## GST bill to be taken up by Lok Sabha today



New Delhi, Aug 7

The Good and Services Tax Bill will be taken up by Loksabha tomorrow. The Bill was passed by Rajya Sabha on Wednesday with amendments which need to be again approved by the Lok Sabha. It is expected that Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi may intervene in the debate over the 122nd

Constitution Amendment Bill. BJP has already issued a whip to all its Lok Sabha MPs asking them to be present in the house. The GST is aimed at bringing uniform tax regime in the country by subsuming state levies. Under it, a single rate of GST will replace various taxes to ensure seamless transfer of goods and services.

## RBI reviewing its policy to promote cashless transaction: Govt

New Delhi, Aug 7

The government today said, Reserve Bank has been reviewing its policy to promote cashless transaction by electronic mode, which is safe, secure

and convenient. In a written reply in Lok Sabha, the Minister of State for Finance Shri Santosh Kumar Gangwar said, according to RBI there has been a marked growth in

electronic banking transaction since 2013-14. The banks have been advised to keep an eye on number of transactions availed by the customers.

## MP requests Finance Minister to allocate funds for Islands' Projects

He said that the 4th Finance commission for UTs also recommended for funds for the Islands. Shri Ray said that the Islands have huge potential for tourism and if given proper attention, it can be developed like any Island Nation. Informing about the present financial

condition of the Port Blair Municipal Council he said it needs fund to execute the works. Talking about the Optical Fiber Cable Project, Shri Ray requested Shri Jaitley to allocate fund for it.

According to a report

recently tabled in Parliament, Central Vigilance Commission received 62,362 such complaints in 2014.

The Commission's annual report for 2015 mentioned that it had received 31,432 and 37,039 complaints of alleged corruption during 2013 and 2012 respectively.

IOA announces cash award of 50 lakh rupees for gold medal winning athlete in Rio Olympics

New Delhi, Aug 7 Indian Olympic Association, IOA, has announced a cash award of 50 lakh rupees for the gold medal winning athlete in the Rio Olympics. IOA President Shri N Ramachandran and Secretary General Shri Rajeev Mehta, announced in Rio de Janeiro

that the national Olympic body for the first time will award 50 lakh rupees for a gold medal, 30 lakh rupees for silver and 20 lakh rupees for bronze. In addition, the coaches will be awarded an equivalent of 50 per cent of the amount that the athletes receive. Meanwhile, Indian Railways

has also announced a cash award of one crore rupees for its athlete who wins a gold medal at the Rio Olympics. 35 athletes from Indian Railways are taking parts in the event. In a statement, Railways said, the silver medalist will get 75 lakh rupees and bronze medal winner 50 lakh rupees.

Rio Olympics: Australia shine as World Records tumble in swimming



Rio De Janeiro, Aug 7 Mack Horton won his grudge match against China's Sun Yang and Australia's 4x100m free relay women added another gold as records tumbled on day one at the Rio Olympics pool on Saturday. While it was a triumphant night for Australia, the mighty US team were shut out of the gold - coming up with three silvers from the four finals. Horton clocked 3min 41.55sec to hold off a feverish challenge from 2012 gold medalist Sun, who briefly looked to have the Australian beaten on the last lap

but had to settle for second in 3:41.68. Italy's Gabriele Detti roared home in the final 50 meters to capture bronze in 3:43.49. Sun, stung after the heats by Horton's attack on his doping record, was left weeping after the race. Horton, whose mild manner and Harry Potter-style spectacles belie his toughness, said he knew that by calling Sun out he'd put himself on the spot. "Well that last 50 I was kinda thinking about what I said and was like, if he gets me here it's not going to look great," Horton said.

Rio 2016 Olympics: Hagino wins 400m medley gold

Rio De Janeiro, Aug 7 Japan's Kosuke Hagino won the men's 400m individual medley on Saturday to kick off the gold rush in the Rio Olympics competition pool. Hagino clocked 4min 06.05sec, holding off American Chase Kalisz to wrest the title from US hands, where it had rested for the past five Games. Kalisz clocked 4:06.75 and

Japan's Daiya Seto was third in 4:09.71. Hagino's time made him the third-fastest performer in history behind world record-holder Michael Phelps and 2012 Olympic champion Ryan Lochte. Neither of those US stars were in action on Saturday, Phelps opting out of the gruelling event he dubbed "swimming's decathlon" and Lochte failing to qualify at the US trials.

Kalisz had led the way into the final in a spirited preliminary duel with Seto, while Hagino, swimming in a different heat, cruised to a victory with plenty in the tank for the final. He seized the lead on the second, backstroke leg and never relinquished it, as Kalisz battled past Seto on the breaststroke leg and pushed Hagino to the last wall on the closing freestyle.

France will not host European Road Cycling Championships

Paris, Aug 7 The French city of Nice says it will not host the European Road Cycling Championships, planned for 14th to 18th September, for security reasons. Mayor Philippe Pradal said the event required a

large police presence, but the southern city had not received any guarantees about their deployment. It is the latest event in France to be called off after July's lorry attack in Nice in which 85 people died.

Indian Railways announces cash awards for its athlete who wins medal at Rio Olympics

New Delhi, Aug 7 Indian Railways has announced a cash award of one crore rupees for its athlete who wins a gold medal at the Rio Olympics. 35 athletes from Indian Railways are taking parts in the event. In a statement, Railways said, the silver medalist will get 75

lakh rupees and bronze medal winner 50 lakh rupees. For the athletes who manages a top-8 finish, the reward will be 30 lakh rupees and for mere participation 5 lakh rupees. It said, Rio Olympics is a testimony to the effort that Railways has put in promoting and supporting sports in India.

Venus Williams knocked out in Rio upset

Rio De Janeiro, Aug 7 Former Olympic champion Venus Williams was eliminated in the first round at the Rio Games on Saturday after Belgian underdog Kirsten Flipkens mounted a spirited fight back to cause the biggest upset of the opening day. Another notable casualty on the first day of competition was former world No. 1 Ana Ivanovic, who surged ahead in the first set against world No. 12 Carla Suarez Navarro but lost 2-6 6-1 6-2 after two error-strewn sets. With U.S. Secretary of State John Kerry and gymnastics gold medal favourite Simone Biles looking on, seven-times

grand slam winner Williams won the first set but became frustrated as the match wore on, losing 4-6 6-3 7-6(5) to the world number 62. Flipkens collapsed on to the court after winning the final set tie-breaker and the rowdy Brazilian crowd serenaded her with chants of "ole, ole, ole". Flipkens later thanked the "amazing" Brazilian crowd for helping her pull off one of the biggest wins of her career. "To beat Venus Williams on the centre court, one of the biggest champions in our history, that (gave me) goosebumps all over the place," she told reporters.

Govt approves upgradation of NCDC and its labs

New Delhi, Aug 7 The government has approved upgradation of National Centre for Disease Control, NCDC and its labs at a cost of over 382 crore rupees. Replying to supplementaries in the Lok Sabha, Minister of State for Health, Ms Anupriya Patel said that establishment of 30 branches in States including eight existing branches of NCDC has also been approved at a cost of over 367 crore rupees.

He underlined the importance of involvement of the stakeholders to achieve the stated outcome and assured that WII would provide all necessary technical and research support in recovering both Dugong and its habitat the sea grass meadows in the Islands. Dr. K. Ravichandran, Conservator of Forests (Wildlife) mentioned that Andaman and Nicobar Islands is the first territory in the country to initiate species recovery programme on dugong and restoration of sea grass meadows under the Centrally Sponsored Scheme of the MoEF&CC and with research support from Nature Conservation Foundation, Mysore. He informed that information related to number and extent of sea grass meadows, its use by dugong and sighting of dugong and its frequency in various locations in the recent past is available with the department. A presentation on the work done so far by the Department in association with NCF, Mysore since 2011 was made by Ms. Elicia D'souza, Researcher of NCF. She gave an account on the importance of Dugong conservation, the status of sea grass meadows including composition, the threats, the need for monitoring the population, conservation and management imperatives and awareness and capacity building. A total of 67 meadows have been surveyed so far and 21 dugongs have been encountered during the last 4 years. Dr. K. Sivakumar, Senior faculty of WII made a presentation on the new project, its objectives, methodologies, role of various stakeholders, sensitization and awareness generation of local communities, involvement of communities, strategies to elicit the support, involvement and participation of communities in the recovery programme including the option of incentivizing the fishermen communities for successful conservation of Dugong in the territorial waters of Andaman and Nicobar Islands. The stakeholders provided comments and suggestions on issues related to the aerial survey, boat survey and SCUBA diving/Snorkeling surveys of sea grass meadows and Dugong, implications and need for more research on the seagrass meadows, monitoring protocol, mapping of seagrass meadows, stakeholder participation, providing logistics for survey and movement of the research team, infrastructure and facilities to be put in place for the carrying out the project activities at North & Middle Andaman, South Andaman and Nicobar group of Islands, need to retrofit the dugong awareness programmes in the programmes already being implemented by various agencies like Fisheries, Coast Guard, Marine Police and Forest Department, etc. Dr. K. Ravichandran, summed up the suggestions, comments on the projects and proposed the vote of thanks.
