Shri Modi said the government is committed to ensure equal rights for every citizen of the country. He said people of the country are indebted to Dr Ambedkar for giving a new direction to the country. Speaking after inaugurating Dr Ambedkar International Centre in New Delhi today, the Prime Minister said, social empowerment of people is a commitment for his government. The Prime Minister said, BHIM app was launched for the poor and downtrodden and is a great step reflecting the economic development of the country. He said, he is monitoring that every scheme being run by the government should meet its deadline. He

said, efforts are being made to ensure that every poor has his house by 2022 under the Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana. Saying he has faith in the youth of the country to fight casteism, the Prime Minister said, young Indians will fulfil the dream of New India. Shri Modi said, Dr Ambedkar was always hopeful for India's socio and economic development. He said toilets are being constructed in rural India and insurance being given to 18 crore poor under Pradhan Mantri Bima Yojana. Ambedkar International Centre is a fusion of Buddhist and present-day architecture. Shri Modi said it will provide information to people, especially youth about Babasaheb. The complex includes seminar as well as conference halls.

EPFO opens new facility for over 4.5 crore members

New Delhi, Dec 7

Retirement fund body Employees' Provident Fund Organisation, EPFO has opened a new facility for its over 4.5 crore members that will allow consolidation or merger of their multiple PF accounts with the current Universal Account Number, UAN.

Under this facility, subscribers of the EPFO can merge as many as 10 previous accounts with

their UAN at one go. A senior official yesterday said the EPFO has made it easy with this facility with an objective of having one employee, one EPF account. The EPFO, according to the official, has already issued direction to its over 120 offices earlier this week to use this service and ensure multiple accounts are consolidated as early as possible.

11% rise in income of poor households, 32% rise in farm productivity under MGNREGS

New Delhi, Dec 7

The income of poor households rose by 11 per cent and farm productivity by up to 32 per cent due to various works carried out under the Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme, says a study. The study was carried out by Institute of Economic

Growth, an autonomous body under the Government. The Rural Development Ministry, sharing details of research, yesterday said study recorded an increase in incomes of households by nearly 11 per cent and increase in cereal productivity by 11.5 per cent and vegetable

productivity by 32.3 per cent. Around 155 types of works are carried out under the rural employment guarantee scheme to ensure employment in rural areas as well bring forth asset creation in these areas. Majority of funds under the scheme are utilised for water conservation works.

Leave Travel Concession Rules revised; NGGOA welcomes decision

The Non-Gazetted Govt. Officers' Association (NGGOA), Andaman and Nicobar Islands has welcomed the recent amendments made by Govt. of India in Leave Travel Concession (LTC) Rules. The Department of Personnel and Training (DoPT), Gol through Office Memorandum dated October 31, 2017 has settled the long pending demand of employees' organization. The memorandum envisages full reimbursement as per the entitlement of Government servant for

journeys performed on LTC by the family members from home town / any place in India to Head Quarters/ place of posting of Govt. servant, and back. When such journey is performed from hometown, the LTC shall be counted against 'Home Town LTC' and in case the journey from any other place in India, it shall be counted against 'Any place in India LTC'. Earlier, no reimbursement was allowed for journeys performed by dependent family members from the home town or any other place in India to visit the

Sports Minister inaugurates SAICON 2017 in New Delhi

New Delhi, Dec 7
The First International Conference on Sports Medicine and Sports Sciences SAICON 2017 was inaugurated here today by the Minister of State (I/C) Youth Affairs and Sports Col. Rajyavardhan Rathore. Speaking on the occasion he said India has made significant progress in Sports by winning medals in many international events and standing behind each athlete is an expert team of coaches, physiologists, doctors, scientists and technical staff who aided in journey of this success of Indian players. Col. Rathore said Sports Science and Sports medicine is increasingly becoming important as it plays an integral role in improving the performance of the sports persons and also in facilitating rehabilitation and recovery. He said, sports medicine doctors and scientists contribute significantly to athletes' performance as they provide an edge to their talent and skills. He said contribution of Sports Science will become important under the Khelo India Programme launched by his ministry. He said in accordance with the intentions of Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi of empowering youths, 'Khelo



India' programme has been chalked out to tap talent at the school and college level. He said under the Khelo India national school games would be organised from January 31 to February 8 next year for the under 17 age group. These school games will act as a springboard. He said for the first time a sports broadcaster will broadcast live the national school games. Col. Rathore said that the top 1,000 athletes from this event will be entitled to Rs 5 lakh scholarships for eight years. He said that every year, his Ministry will keep adding 1,000 more athletes for creating a pool of young talent. He said School

Games will be followed by College Games for under the age group of 21 years. Sports Minister said, necessary attention would be given to training of coaches as well and athletes would be helped with national and international training. He said his ministry is working to create a Bank of Coaches in different disciplines of Sports. He said a provision is being made to recognise all the coaches in an athlete's career who wins medal at international level. He said a provision has been made so that the amount given to the coaches of national athletes is shared by 20% by the grass root coach and 30% of it would

go to the developmental coaches at academies. The Minister expressed the hope that SAICON 2017 will promote scientific temperament in the country and inspire students, researchers and educationists alike to take up sports science and research to the next level. Organized by Sports Authority of India, the 3-day conference is being attended by about 1000 national and international delegates. Eminent Olympians Shri Gurbax Singh, Dr Paes, V. Bhaskaran, Shri Leander Paes, K. Malleshwari and Shri Yogeshwar Dutt were also present at the inaugural session of the conference.

Virat Kohli grabs second position in ICC Test rankings

Dubai, Dec 7
In Cricket, Indian captain Virat Kohli has moved up three places to grab the second spot in the latest ICC Rankings for Test Batsmen. Kohli rose in the rankings after India drew the Delhi Test against Sri Lanka yesterday and claimed the 3-match series, 1-0. Kohli, who slammed back-to-back double-centuries and recorded three-figure scores in three consecutive matches, had started the series in the sixth spot. He has now surpassed Joe Root, Cheteshwar Pujara, Kane Williamson and David Warner after an exceptional run in the series which saw him average 152.50. Kohli is now just 45 points behind first in the



rankings Australian skipper Steve Smith. The Indian captain is the current No. 1 in ODIs and T20 formats. Root is third behind Smith and Kohli, with Pujara fourth, Williamson fifth and Warner at sixth. Sri Lankan captain Dinesh Chandimal has gained eight places to take the ninth spot.

In the Test Team Rankings, India has lost one point but remains well ahead of South Africa at the top. England is third. In the Rankings for Bowlers, Briton James Anderson is the leader, with South African Kagiso Rabada second. Ravindra Jadeja is third and Ravichandran Ashwin is fourth.
