



## No limit on cash withdrawal from March 13: Reserve Bank of India

Mumbai, Feb 8  
The Reserve Bank of India has announced all limits on cash withdrawals from Savings Bank Account will be withdrawn from 13th March 2017. Addressing a press conference in Mumbai today, Deputy Governor Shri R Gandhi said that the limit on cash withdrawal from Savings Bank Account will be enhanced to 50,000 rupees from the current 24,000 rupees from 20th February. It may be recalled that in order to further the pace of remonetisation, RBI had announced withdrawal of all limits placed on cash withdrawals from Current, Cash Credit and Overdraft accounts on 30th January while also removing the all limits placed on withdrawal of cash from ATMs. Meanwhile, the RBI Deputy Governor today also informed that currency notes worth 9.92 lakh crore



rupees was back in the system till 27th January. On a question of how much currency has been recovered in the old 500 and 1000 rupee notes, Shri. Gandhi said the apex bank is working on it and will divulge the details as soon as they are available. He said initial counting of notes across 4000 currency chests and 19 offices where RBI stores currency, is almost done. However, the final piece to piece verification of notes will only be possible after the closing of June 30th window for deposit of old

notes and verification of currency received from Nepal and Bhutan. On the issue of emergence of fake currency notes of newly introduced 500 and 2000 rupees denomination, Shri Gandhi said that the design features of new notes are impossible to forge. He said that the fake notes being seen at some places are actually a photocopy of the new notes which everyone can easily detect.

### MP takes up Isles' issues with Lt. Governor

## Over 7.6 lakh citizens receive reward money for embracing Digital Payments

New Delhi, Feb 8  
Over 7.6 lakh citizens has received reward money worth 117 crore rupees in 45 days for embracing Digital Payments. The latest data shows that Maharashtra, Tamil Nadu, Andhra Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh and Karnataka have emerged as top five states with maximum number of winners. In addition to the daily cash

backs to 15,000 consumers, 90 additional consumers and 3,000 merchants have won one lakh rupees and 50,000 lakh rupees each as weekly prize money for adopting digital mode of payments. While majority of the winners are in the age group of 21 to 30 years, the diversity in their age group ranges from 15 to 66 years of age. NITI Ayog said in a statement that the

It said the winners of the two schemes are also seen as belonging to diverse socio-economic backgrounds, from farmers, small entrepreneurs, professionals, housewives to retired persons.

## Encroachment eviction drive PBMC removes extended shops & blockages; creates parking space

The Port Blair Municipal Council in an encroachment eviction drive has removed four extended shops and blockage of circulation area in the Municipal Gunties near SBI Main Branch and two extended shops and blockage of circulation area in the Municipal Gunties near Petrol Pump today. **Favourites India ready for easy 'Bangla Test'**

Hyderabad, Feb 8  
Spoilt for choice with a pool of top quality performers in their ranks, formidable India are overwhelming favourites against minnows Bangladesh in a proverbial 'David vs Goliath' one-off cricket Test that starts here tomorrow. On paper, it is the 'Battle of Unequals' with the world number one taking on the ninth ranked side, but in this game of glorious uncertainties, rankings often go for a toss. For Bangladesh, it is a historic moment as they are playing a Test match on Indian soil for the first time but for the hosts, it will be more about maintaining the momentum they have acquired by winning seven out of the eight matches against comparatively better sides like New Zealand and England. But when it comes to playing the game wearing whites flannels, Bangladesh have not been able to replicate their performances in white ball cricket in which they have been different beasts altogether. That they have managed to lose a match against New

Zealand as recently as last month, after scoring nearly 550 in the first innings, shows that even after 16 years in the five-day circuit, they have not been able to decode the winning formula. The last time India played Bangladesh in a one-off Test at Fatullah, it was the rain God that came to the rescue of the 'Tigers' as their fans affectionately call them. Worse they don't have a bowler of Mustafizur Rahman's calibre in the team, someone who knew this ground well enough. All these statistical nuggets make India runaway favourites, and they would be aiming to close the deal within four days in what could turn out to be a pretty one-sided affair, considering the composition of the teams. The Indian team does have its share of 'happy problems' as they have a number of players

who can walk into the playing XI, but skipper Virat Kohli and coach Anil Kumble will have to tread the tricky path. Comeback man Abhinav Mukund will have to wait unless something happens to two regular openers. While the top four batsmen KL Rahul, Murali Vijay, Cheteshwar Pujara and the captain himself are automatic selections, the tricky part starts post the number four slot. Having achieved the distinction of being only the second Test triple centurion from India, Karun Nair has earned his stripes, but will have to pave the way for Ajinkya Rahane in the playing XI on Thursday. Kohli made it clear in the pre-match press conference that Rahane, at whose expense Nair was picked to play the final Test against England after the former suffered an injury, is their preferred choice.
