Swearing-in-ceremony at Raj Niwas

Admiral Devendra Kumar Joshi to be sworn in as 13th Lt. Governor of A&N Islands today

Port Blair, Oct 7

Admiral Devendra Kumar Joshi, PVSM, AVSM, YSM, NM, VSM (Retd.) will be sworn in as the 13th Lt. Governor of A&N Islands tomorrow (Oct 8). The Lt. Governor-designate will arrive here from New Delhi, along with Smti Chitra Joshi (Spouse) and other members of his family at 12.30 pm tomorrow. He will be received by the Chief Secretary, A&N Administration, DGP and other Senior Officers of the Administration.

The swearing-in-ceremony will be held at 3.30 pm at Raj Niwas. The Acting Chief Justice of Calcutta High Court, Mr. Justice Rakesh Tiwari will administer the Oath of Office and Oath of Secrecy to the new Lt Governor. The Chief Secretary, Shri Anindo Majumdar will read out the Warrant of Appointment.

Later, the Lt. Governor of A&N Islands, Admiral D K Joshi will visit the National Memorial Cellular Jail at 4.30 pm and lay wreath at the Martyr's Column there. In the evening, the Lt. Governor will hold a meeting with the Chief Secretary, DGP, PCCF and Secretary to LG at Raj Niwas.

On Oct 9, 2017, the Lt. Governor will hold an introductory meeting with the Chief Secretary and Senior Officers of the A&N Administration in the conference hall of Raj Niwas. A brief presentation will be made by the Chief Secretary on this occasion. The Lt. Governor is also scheduled to hold a meeting with the CINCAN at 3 pm on Oct 9.

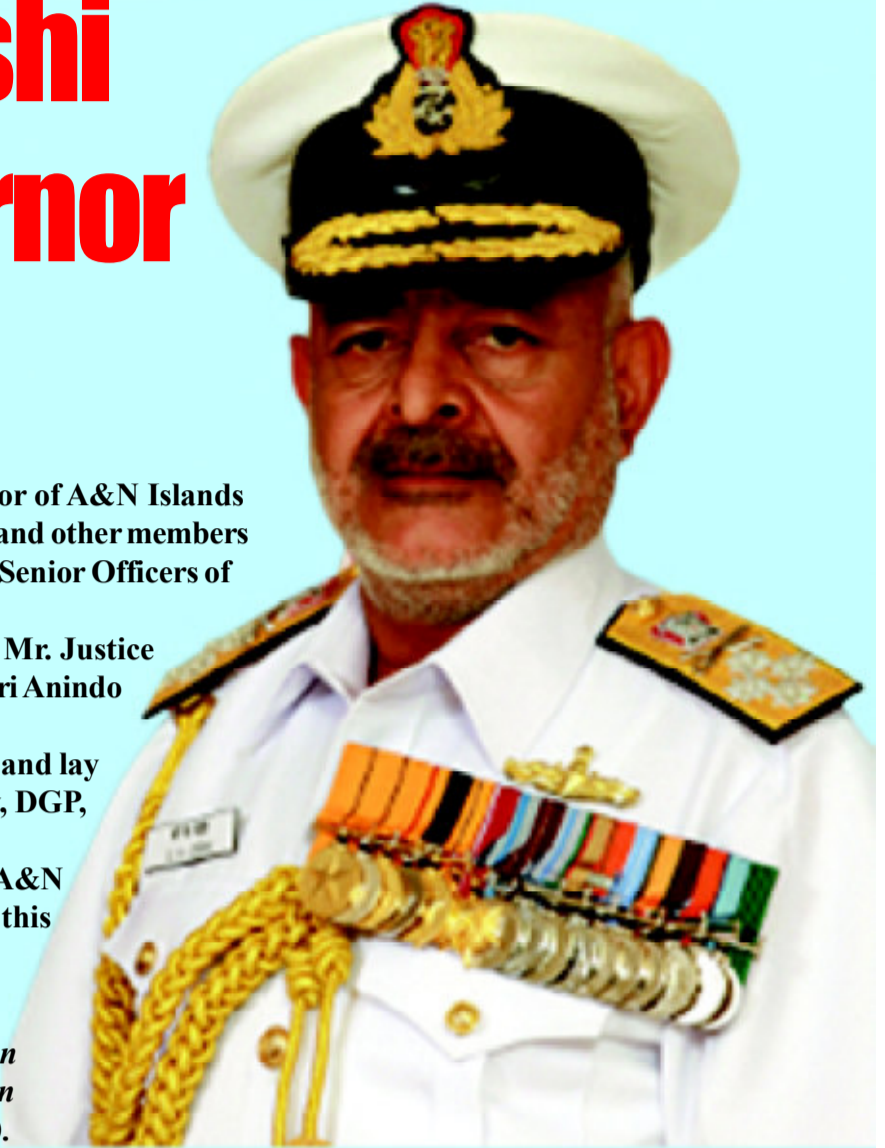
Profile of the new Lt. Governor

Admiral D K Joshi, PVSM, AVSM, YSM, NM, VSM (Retd.) was the 21st Chief of Naval Staff, having assumed office on 31 August 2012. Born on 04 July 1954, in Almora (Uttarakhand), he is a specialist in anti-submarine warfare. He is an alumni of Naval War College (USA), College of Naval Warfare (Mumbai) and National Defence College (New Delhi). He has also been the Senior Instructor (Navy) at Defence Services Staff College (Wellington).

Admiral Joshi has served in a variety of command, staff and instructional appointments. His commands at sea include guided missile corvette INS Kuthar, guided missile destroyer INS Ranvir and the aircraft carrier INS Viraat, during which he was awarded Nausena Medal, Vishist Seva Medal and Yudh Seva Medal respectively. Admiral Joshi was also the Defence Advisor in the Indian High Commission at Singapore from 1996 to 1999, with concurrent accreditation to the Philippines. After his elevation to Flag rank, Admiral Joshi commanded the Eastern Fleet, wherein he was awarded Ati Vishisht Seva Medal (AVSM). He has also served in the Integrated Headquarters, as head of all the nodal branches. He served in the Personnel Branch as the Assistant Chief of Personnel (Human Resource Development), and Warship Production and Acquisition as the Assistant Controller of the Aircraft Carrier Programme (ACACP), and thereafter in the Operations Branch both as Assistant Chief of Naval Staff (Information Warfare and Operations) and as the Deputy Chief of Naval Staff. Before taking over as the Flag Officer Commanding-in-Chief Western Naval Command in 2011, he was the Commander-in-Chief of the Andaman and Nicobar Command, the only tri-service integrated command. He was awarded the Param Vishisht Seva Medal during this time. Later, he served as the Chief of Integrated Defence Staff to Chairman, Chiefs of Staff Committee (CISC).

Admiral Joshi voluntarily retired on 26 February 2014 having completed less than half of his tenure as CNS. On 08 October 2017, he assumes the appointment of Lt Governor of Andaman and Nicobar Islands. He has also been designated as Vice Chairman, Islands Development Agency, for which orders were issued in June, 2017.

He is married to Chitra Joshi and the couple has two daughters.



GST Council reduces tax rates on 27 items, approves quarterly return filing

New Delhi, Oct 7

In a major relief to common man, small traders and exporters, the GST Council has reduced tax rates on 27 items and allowed the filing of returns on the quarterly basis. The GST Council meeting held under the Chairmanship of Union Finance Minister Shri Arun Jaitley in New Delhi yesterday decided to reduce the GST rates on dried mangoes, Khakhra,

plain chapatis, unbranded Namkeen, unbranded ayurvedic medicines and paper wastes to 5 percent from 12 percent.

Briefing reporters after the meeting, Shri Jaitley said, food packets used in ICDS scheme, plastic and rubber wastes will now be taxed at 5 percent instead of 18 percent. Man-made Yarn will be taxed at 12 percent instead of 18 percent. Shri Jaitley said, stationary

items, flooring stones other than marble and granites, parts of diesel engine and pumps will now attract 18 percent GST against the present rate of 28 percent. Moreover, job works

related to zari embroidery, imitation jewellery, food items, printing, and government contracts involving high element of labour will all attract GST

United Sporting Club, Junglighat lifts Forest Martyr's Rolling Trophy

Romania's Simona Halep becomes WTA world number one

Port Blair, Oct 7
In a nail biting final match of the 2nd Forest Martyr's Rolling Trophy organized by the Department of Environment and Forests as a part of the 63rd Wildlife Week Celebration, played between arcivals, the Assam Regiment and the United Sporting Club, Junglighat, the latter claimed the rolling trophy this year by a score of 2-1. After the Vice President Cup Tournament win against the Assam Regiment, the United Sporting Club's



winning streak continues with this win. Shri M.S. Negi PCCF & Pri Secy (E&F) was the chief guest on the occasion in presence of Shri Tarun Coomar PCCF (WL), Shri D.M. Shukla APCCF, Shri Ravi Chandran, CCF and other senior officers of the Forest Department.

The winners were presented with the rolling trophy and cash reward of Rs.25,000/- and the first and second runners up received cash reward of Rs. 20,000/- and Rs 10,000/- respectively. Shri Emerson of 15th Assam Regiment emerged as the player of the tournament and was awarded with Golden Boot, while Emmanuel and Leonard were adjudged as the best defender and best Goal keeper respectively.

Beijing, Oct 7
Simona Halep gained some revenge for her defeat by Jelena Ostapenko in the French Open final and achieved world number one status for the first time after a 6-2 6-4 win in the semi-finals of the China Open in Beijing on Saturday. The Romanian missed out on her first grand slam title and the world number one spot in Paris last June when the unseeded Latvian Ostapenko came back from a set and 3-0 down to win the French Open final, but in Beijing on Saturday, Halep was not to be denied, breaking the Ostapenko serve in the opening game and the seventh to take the first set 6-2. With the players engaging in hard-hitting baseline rallies, it was Halep that came out on top, breaking serve with a backhand crosscourt to lead 5-4 and then sealing the match with a trademark forehand to complete victory in 77 minutes. Halep is the 25th player in WTA history and the first Romanian to become world number one, and will replace Spain's Garbine Muguruza at the top of the standings when the official rankings are released on Monday.

About 27 teams consisting of 412 participants (U-14(Boys)-134, U-17(Boys)-138, U-17(Girls)-140) and 54 Officials from nine Educational Zones from all over the Islands are participating in the Championship. The Championship which began today will continue upto Oct. 11.

Earlier, welcoming the gathering, the Deputy Director Education (Admn.) Shri Shubankar Ghosh congratulated the players of all the nine zones, coaches and referees for participating in the tournament. reports including audited accounts for the last three years. Apart from these, resolution by the agency supporting the decision for placing orphan, abandoned or surrendered children in adoption; undertaking to abide by the relevant rules and adoption guidelines in force; undertaking to regularly update data on Child Adoption Resource Information and Guidance System and to have necessary facilities for the same supporting documents indicating that the organization has been engaged in child protection and welfare activities, list of children in the institution; and list of professional and child care staff will also have to be furnished. The Department shall issue a certificate of recognition to the child care institution as a specialized adoption agency within two months from the date of application, if the child care institution is found fit to be considered as a specialized adoption agency, based upon inspection conducted for the purpose.

If an organization is not involved in institutional care but has the capacity and expertise to ensure quality non-institutional care for infants and young children through trained foster care givers on their panel, the Department may also recognize such organization as a specialized adoption agency.

The recognition to a specialized adoption agency shall be for a period of five years, unless it is revoked.

Interested Institutions or Organizations may see detailed guidelines on SAA and regulations on adoption on the website of the CARA.

The last date for submission of applications is 20th October, 2017.

at the rate of 5 percent.

The GST Council also approved the quarterly filing of returns for businesses with turnover upto 1.5 crore rupees besides raising the threshold for composition scheme from 75 lakh rupees to one crore rupees. Shri Jaitley said that under composition scheme, traders will now pay one percent, manufacturers two percent and restaurants five percent.

He said, exporters will start getting refunds of their input credit for the month of July from 10th of October and for August from 18th of this month. This is an interim arrangement. Long-term solution is to create an e-wallet for every exporter in which a notional amount would be credited as advance refund and through this, the IGST or GST will be paid. This credit will be offset from their actual refund. This arrangement will be developed by an appropriate technology company by April 1, 2018.

The GST Council also recommended setting up Group of Ministers to examine key rate cut issues regarding AC restaurants. The committee will come up with a mechanism to reduce GST on AC restaurants in ten days. Shri. Jaitley said, the Council also discussed e-way bill. He said, Karnataka is already having good experience with it and after first of January it will go to other states.

Navy thwarts piracy against Indian bulk carrier in Gulf of Aden

New Delhi, Oct 7

The Indian Navy has thwarted a piracy attempt in the Gulf of Aden saving the 85,000-tonne bulk carrier, MV Jag Amar, from the clutches of armed pirates.

Navy spokesperson Capt DK Sharma said in New Delhi, that INS Trishul, which is on anti-piracy patrol in the Gulf of Aden, received a distress call over open radio yesterday and it launched a helicopter from its deck carrying marine commandos. He said the helicopter closed in on the MV Jag Amar, an India registered carrier, and a small high-speed skiff used by the 12 armed pirates was intercepted. The special forces of the Navy recovered an AK-47 and ladders. The cargo ship MV Jag Amar was on its way to Jubail, Saudi Arabia when the piracy attempt was made. All 26 Indian crew onboard the Indian ship were safe.
