## India, UK agree to set up Joint Working Group to expand trade

New Delhi, Nov 7  
India and the UK today agreed to set up a Joint Working Group, JWG to expand trade. The Group will not only focus on goods trade, but also services, including through greater mobility for skilled professionals. In his press statement after holding delegation level talks with his British counterpart Ms Theresa May in New Delhi, Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi said, Indian companies are successfully raising finance from London and New Delhi is encouraged by London Stock Exchange hosting several Rupee denominated Masala bonds. The Prime Minister invited the United Kingdom to build partnership with Indian enterprises that focus on manufacturing, technology transfer and co-development in Defence sector. He also welcomed the growing cooperation in cyber security. Shri Modi thanked his counterpart for UK's consistent support for India's membership of UN Security Council and Nuclear Suppliers Group.

## Eradicating social evils from A&N Islands Lt Governor appeals Islanders, social & religious organizations for strengthening Administration's efforts



Port Blair, Nov 7  
The Andaman & Nicobar Islands have been described as 'Mini India' in true sense. The Islanders are very humble, peace loving and generous while Hindi is the *lingua franca* here as people from different parts of the country live here in perfect harmony, said the Lt Governor A&N Islands, Prof. Jagdish Mukhi, while participating in 'Good Morning Port Blair', a programme of All India Radio, Port Blair this morning. While expressing his views on the topic, 'social evils faced by people of these Islands', which was broadcast this morning, the Lt Governor said that despite the fact that people are good and have good habits, he personally felt that there is a suicidal

tendency prevailing in the Islands. To do away with such tendency, the Administration has taken certain decisions; especially to eradicate some social evils, which, he said, are the root cause of the suicidal tendencies. The Lt Governor said, the Administration has realized that the main reason for tongue cancer is due to consumption of zarda, tobacco and gutka. After interacting with general public, the Administration has banned tobacco products in these Islands with effect from Oct 2, 2016. In the initial stage there might be some difficulties but the decision to ban the tobacco products will have a far reaching impact in the society and on the health of the Islanders in the long run, said the Lt Governor. The Lt Governor further said, the Administration has felt that liquor is also another major factor and contributor to suicidal tendency prevailing here. Therefore, the Administration has decided to curb the consumption of liquor in these Islands. As per the laid down requirement of the Constitution, the States must act tough to restrict the sale of liquor, and the

Administration will make all out efforts to curb the consumption of liquor in these Islands, he said. The Lt Governor further said, keeping in mind the ideology of the Father of the Nation, Mahatma Gandhi and the interest of the people of these Islands, the Administration has decided to adopt a controlled excise policy. As part of the policy, a 'Directorate of Prohibition' has been established on Oct 2, which will venture into creating positive campaign on 'liquor- a social menace', he said. The new Directorate will bring to the forefront the ill-effects of liquor, the damages it caused in different Islands and the damage it can cause to the health of an individual. The Lt Governor concluded his views on these two social evils by saying that the Administration, keeping in mind the interest of the islanders, has taken some logistic measures which will help eliminate these social evils. The Lt Governor also appealed to the Islanders including the social and religious organisations to help the Administration in this endeavour.

## Promotion of inland fisheries in A&N Islands Fisheries Deptt. extends financial assistance to fish farmers for setting up of projects

Port Blair, Nov. 7  
The Department of Fisheries, A&N Administration extends assistance to the fish farmers to propagate Inland Fisheries in A&N Islands. Under this scheme, 25% subsidy subject to a maximum of Rs. 9,000/- for construction of nursery pond and a maximum of Rs. 15,000/- for purchase of one set of fish breeding material and financial assistance @ Rs. 5,000/- per pond for general beneficiaries and @ Rs. 7,500/- per pond for tribal beneficiaries for renovation of freshwater ponds will be given. 25% subsidy subject to a maximum of Rs. 9,000/- for purchase of freshwater

fish harvesting net will also be provided. In addition, the Department of Fisheries produces and supplies freshwater fish seed to the pisciculturists of these Islands at a nominal price. Time to time, seed from mainland is also procured

and supplied to the pisciculturists. During the current year, till date, 10.84 lakh locally produced fish seed of Catla, Rohu and Mrigal were supplied to 1386 fish farmers and 50,240 seeds of Grass Carp and Silver Carp procured from mainland were supplied to

401 fish farmers. The Department of Fisheries is making all out efforts to utilize all the freshwater bodies for pisciculture and to increase the production. At present inland / freshwater fishes are cultured mainly for self consumption and the surplus is sold at local markets in rural areas almost every day. Freshwater fishes are also being sold in Junglighat market every Sunday by the farmers. These schemes of the Department can be utilized for freshwater fish culture, a communication from the Director of Fisheries said.

"I felt really nervous before the match," Murray said, despite having beaten the big-serving American in all seven of their previous career meetings. Murray has officially replaced Novak Djokovic. The 29-year-old Murray is still getting accustomed to his newfound status. "I don't really

Lionel Messi, with his 500th Barcelona goal, and Luis Suarez saved the Spanish champions from a second defeat in six days as they came from behind to win 2-1 at Sevilla on Sunday. Victory keeps Barca just two points adrift of Real Madrid, who were 3-0 victors over Leganes thanks to a double from Gareth Bale. Madrid also announced that Cristiano Ronaldo will extend his contract with the European champions until 2021 on Monday.

Messi inspired a spirited Barca fightback fresh from a 3-1 defeat at Manchester City in the Champions League on Tuesday after a first-half dominated by Sevilla. With the cast of the Game of Thrones among those watching on in Seville, the game got off to a frantic start. The hosts had two shots on goal inside 50 seconds, but
