Research in agro-biodiversity is very important to ensure global food, nutrition & environment security: PM



New Delhi, Nov 6
 Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi has said, research in agro-biodiversity is very

important to ensure global food, nutrition and environment security. Inaugurating the 1st International Agro-biodiversity Congress in New Delhi today, Shri Modi said, research needs to be done and best practices need to be noted and curated. He said, natural resources must be given to the future generations intact as it was given to us by our ancestors. The Prime Minister said, due to global warming and pollution, different variety of plants and wild life are facing extinction and the world has to come together to save the species. He said, this is the time people have to change the way of thinking, and to preserve the agro-biodiversity and its

inhabitants. Shri Modi said, every country needs to learn from other countries. He said, nature was entwined with the society and its rituals in India by our ancestors and it kept the nature sustained and survived. Shri Modi said, technology is needed in agriculture for fighting malnutrition and hunger, but it should not be at the cost of sustainability and compromising the biodiversity of the country. He said, the world community needs to develop a system where all rules related to agro-biodiversity is harmonised. Shri Modi also called upon

the scientists and others to expand the ambit of their research so that plant and animal varieties which are helpful to farmers could be publicised. He also gave a call for launching of a comprehensive Blue Revolution the way in which several initiatives and concrete steps were taken to start Green Revolution and White Revolution in the past. Speaking on the occasion, Agriculture Minister Shri Radha Mohan Singh said, Agri Bio Diversity is important for the development of agriculture and it can be utilised to bring out new varieties. He

Speaking at the valedictory function of Chhattisgarh's foundation day celebrations at Naya Raipur yesterday, he said brave will never adopt such tactics as terror has always been the weapon of the weak forces. Union Home Minister said no power in the world would be able to weaken India under the leadership of Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi. Referring to Maoist problem in many states including in Chhattisgarh, the Union Home Minister reiterated his call to

On arrival, the Chief Secretary along with Deputy Commissioner, South Andaman, Shri. Udit Prakash Rai, Pradhan Shri. R.K. Biswas, Zilla Parishad Member, Shri. Dasrath Verma and Panchayat Samiti Member Smti. Chameli Das visited Senior Secondary School, Neil and interacted with the Principal and staff. He directed the Principal to get the old toilet block repaired by APWD at the earliest and also directed the Junior Engineer, APWD to start

the work of 6 classrooms and toilet block, which has already been sanctioned. The Chief Secretary also assured the school authorities of looking in to the demand of Maths teacher/Integrated Lab, Smart Class and a multipurpose hall in the school. The Chief Secretary also inspected the road from Neil Kendra to Sitapur beach and Bharatpur beach which he found were in a very bad condition. This is for the first time that Indian eves won the Asian Champions Trophy competition. Top five women's teams of Asia took part



in this tournament. This was also the qualifying round for the 2017 Asia Cup. It comes as a double delight for Indian hockey, as earlier the men's team had conquered Asian Champions Trophy last week. Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi has congratulated the Indian women's hockey team for winning the Asian Champions Trophy 2016. In a tweet, Shri Modi said, it is a great moment for Indian hockey.

Andy Murray attains world number one ranking in Tennis

London, Nov 6

In Tennis, Briton Andy Murray has attained the world number one ranking for the first time replacing Novak Djokovic. Murray needed to enter the Final of the ongoing Paris Masters to go at the ATP rankings and he did so after Milos Raonic pulled out before their semi-final due to injury. Murray is now the first Briton to hold the top ranking. He is the 26th man to hold the spot since computerised rankings began

Las Vegas, Nov 6

In Boxing, Manny Pacquiao reclaims the World Boxing Organisation (WBO) welterweight title for the third time. The 37-year-old Filipino pugilist, who had announced his retirement seven months ago, was declared the winner with unanimous decision after he defeated American Jessie Vargas in his comeback fight in Las Vegas.

Pacquiao knocked Vargas down in the second round en route to a superb victory. All the three judges gave the bout in Pacquiao's favour - two giving



a score of 118-109 and the third version of the 147-pound title in March after beating fellow American Sadam Ali.

India to push agenda of sustainable lifestyle at global climate meet

New Delhi, Nov 6

India will push the agenda of sustainable lifestyle at the global climate conference beginning in the Moroccan city of Marrakech tomorrow. At the 12-day conference, nations will continue their work on strengthening the global response to the threat of climate change. The focus will be on enhancing ambition, promoting implementation and providing support.

The Environment Ministry said in a statement that the importance of sustainable lifestyle anchored for the first time in the climate change agreement was a big victory for India. It said, India has always followed a path of sustainable lifestyle which is based on the principle of need-based consumption. The Ministry also said, India will focus the issue of

mobilising finances which has been the overriding concern to tackle climate change. India will also push for operationalisation and meaningful outcomes from the new bodies set up under the Paris agreement which includes technology framework and Paris committee on capacity building. The Paris agreement came into force on Friday.

The price hike announced by Indian Oil Corporation is excluding local sales tax and have become effective since last night. additional doctor and one allopathic pharmacist shall be looked into. He further directed the Deputy Commissioner, South Andaman to demarcate the land of the hospital and any encroachment in the hospital premises be removed immediately.

The Chief Secretary also conducted a meeting of PRIs in the Hawa Bill Guest House.
