handloom sector. He said India is home to several world famous handloom products. Stressing the importance of the India

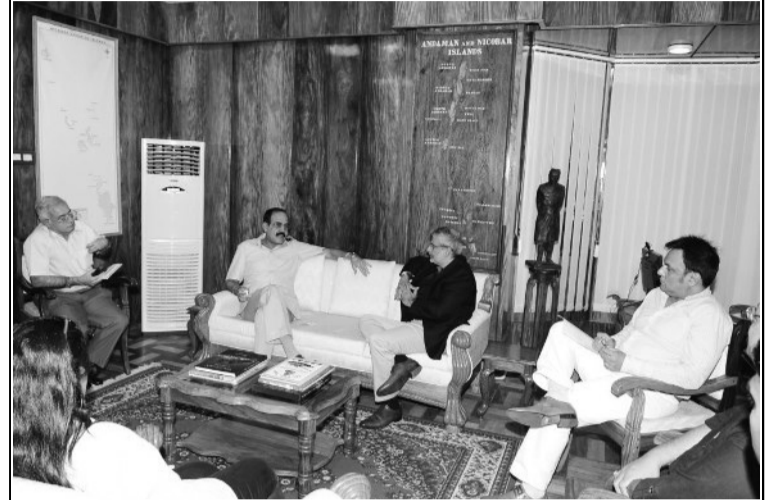

### India gets \$19.78 bn FDI from nations visited by PM

New Delhi, Aug 7  
India received 19.78 billion dollars Foreign Direct Investment (FDI) from 12 countries visited by Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi in financial year 2014-15. During the period, Indian companies invested USD 3.42 billion in these countries which include Bhutan, Brazil, Nepal, Japan, the US, Myanmar, Australia, Fiji, Seychelles, Mauritius, Sri

Lanka and Singapore. The total outflow and inflow of foreign investment in general for 2014-15 fiscal was USD 6.42 billion and USD 75.71 billion, respectively, Commerce and Industry Minister Smti Nirmala Sitharaman said in a written reply to Rajya Sabha. In 2014-15, FDI in India increased by 27 percent to USD 30.93 billion.

### Shopkeepers advised to avoid display of goods on footpaths

Port Blair, Aug 7  
The District Police has advised the shopkeepers not to display their goods on the footpath on Aug 15, 2015. It was observed during the last Independence Day i.e 15th August 2014 that most of the shopkeepers running their shops alongside the road from Clock Tower to Ratnam Market displayed their goods on footpath in front of their shops, due to which a large crowd gathered for shopping, thereby causing obstruction and inconvenience to the free flow of vehicular as well as

pedestrian movements, while the ITF Ground had been made available for the traders to sell their products.

In view of such situation, the shopkeepers of the said area have been asked to keep their products inside their shop instead of displaying the same on the footpath on 15th August, 2015. If anybody is found displaying their goods on the footpath, necessary legal action will be taken against the shopkeepers under Section 34(4) of Police Act, 1861, a communication from the SP, South Andaman District said here today.

### General public advised

Due to heavy rainfall a major landslide occurred in Atlanta Point area yesterday and a retaining wall of a house collapsed causing damages to the nearby households and a girl has reportedly suffered injuries.

Katie Ledecky wins four golds in World Swimming Championship

Kazan, Aug 7  
Katie Ledecky of the United States remains on course to win a fifth gold in Kazan, while a 10-year-old from Bahrain made history on Friday at the world swimming championships.



The 18-year-old Ledecky has been the outstanding performer in the Kazan pool, winning golds in the 200m, 400m and 1,500m freestyle, plus anchoring the US women's 4x200m freestyle relay win. The teenager has twice lowered her own 1,500m world record in Kazan and clocked the fastest time of 8min 19.42sec in the morning's 800m heats to qualify for Saturday's final.

"I always like to finish on a good night and leave a meet with a nice feeling, so we'll see what happens," said Ledecky, the 800m world record holder and defending champion.

Bahrain schoolgirl Alzain Tareq, believed to be the youngest swimmer to ever compete at a world championships, caused a splash when the 10-year-old

Signs & Symptoms of Sigatoka Leaf Spot

- \* Small pale yellow or greenish yellow lesions on the leaves.
- \* These lesions or streaks are 1 to 10 mm long & 0.5 to 1.0 mm wide, parallel to the leaf vein.
- \* The streaks darken & expand laterally to form more or less elliptical brown spots.
- \* The centre of each spot eventually dries out, becoming light grey, but a narrow dark brown or black border persists, giving the mature spot an eye spot appearance.
- \* Infected plants have scorched appearance, petiole collapse and leaves hang down from pseudo stem.
- \* The photosynthetic area is drastically reduced and in severe cases the fruit does not mature at all.
- \* The size of the bunches and individual fingers is reduced, the fruit ripens prematurely and has an abnormal flavor and smell

Control and Management

- \* It can be managed by improved drainage, good weed control, removal of suckers and proper spacing.
  - \* Removal & destruction of diseased leaves from plantation.
  - \* Foliar application of 1% Bordeaux mixture plus 2% linseed oil or D-M-45/D-Z-78 @ 2.5 gm/lit of water soon after the appearance of initial symptoms of the disease.
  - \* Application of Bavistin (60-70 mg) in capsule inserted in the rhizome will be very effective
- The farmers those who suspect such type of problem in their field are requested to follow necessary plant protection measures to check further spread of diseases and to avoid major loss

Canine Distemper - know your pet disease

Canine disease is a highly contagious, systemic and serious viral illness with no known cure. The disease affecting dogs and some of the wild animal like foxes, wolves, raccoons and skunks.

Canine distemper is a paramyxovirus, which appears very similar to the paramyxovirus causing human measles. The virus attacks the respiratory, gastrointestinal and nervous systems of puppies and dogs. It is usually spread by the secretion from an infected animal's cough and sneeze.

The first sign of distemper is usually eye discharge that may appear watery to pus like, a weepy eye condition. Infected dogs then develop fever, nasal discharge, coughing, and lethargy; reduce appetite, vomiting and diarrhea. In later stages, the virus may attack nervous system, causing seizures, twitching, or partial or complete paralysis. Occasionally, the virus may cause footpads to harden.

No specific drug is available that will kill the virus in infected dogs. Treatment consists primarily of efforts to prevent secondary infections; control symptoms; and combat dehydration through administration of fluids. Ill dogs should be kept warm, receive good nursing care, and be separated from other dogs.

All dogs are at risk but puppies younger than four month old and dogs that have not been vaccinated against canine distemper are at increased risk. The only prevention is vaccination and avoiding contact with infected animals. Pet owners should be sure that their dogs distemper vaccination is up to date. Ask your veterinarian about recommended vaccination program for your dog.

Distemper is often fatal. Even if a dog does not die from the disease, canine distemper virus can cause irreparable damage to a dog's nervous system.

In a statement, Minister of State for Home Affairs Shri Kiren Rijiju said in New Delhi, the collaboration of both these prestigious institutions will provide opening to the students into a new emerging research area and positions in administration from district to higher levels.

He said, this will have the potential of generating a new breed of Disaster Management professionals.

increased to a just five percent, it would fetch a 33 percent enhanced revenue to the Handloom weavers. Urging film industry to popularise handlooms, handicrafts and khadi sector, he mentioned that in ancient times also concepts like 'supply chain management', 'cluster development' and 'raw material supply' were popular.

He said that the use of Khadi products has registered an increase of 60 percent after his appeal during the Mann Ki Baat Program through Radio. Prime Minister emphasised on increase use of technology and e-commerce for marketing of handloom products. He mentioned that handloom is a labour intensive sector where increased use of technology should be encouraged.
