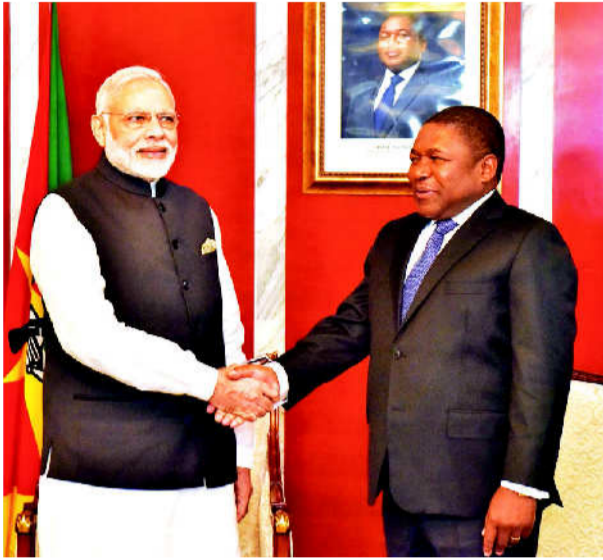

PM Modi meets Mozambique President

Maputo, Jul 7
Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi has reached in Mozambique capital Maputo in the first leg of his 5-day visit of four African nations. He was accorded a ceremonial welcome at the forecourt of the presidential palace in Maputo.
Prime Minister Shri Modi held one on one meeting with President Filipe Nyusi and is also leading the Indian side in the delegation level meeting between both the countries. Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi & President of Mozambique Mr. Filipe Nyusi witnessed the signing of agreements too.
India signed a government to government agreement for the export of pulses from Mozambique to India under a special arrangement. Under this system, India will provide input support to farmers in Mozambique for cultivation of pulses of the variety consumed in India.



The agreement for the cultivation of pulses and its export to India covers a time frame of 5 to 10 years. Agreements in the field of Civil Aviation, Sports and prevention of trafficking of narcotics were also signed.

Defence offset policy to generate worth \$15 billion business in next 10 years: Minister

Bengaluru, Jul 7
Defence Minister Shri Manohar Parrikar has said that the Defence offset policy will generate business to the tune of 15 billion US dollars in the next ten years.
Speaking at the inauguration of the 7th Strategic Electronic Summit of ELCINA in Bengaluru today, he



informed that various defence procurements will be finalized this year. This

will encourage outsourcing to enhance productivity in the small and medium scale industries that has the potential to generate more jobs.

This sector supplied defence related equipments to the tune of 52,000 crore rupees last year as compared to 42,000 crore rupees in 2014.

Income Declaration Scheme by Income Tax Deptt.

Port Blair, July 7
The Deputy Commissioner of Income Tax, Port Blair, Smt. Aashwita Lal, has informed the general public that a new scheme has been introduced by the Income Tax Department.

The Income Declaration Scheme (IDS), 2016, allows income tax assessee to declare any undisclosed income/assets pertaining

to Financial Year 2015-2016 or earlier. It is open from June 1 to September 30, 2016 and tax on such disclosure can be paid till November 30, 2016.

The scheme gives an opportunity to disclose unaccounted income/assets by paying the applicable tax, cess and penalty totalling to 45% of the undisclosed income.

It is a good opportunity

for those who have knowingly or unknowingly not disclosed or under-disclosed their income. The declaration may be filed online at the department website www.incometaxindia.gov.in or offline with the jurisdiction Principal Commissioner of Income Tax.

Artificial pancreas may be available by 2018: Scientists

London, Jul 7

Artificial pancreas - a device which monitors blood glucose in patients with diabetes and automatically adjusts levels of insulin entering the body - is likely to be available by 2018.

Currently available technology allows insulin pumps to deliver insulin to people with diabetes after taking readings from glucose meters, but these two components are separate. Researchers said it is the joining together of both parts into a 'closed loop' that makes an artificial pancreas.

Eight more fishermen rescued by Coast Guard

Port Blair, July 7

In third rescue operation within a week, Coast Guard saved lives of 08 fishermen near Diglipur today. The Coast Guard Ship Kanaklata Barua which was on area patrol rescued a fishing boat "RSN-3" with 08 crew that was stranded at sea 15 nautical miles north east of Diglipur due to engine failure. The boat had sailed from Port Blair fishing harbour on 03 Jul 16 for fishing, however, due to problem in her engine, the boat got stranded and could not return.

At about 0630 hrs on July 7, ICGS Kanaklata Barua on patrolling received a VHF call from the fishing boat



requesting for assistance. The Coast Guard Ship located the boat at 0715 hrs approximately 15 nautical miles North East of Diglipur. Lahiri aims to shine in blockbuster summer run of major events

Sentosa (Singapore), Jul 7 Indian star golfer Anirban Lahiri will be aiming for a summer to remember as he prepares to tackle three of the biggest tournaments of the season starting with The Open at Royal Troon next week. The reigning Asian Tour number one is keen to hit top form ahead of the year's third Major at the famous Scottish links from July 14 to 17, followed by the PGA Championship in Baltusrol two weeks later and the Olympic Games in Rio de Janeiro in mid-August which concludes a frenetic month of golf. Lahiri, 29, will make his fourth appearance at The Open where he enjoyed a tied 31st outing in his debut in 2012 which included a magical hole-in-one during the third round and equal 30th last year. "The Open is truly a special



tournament," said Lahiri. "I've had a couple of decent outings but feel like I missed out both times on a top-10 finish. Hopefully Troon suits my eye and I can play consistently throughout the week. A top-10 or better would be my goal this year," added the Indian. From the time he holed out his tee shot for the ace in 2012 and celebrated exuberantly with caddie and father who was watching from the galleries, Lahiri has cherished the challenge of links golf, which he hopes will

spark his return to top form. Competing in his rookie season on the PGA Tour in the United States, Lahiri has missed only four cuts from 17 starts, but has only registered one top-10 to his name. Competing on a new golf course every week has been his biggest challenge. "I like playing links courses. You have to be creative and strategically efficient to play well on them. Also I am comfortable fighting down my ball-flight which is a must in windy conditions," said Lahiri.

Food Business Operators asked to submit annual returns

Port Blair, July 7 All Food Business Operators who have obtained License under Food Safety & Standards Act, 2006 in Andaman & Nicobar Islands and who are involved in Manufacture and Sale of Food products like Bakery Establishments, Hotels, Restaurants, Catering/ Midday Meal supplier, Meat & Poultry product Establishments has to submit the Annual Returns in Form D-1 and also those Food Business Operators who are involved in Manufacture & Sale of Milk & Milk products have to submit Half Yearly Returns for Milk & Milk

products for the period ending (a) 1st April to 30th September & (b) 1st Oct to 31st March. It is observed that in spite of repeated instructions from the respective District Food Safety Offices of Andaman & Nicobar Islands, the Food Business Operators are not following the instructions. Non Submission of Returns is violation of 2.1.13 of Chapter-2 of Licensing & Registration of Food Business of Food Safety & Standards Regulations, 2011. Delay in filing return by end of 31st April of each year attracts penalty of Rs 100/- per day. All the Food Business

Operators who have not submitted their return are cautioned to submit their annual return with admissible late fee to the respective District Food Safety Office at the earliest. The Food Safety Officers posted under the District Food Safety Offices of Andaman & Nicobar Islands will be carrying out inspections and Non-Complying Food Business Operators will be booked under relevant sections of Food Safety & Standards Act, 2006 and legal action will be initiated against them, a communication from the Commissioner Food Safety said here.

 Yards at Radha Nagar Village, and other areas, was assessed and PRIs were apprised of the situation, of the various lands and survey numbers allotted to them.

A water source has been identified in Camp Number 6.5, Krishna Nagar, and 4000 sqm of land has been allotted to Panchayat, so that APWD can begin project work of ring well construction, etc. This project has the potential of solving Havelock's water problem, a communication said.

The actual timeline to availability of the artificial pancreas, as with other medical devices, encompasses regulatory approvals of regulatory agencies such as the US Food and Drug Administration (FDA), which is currently reviewing one proposed artificial pancreas with approval possibly as soon as 2017.

Recent review by the UK National Institute of Health Research reported that automated closed-loop systems may be expected to appear in the European market by the end of 2018.

"In trials to date, users have been positive about how use of an artificial pancreas gives them 'time off' or a 'holiday' from their diabetes management, since the system is managing their blood sugar effectively without the need for constant monitoring by the user," said Roman Hovorka and Hood Thabit of the University of Cambridge in the UK. One part of the clinical need for the artificial pancreas is the variability of insulin requirements between and within individuals - on one day a person could use one third of their normal requirements, and on another three times what they normally would.
