Union Home Minister & Union Minister for Road Transport & Highways lay foundation stone for construction of bridges over Humphrey Strait & Middle Strait creeks at Baratang

Baratang, Oct 6
The Union Home Minister, Shri Rajnath Singh along with the Union Minister for Road Transport & Highways, Shri Nitin Gadkari, laid the Foundation Stone for the rehabilitation and up gradation of Beodnabad - Ferrargunj Section of NH-4, construction of major bridge over Humphrey Strait creek and Middle Strait creek at Baratang today. The Minister of State for Home, Shri Hansraj Gangaram Ahir, the Lt Governor A&N Islands, Prof Jagdish Mukhi, Member of Parliament, Shri Bishnu Pada Ray, BJP State President, Shri Vishal Jolly and the Chief Secretary, Shri Anindo Majumdar were also present on this occasion. The Ministers unveiled the plaque marking the laying of foundation stone during a function held at Baratang Forest Ground.

Union Home Minister & Union Minister for Road Transport & Highways lay foundation stone for upgradation of NH 4 at Diglipur

India is emerging as a powerful nation in terms of economy and security and is being recognized and respected by other nations of the world, said the Union Home Minister, Shri Rajnath Singh while laying the foundation stone for the 'Rehabilitation and Up-gradation of NH 4 to 2 lane from Austin Creek to Kalara (242 km to 298 km) at Diglipur this morning. Lauding the untiring efforts of our Armed Forces in protecting the borders of the country, the Home Minister said, no nation can destabilize the security of the country as the Government is strengthening the security at all fronts. "We want peace with our neighbours, but if they fail to maintain peace, we will respond suitably", he said.



Stating that the Andaman and Nicobar Islands are the true Mini India, where people of diverse culture and languages of the country live in perfect peace and harmony, the Union Home Minister said that if anyone wants to know about India's unity in diversity, he or she must visit the Islands. These Islands have played significant role in the freedom struggle of the nation, where the brave sons of India, who fought for our freedom, were repatriated and faced intolerable tortures, he said. Referring to the series of developmental activities that are taking place in the Islands, the Home Minister said that the Central Government, under the dynamic leadership of the Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi has taken initiatives for the overall development of these Islands. Many projects are coming up in the Islands, some of which have already started while the foundation stones for some more are being laid and many more will be started soon. The Prime Minister desires that all States and UTs are connected with railways, air, shipping; to streamline and strengthen the process of overall development and make India a developed country, the Home Minister said. These Islands have been selected for various infrastructure developments, of which the development of the declared National Highways is being taken up now, he said. Mumbai, Oct 6
Two-time champions Ghana began their FIFA Under-17 World Cup campaign with a 1-0 victory over Colombia in a Group A match in New Delhi on Friday. In the tournament opener at the Jawaharlal Nehru Stadium, Sadiq Ibrahim scored the all-important goal in the 39th minute. Ghana earned three points from the win. In the opening Group B match at the DY Patil Stadium in Navi



Mumbai, New Zealand came from a goal down to draw 1-1 against Turkey. Striker Ahmed Kutucu gave the lead for Turkey in the 18th minute,

which was neutralised by Kiwi captain Max Mata in the 58th minute. The Group A match between United States defeated India by 3-0.

Men In Blue aim to extend domination in shortest format

Ranchi, Oct 6
A confident India will look to extend their domination, while a hapless Australia would aim for a change of fortunes in the three-match T20 series beginning here tomorrow. India dominated the limited over series against Australia with a 4-1 win to reclaim the number one ODI rankings and the hosts would be keen for a perfect finish to the T20I series. A reliable pool of bowlers in both pace and spin department to complement their traditional batting might is what makes Virat Kohli's side look so formidable. They have looked flawless, be it against reigning



world champions Australia or a new-look Sri Lanka. The rise of Hardik Pandya, the guile of the two wrist spin duo of Kuldeep Yadav and Yuzvendra Chahal have made life difficult for Australia in the one-day series. But come T20Is, it could be

worse for Australia as India boast of a 9-3 head-to-head record. In the last T20I bilateral series, India made a 3-0 clean sweep in Australia in January last year while they have lost only once out of the five series played between the two nations.

N Islands, of which projects for Rs. 10,000 crore have already commenced. This stretch of ATR, from Kalara to Austin creek, is estimated to cost about Rs. 4 crore while many other projects have already been sanctioned and started, he said referring to the two bridges over the ATR. Four shipping projects have also been started; the foundation stone for which were laid by the Union Home Minister yesterday, he said. There is also a proposal to establish ship repairing and ship building dockyard and with this, the ships plying in the Islands will get repaired in the Islands itself, he said. He also announced a series of projects that will be started in the Islands soon.



In his address on the occasion, the Minister of State for Home, Shri Hansraj Gangaram Ahir said that these beautiful Islands are poised to become the most sought after tourist destination and need to be further developed. Air and sea connectivity need to be improved so that more and more tourists can come and Islands' economy can be boosted, he added.

The Lt. Governor, Prof. Jagdish Mukhi in his address said that the development of NH 4 will boost tourism activities, besides the economic activities of the people of North & Middle Andaman. More roads of the Islands will be given National Highway status and many tourist spots will be developed once the transport sector is improved in the Islands, he added.

The Member of Parliament, Shri Bishnu Pada Ray, while speaking on the occasion made two demands before the Home Minister. These included the extension of Shibpur Runway and the extension of Aerial Bay Jetty so that mainland bound ships can touch Diglipur to and from mainland.

The function was attended among others, by the Chief Secretary, Shri Anindo Majumdar, DGP, Smt. Nuzhat Hassan, State BJP President, Shri Vishal Jolly, Adhyaksh Zilla Parishad N & M Andaman, Shri Saw Tathu, senior Officers of the Administration, public representatives of Diglipur and Rangat areas besides a large gathering of local people.

Earlier, Shri N M Sinha, Managing Director NHIDCL welcomed the gathering and the function concluded with the vote of thanks, proposed the Deputy Commissioner, N & M Andaman, Shri Arava Gopi Krishna.

India stands tall and strong before the world, and India is a strong nation today", he said.

The Home Minister said that the Indian Armed Forces are giving befitting reply to the terrorist activities sponsored by Pakistan against India. Acknowledging that many people living in Baratang hail from Jharkhand, the Union Home Minister stated that naxal activities have come down considerably in Jharkhand as people have started realizing that this government is working for the upliftment of poor and marginalized people.

Speaking on the occasion, the Union Minister for Road Transport & Highways, Shri Nitin Gadkari informed the gathering that for the first time in the history of these Islands, foundation has been laid for so many projects. He thanked the Union Home Minister for laying the foundation stones. For creating basic infrastructure in remote and backward places, NHIDCL has been constituted which will develop better infrastructure facilities, he said, naming few state of the art infrastructures like tunnel & bridges being constructed in different states. He said that 12 Express Ways are under construction in the country and the road construction work has increased from 2KM to 28KM per day during the last three years. Referring to the Tourism sector, the Minister said, tourism has good prospects in these Islands and can provide employment to the youth. However, to improve tourism, good road, round the clock power supply and good hotels and resorts are needed, he said.

The Minister also informed that the issue of I V limit has been solved. On the demand of the Member of Parliament, Shri Bishnu Paday Ray, Shri Gadkari has asked the Administration to send a proposal for construction of road from Police Station Baratang to Jarawa Creeks, for approval.

In his speech, the Lt. Governor expressed happiness that foundation stone for all the three projects have been laid. He said 370 km NH-4 starting from Port Blair to Diglipur will be constructed afresh. Referring to the foundation stone laying for two bridges, one each at Humphrey Strait and Middle Strait, the Lt. Governor said, it will reduce time and do away with the dependency on the vehicle ferries to cross the strait.

The Lt. Governor also praised the effort of the Member of Parliament, in pursuing the matter for declaring State Highways of these Islands into National Highways. The Lt. Governor also informed about the construction of 50 Km Marine Drive at a cost of Rs 370 crore under National Highways. Within 5 years' time, Rs 10,000 crore will be invested for taking up infrastructural projects in the Isles, the Lt. Governor said.

In his address, the Member of Parliament, Shri Bishnu Pada Ray acknowledged the contribution of people of Baratang towards the development of the Baratang Islands so far. He also urged Shri Nitin Gadkari to sanction 7 km road starting from Baratang Police Station to Jarawa creek under Central Road Fund. He also informed the gathering about the visit of Shri Vivek Rae Committee for a solution of land dispute and land related matters. There is no doubt that in the coming years, our Isles will emerge as new Andaman with plethora of central govt. schemes being implemented in these islands, he said. In his welcome address, the MD NHIDCL, Shri N.N. Sinha informed that the works for all the 3 projects for which foundations were laid today, will start immediately. The Secretary Shipping, Shri Sanjeev Khirwar proposed the vote of thanks.

properly. DWWA runs segregated waste collection centre at different locations in Haddo, Junglighat, Minnie Bay and Brichgunj. They collect segregated waste from more than 10000 residents and recycle it. More than 3 ton of compost is produced every month, and around 3 ton of empty tetrapack has been sent to mainland for recycling, to be converted into corrugated sheets and furniture.

The waste being given to PBMC has come down to less than one truck per day from around 12 trucks earlier. DWWA intends to conduct waste management workshops for various sections of the society in Port Blair and is ready to offer its facilities and consultancy as part of its social outreach programme, an ANC release said.
