient Indian concept of 'Tarka Shastra' is founded on dialogue and debate as the model for exchange of views and avoidance of conflict.

## GST Council gives in-principle approval to E-Way bill rules

New Delhi, Aug 6

The Goods and Services Tax (GST) Council has given its in principle approval to E Waybill rules in a meeting this evening in New Delhi.

Briefing media after the meeting, Finance Minister Shri Arun Jaitley said, pre-registration requirement under GST e-way bill is not mandatory for exempted goods and E-way Bills will be required for packages worth over 50 thousand rupees. He said there will be no check posts and the

process will be technology driven. He said said E way bill will be implemented across the country. Shri Jaitley also said that GST Council has cut tax on textile work to 5 percent from 18 percent. The GST rate on few tractor components have been reduced to 18 percent from 28 per cent. The Minister said work contracts under GST will be taxed at 12 percent with input tax credit.

## No need for govt employees to visit bank to start pension: Centre

New Delhi, Aug 6

There is no need for central government employees to visit banks to activate the first payment of pension. The Personnel Ministry in a recent order issued to all central government departments has said, the copy of the Pension Payment Order, PPO, will be handed over to the government employees at the time of their retirement. The rules also provide for an undertaking to be submitted by the retiring government servants or pensioners to the disbursing banks before the commencement of their pensions.

The order said, after ascertaining that the bank's copy of PPO has been dispatched by the Central Pension Accounting Office, the pensioner's copy is to be handed over to him at the time of retirement along with other retirement dues. It said, an employee posted at a location away from the head of office, or who for any other reasons feels that it would be more convenient to him to obtain his copy of the PPO from the bank, may inform the head of office of his option in writing while submitting his pension papers. The pension gets delayed either due to the delay in receipt of intimation by the pensioner that relevant papers have reached the bank or because of delay on the part of the pensioner in approaching the bank for submission of undertaking. There are about 48 lakh central government employees and about 53 lakh pensioners.

business, informed its President, Shri Tanveer Singh in a press conference held at the Megapode Resort here yesterday.

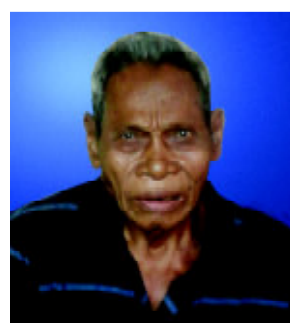

# Team India win by an innings and 53 runs, take unassailable 2-0 lead

Colombo, Aug 6  
India buried Sri Lanka under a mountain of runs as they centered to a comprehensive innings and 53-run victory in the second Test, taking an unassailable 2-0 lead in the three-match series here today. The hosts, who put up their best batting show in the series so far were all-out for 386 in the second innings despite twin centuries from opener Dimuth Karunaratne (141) and No 3 Kusal Mendis (110). Ravindra Jadeja (5/152 in 39 overs), after an indifferent final two sessions on the third day, found his rhythm and more importantly length back to inflict the maximum damage. Once Karunaratne and former skipper Angelo Mathews (36) were dismissed by Jadeja within a space of five runs from each other, it was only a matter of time before India clinched the series. The quality, or the lack of it, of the Sri Lankan team will give Virat Kohli and his boys a chance to complete a clean sweep in Pallekele (Kandy), where the third Test starts on August 12. Save Bangladesh and



Zimbabwe, India have not had a chance to register an all-win record in an away series in any country. In the post-lunch session, it was Jadeja who hit the right areas, extracting sharp turn and bounce off the pitch. Karunaratne, after his 307-ball vigil, got a wicked delivery that jumped off his gloves with Ajinkya Rahane running behind the wicketkeeper to take the catch. Mathews then got one that had both turn and bounce with Wriddhiman Saha giving a superb exhibition of glovework. Dilruwan Perera (17) was then stumped as he tried to give Jadeja the charge.

The ninth five-wicket haul for Jadeja came when Dhananjaya De Silva edged one to Rahane at first-slip. Nirosan Dickwella (31) threw his bat around before Hardik Pandya (2/31 in 15 overs) accounted for his wicket. At the start, Karunaratne added 40 runs with nightwatchman Malinda Pushpakumara (16) for the third wicket. India were then given a lucky break as Pushpakumara played a horrific reverse sweep off Ashwin in the 73rd over and was bowled, gifting his wicket after doing all the hard work. It became a double blow as Jadeja had Dinesh Chandimal

(2) caught at slip in the next over, with Rahane holding on to a sharp catch diving to his right. The visitors took the second new ball as soon as it became available, but Karunaratne and Mathews played watchful cricket given the vitality of this passage of play. India did bring on its pacers, Mohammed Shami (0-27) and Umesh Yadav (1-39), for short spells with the new ball, but they were unable to provide breakthroughs. Sri Lanka crossed the 300-mark in the 90th over, with Karunaratne and Mathews bringing up their 50-partnership off 71 balls.

## Vijender beats Zulpikar to win WBO Oriental Super Middleweight title



Mumbai, Aug 6  
Indian professional boxer Vijender Singh outslugged his Chinese opponent Zulpikar Maimaitiali to retain the WBO Asia Pacific Super Middleweight title and win the WBO Oriental Super Middleweight title. In the pro boxing bout, termed as 'Battleground Asia', at Mumbai last night, Vijender

recorded a unanimous decision win over his Chinese opponent and continued his undefeated streak. It was Beijing Olympic bronze medalist's ninth successive win in his professional career. Vijender gave an exhibition of his class during the slugfest and his experience came in handy during 10 intense rounds.

## Olympic champion Almaz Ayana destroys field to win 10,000m at Worlds

London, Aug 6  
Ethiopian Almaz Ayana destroyed the field to win the 10,000 metres at the World Championships, finishing around 300 metres clear of her rivals in her first race of an injury-plagued season. The Olympic champion began pulling away from the field after

10 laps, sweeping past back markers who were made to look sluggish in comparison. She finished in 30:16.32 seconds, well outside the world record she set when she won in Rio last year but still enough to win by an astonishing 46.37 seconds, by far the biggest margin in championship history.

## Usain Bolt finishes 3rd in 100 meters Final at World Athletics C'ship

London, Aug 6  
Fastest man on earth, Usain Bolt has been stunned as he finished third in the 100 meters Final of World Athletics Championship at London, last night. In his farewell 100 meters, Bolt clocked a time of 9.95 seconds but was left behind by veteran American sprinter Justin Gatlin who clocked 9.92 seconds to claim Gold, his compatriot Christian Coleman came second with 9.94 seconds. World record holder Bolt had a dreadful start from the blocks but he stretched in the 70 meters, like he always does, however, this time it was not enough to win it. It is an amazing turnaround for



Gatlin, who was the Olympic champion in 2004 and world champion in 2005, to win it after 13 years. Despite being the Champion, Gatlin received a rough reception from the crowd. Since 2008, when Bolt set his first world record, he had not lost a championship race, and collected 19 gold medals in 100,

200 and 4x100 meters. The only time, he did not win the gold was in 100 meters at the 2011 world championships, when he was disqualified for a false start and the 2008 Olympic 4x100, a gold won by Jamaica that was subsequently stripped because a teammate tested positive for banned substances.

## Akhil Kumar, Neeraj Goyat win in style as Indians dominate undercard bouts

Mumbai, Aug 6  
Olympians Jitender Kumar and Akhil Kumar got to a flying start in their professional boxing career on Saturday, defeating their opponents in just two rounds via technical knockouts at the National Sports Club of India here on Saturday. Although the crowd at the NSCI dome were waiting for the big fight between Vijender Singh and China's Zulpikar Maimaitiali, there was considerable interest among fans for these two under card

bouts. Jitender was the first to enter the ring and the crowd, gradually growing in number, sprang to its feet. From Jo bole so nihal to Bharat Mata ki Jai, the audience ensured the 29-year-old was assured of a grand welcome. However, he could have perhaps done without it as well. The lightweight (61.2kg) bout lasted all but two rounds before the referee adjudged that Thanet Likhitkamporn, his opponent, wasn't in a condition to carry

on. It was the same story for Arjuna award winner Akhil Kumar whose opponent Ty Gilchrist pointed to his abdomen before retiring. Akhil started the junior welterweight (63.5kg) clash on a defensive note, not rushing in, and contrary to his style, keeping his guard up. However, old habits die hard and before long Akhil had switched to his open stance, waiting for Gilchrist to have a go at him. He landed quite a few quick punches.

## Ramakrishnan Gandhi, Satyanarayana nominated for Dronacharya Award

New Delhi, Aug 6  
Former national athletics coach Ramakrishnan Gandhi, who died last year, was among three coaches recommended for Dronacharya Award by the panel headed by chief national badminton coach, Pullela Gopichand. Heeranand Kataria (kabaddi) and Satyanarayana (Paralympics) were the other two coaches recommended for the prestigious award. Gandhi, a Sports Authority of India (SAI) coach, was associated with the race walk event. He was based in Bangalore and among those

trained were international race walker Gurmeet Singh, Bajinder Singh and Deepmala Devi. The Bangalore-based Satyanarayana, a former national-level middle-distance runner, was also rewarded for guiding para-athlete Mariyappan Thangavelu, who claimed high jump gold at the 2016 Paralympics. Women's chief national wrestling coach Kuldeep Malik's name was debated but didn't find favour in the panel. Malik had claimed he was the coach of Rio bronze medalist Sakshi Malik. Since another coach Mandip

Singh from Haryana also claimed he should be considered for the award, the panel dropped both as a consensus couldn't be reached.

## Partial lunar eclipse on Aug 7 night, to be visible from India

New Delhi, Aug 6  
A partial lunar eclipse will take place on Monday night and will be visible from across the country. The eclipse will start at around 10.52 p m and will continue till 00.48 am Indian Time. Director Research and Academic, M P Birla Planetarium, Kolkata Debiprosad Duari said the full moon will enter the Earth's shadow in space and create a spectacular celestial phenomenon, which is commonly known as partial lunar eclipse. This will be the first properly visible lunar eclipse this

year. The partial lunar eclipse this time would be visible from the whole of Asia and Australia and most parts of Europe and Africa.

The next lunar eclipse will be on January 31, 2018 and it will be total. It will also be visible from all parts of the Indian sub-continent Mr. Duari said.
