The Election Commission of India has announced the schedule for Special Summary Revision of Photo Electoral Roll w.r.t. 01st January 2018 with a view to prepare an accurate and error free electoral roll since defect free and updated electoral rolls, are the bedrock of any vibrant democracy. The focus is on registration of all eligible persons especially youth, females and other marginalized sections of the society. As per the schedule, the

photo electoral roll of Parliamentary Constituency has been published in draft on 31st October, 2017 in this UT. The period for filing claims and objections is being done from 31st October, 2017 (Tuesday) till 30th November, 2017 (Thursday) and the final electoral roll is to be published on 13th January, 2018 (Saturday). Special campaigns with Booth Level Agents of Political Parties for filing claims and objections shall also be organized on 11th & 25th

November, 2017 (Saturdays). The claims and objection shall be disposed by 15th December 2017 (Friday) by AEROS. All political parties and

**India women's hockey team rises to number ten in rankings**

Lausanne, Nov 7  
The Indian women's hockey team on Monday broke into the top-10 in the FIH world rankings following their Asia Cup title triumph in Japan. The India team gained two places in the ranking table to be placed at number 10 behind Korea and ahead of Spain. The chart is being led by European champions Netherlands, who have maintained their top position, and are followed by England and Pan American Cup champions Argentina. USA have dropped down to seventh, with 2017 Oceania Cup winners Australia



replacing them in fourth position. New Zealand and Germany also leapfrogged USA, taking up the fifth and sixth position respectively. Chile made considerable gains, moving up five positions from 20th to 15th after they picked up the silver medal in this year's Pan American Cup. Along with Chile, the Czech Republic (now 19) and Singapore (35) were amongst the biggest risers for the women, all moving up five positions. The India's men's team has maintained the sixth position in the latest rankings.

**Srikanth, Prannoy to clash in Senior Nationals final**

Nagpur, Nov 7  
World No 2 Kidambi Srikanth and giant-killer HS Prannoy will clash in the men's singles final at the 82nd Senior Badminton National Championship on Wednesday. Second seed Prannoy overcame Subhankar Dey 21-14, 21-17, while top seed Srikanth prevailed over rising shuttler Lakshya Sen 21-16, 21-18 to set up a repeat of

their semi-final battle in the French Open a little over a week ago. Saina Nehwal, who is currently ranked World No 11, hardly broke a sweat as she defeated fifth seed Anura Prabhudesai 21-11, 21-10 to reach the women's singles final. Among others, mixed doubles combo of Satwik Sai Raj R and Ashwini Ponnappa will face top seeds Pranaav Jerry Chopra and Sikki Reddy N

after they emerged winners following the retirement of their semi-final opponents Sanyam Shukla and Sanyogita Ghorpade midway in the first game. Pranaav and Sikki, however, had to dig deep to stave off a spirited challenge from Alwin Francis and Aparna Balan 21-16, 22-24, 21-8 in a match that lasted little over an hour. Top seeded women's doubles pair of Sikki Reddy N and Ashwini Ponnappa will meet Sanyogita Ghorpade and Prajakta Sawant in the final.

**Mitchell Starc makes history with two hat-tricks in one game**

Sydney, Nov 7  
Strike bowler Mitchell Starc became the first man to take two hat-tricks in the same first-class game in Australia on Tuesday as he hit ominous form ahead of the Ashes Test series against England. The left-arm pacer became only the eighth player in first-class cricket history -- and the first in 39 years -- to achieve the feat as he spearheaded New South Wales to victory over Western Australia in the Sheffield Shield. Having removed Jason Behrendorff, David Moody and Simon Mackin in WA's first innings to complete his first career hat-trick, Starc

then got both Behrendorff and Moody again off the final two deliveries of his 15th over. Jono Wells then edged Starc on the first ball of his next over to Australia and NSW captain Steve Smith at first slip to end the match. Starc finished with the match figures of seven for 97 in NSW's 171-run victory. He also took a career-best 8-73 for NSW against South Australia under lights at Adelaide Oval and looks in ominous touch ahead of the Test series. Australia take on England in the first of five Ashes Test matches in Brisbane, starting on November 23.

date of birth is on or before 01/01/2000 and are not enrolled in the Electoral roll till date are eligible to file their claims for inclusion in the ongoing revision process with the qualifying date 01st January, 2018.

The revision process has a number of pre-determined activities which need to be completed within pre-fixed timelines and as such for the revision of rolls the Commission expects enthusiastic participation of the public and full involvement and cooperation of the political parties, rural and urban local bodies, NGOs etc. It is massive activity in which the entire election machinery starting with CEO/DEOs/EROs/AEROs and ending with BLO Supervisors and BLOs takes part.

The target of 100% coverage of PER (Photo Electoral Roll) and EPIC (Elector's Photo Identity Card) is yet to be achieved. The Election Commission of India has also reiterated the same to achieve 100% error free electoral roll and its this year moto is "No Voter to be left behind".

In order to ensure hassle free enrolment of the general public, State Contact Centre (SCC) at the Office of Chief Electoral Officer, A & N Islands and District Contact Centres at all three District Offices are setup which will function on all working days from 9 am to 5 pm. Besides, a Toll Free No. 1950 is also made functional during such working hours. They can also register their name through online by logging on to ECI's website www.nvsp.in. The required number of BLOs/Designated Officers have been appointed in all the polling stations and they will be available at their designated locations up to 30/11/2017 (Thursday) to receive claims and objections. They shall guide the people to fill up the forms for inclusion of names, correction, changing of polling stations. The detailed list of appointment of all such BLOs is being published by the respective AEROs in the newspapers for information of the general public. All the recognized political parties are also requested to appoint/identify booth level agents who would be associated with BLOs in maximum enrolment of left out electors and new electors as well in the current revision.

The Chief Electoral Officer, A & N Islands has therefore, appealed to the general public, especially the youth in the age group 18-19 yrs to enroll their names in the Parliamentary photo electoral rolls - 2018 for maximum enrolment by submitting form - 6 with passport size photograph, proof of age and residence, if not enrolled earlier so as to achieve 100% error free photo electoral roll and fulfill the motto of Commission "No Voter to be left behind". The CEO has also requested all political parties and media to extend their full cooperation in this regard, a communication said.
