New Delhi, Jan 8: Indian Railways has decided to deploy drone cameras for various railway activities, especially project monitoring and maintenance of tracks and other railway infrastructure. Ministry of Railways in a statement said it has issued directions to Zonal Railways to procure such cameras.

1 lakh Gram Panchayats linked with broadband

New Delhi, Jan 8: Communication Minister Shri Manoj Sinha today said, in the first phase of Bharat Net, one lakh Gram Panchayats have been linked with high-speed broadband. Addressing a function in New Delhi, he said, the first phase was over last month and in the second phase, 1.5 lakh Gram Panchayats will be connected with the broadband services by March 2019. He said, the scheme will make a significant improvement in the lives of rural people. Mr Sinha said, the project will generate massive employment opportunities both direct and indirect in the country in days to come.

PM asks top police officials to deal with cyber crime on highest priority

TeKanpur (MP), Jan 8: Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi today drew the attention of the country's top police officials to the problems arising out of social media and cyber crimes, saying they should be dealt with on highest priority. Speaking at the concluding day of the annual conference of the DGPs and IGPs here at the BSF Academy, the prime minister said that there was an emerging global consensus towards greater information sharing on illicit financial dealings and India could play a key role in achieving this.



Shri Modi said cyber security issues should be dealt with immediately and should receive highest priority, according to an official release.

In this context, the Prime Minister particularly mentioned the importance of social media. He said messaging should rely on local languages for

greater effectiveness. Referring to the radicalisation of youth, Shri Modi urged the top police officers to use technology to pinpoint the problem

areas. Around 250 top officers from the state police forces and central police organisations participated in the three-day meet. The Prime Minister said India is an "organic entity" and not an "assembled" one and asked the police officers from the states to open up in sharing information on illicit financial dealings. He said while openness is getting increased acceptance worldwide, there is a need for greater openness among states too, on security issues. Shri Modi said security (Contd. on last page)

Saudi Arabia gives green signal to India's proposal to revive sea route for Haj pilgrimage

New Delhi, Jan 8: Minority Affairs Shri Minister Mukhtar Abbas Naqvi has said that Saudi Arabia has given green signal to India's proposal to revive option of Haj pilgrimage through sea route. In a tweet, Shri Naqvi said, it will be a revolutionary, pro-poor, pilgrim-friendly decision. He said, sending Haj pilgrims through ships will help cut down travel expenses significantly. Shri Naqvi said, officials from both countries will discuss all formalities and technicalities so that Haj through sea route can be re-started in coming years. The practice of ferrying Haj pilgrims between Mumbai and Jeddah by waterways was stopped from 1995. Saudi Arabia Haj Minister Dr. Mohamed Bentin and Shri Naqvi, who is on a Saudi Arabia visit, have signed bilateral annual Haj 2018 agreement in Makkah. For the first time, Muslim women from India will go to Haj without Mehram, male companion. He said, separate accommodation and transport have been arranged for these women pilgrims in Saudi Arabia. Women Haj Assistant will be deployed for their assistance.

PR Sreejesh returns to India squad, Sardar Singh ignored again

New Delhi, Jan 8
Goalkeeper PR Sreejesh may feature in his first competitive event in eight months after being named in India's 20-member squad for a four-nation tournament in New Zealand. India will compete with Belgium, Japan and hosts New Zealand at Tauranga and Hamilton in the tournament, beginning January 17. The team will be led by 25-year-old midfielder Manpreet Singh while Chinglensana Singh Kangujam will be his deputy. Sreejesh, who missed some key tournaments in 2017 due to a knee injury, will be joined by young goalkeeper Krishan Bahadur Pathak, a member of the 2016 Junior World Cup-winning team. Pathak was also part of the India A team which participated at the Australian Hockey League in September. While Vivek had played an instrumental role in the midfield, Dilpreet was India's goal-getter



with nine goals in six matches to his credit. India's defence features Rupinder Pal Singh, Harmanpreet Singh, Varun Kumar - all three will double-up as drag-flickers. They will be joined by Birendra Lakra, Surender Kumar and Gurinder Singh in the defence-line. The midfield has skipper Manpreet Singh, Chinglensana Singh, Harjeet Singh, Nilakanta Sharma,

Saha breaks Dhoni's record of most dismissals by an Indian wicketkeeper in a Test

New Delhi, Jan 8
With the catch of South Africa's Morne Morkel off Bhuvneshwar Kumar in the second innings of the first Test at Cape Town, Wriddhiman Saha broke the record of the most dismissals in a Test by an Indian wicketkeeper. It was Saha's 10th catch of the contest as he went past the record of nine dismissals set by former captain MS Dhoni against Australia in Melbourne in December 2014. While Saha's dismissals were all catches, Dhoni's included one stumping. The best of the 33-year-old's 10 dismissals was a sharp catch he took to get rid of Kagiso Rabada in the first innings off the bowling of spinner R Ashwin. Overall, Saha's effort is the joint-second best in the Test history. He joins England's Bob Taylor (vs India, Mumbai 1980) and Australian Adam



Gilchrist (vs New Zealand, Hamilton 2000) who each took 10 catches. Jack Russell of England (vs South Africa, Johannesburg 1995) and

South African AB de Villiers (vs Pakistan, Johannesburg 2013) occupy the top spot with 11 dismissals, all catches, to their name in one Test.

Taylor, Jarvis back in ODI colours for tri-nation series

Brendan Taylor and Kyle Jarvis return to ODI colours for Zimbabwe, for the first time since they went on the Kolpak route, having signed their contracts with Nottinghamshire and Lancashire, in 2015 and 2013 respectively. While the premier all-rounder will lend much needed stability to Zimbabwe's middle order,

Jarvis's ability to move the ball will bring in variety to the attack. Zimbabwe Cricket, who announced their 15-member squad on Sunday (January 7), sent out maiden international call-ups to the 20-year-old legspinner all-rounder Brandon Mavuta and 19-year-old wicketkeeper-batsman Ryan Murray.

On day two, India finished with 209 runs in their first innings, surrendering a 77-run lead. South Africa were 65/2 at stumps with an overall lead of 142 runs. Hardik Pandya single-handedly kept his side in contention with 93 runs off 95 balls and then took 2-17 as well. Day three was completely washed out due to persistent rain.

ICC U-19 World Cup 2018: India ready for challenge in New Zealand

New Delhi, Jan 8
Prithvi Shaw, captain of India's U-19 World Cup team, today said his team has prepared well under the guidance of Rahul Dravid and the goal is to return home with the trophy. The ICC U-19 World Cup officially got underway at the Hagley Oval in Christchurch with an impressive ceremony showcasing New Zealand's culture. Warm-up matches will be held from tomorrow while the

tournament proper gets underway on January 13 with matches spread across seven venues in the cities of Christchurch, Queenstown, Tauranga and Whangarei. "We've been here a week now, played a couple of games. Everything has gone well, the preparation of the team has been good. Our goal is obviously to win the World Cup but at the same time we are looking forward to our first game

(against Australia on January 13), and let's see how the process goes," Shaw said. The ceremony was attended by representatives of all the 16 participating sides, Christchurch Councillor Aaron Keown, as well as New Zealand Cricket President Debbie Hockley, who, on behalf of the ICC and NZC, welcomed the teams to the tournament. The winners will be crowned in Tauranga on February 3.

cannot be achieved selectively, or alone, and for that breaking of silos and information sharing among states can help make everyone more secure. Following a directive of Shri Modi, the home ministry has been organising the conference outside the national capital since the NDA government came to power in 2014. The last three conferences were held in Guwahati, Rann of Kutch and Hyderabad. The Prime Minister recalled how the nature and the scope of the conference has changed since 2014, beginning with its being shifted out of Delhi. He said the new format of the conference has resulted in a marked improvement in the quality of discussions. Modi said that as a result of the discussions in the conference over the last few years, now, once an objective is clearly defined for the police force, there is a lot of cohesion in the execution. He said the range of topics being discussed has also become more broad-based over the last two years.
