The Act recognises six rights of the Consumer viz.

- Right to be protected against marketing of goods which are hazardous to life and property.
- Rights to be informed about the quality, quantity potency, purity, standard and price of goods or service to protect the consumer against unfair trade practices.
- Rights to be assured, wherever possible, access to a variety of goods & service at competitive price.
- Right to be heard and to be assured that Consumer's interest will receive due consideration at appropriate forums.
- Right to seek redressal against unfair trade practices or unscrupulous exploitation of consumers; and
- Right to consumers education.

What relief available to Consumers?

- Removal of defects from the goods.
- Replacement of the goods.
- Refund of the price paid.
- Award of compensation for loss or injury suffered.
- Removal of deficiencies in Services.
- Discontinuance of unfair or restrictive trade practices.
- Withdrawal of the hazardous goods from being offered for sale.

Rotational load shedding in South Andaman
Power supply at Exam Centers to
remain uninterrupted

Port Blair, Mar 8
The general public and electricity consumers of Port Blair and South Andaman have been informed that 01 DG set of 5 MW capacity at IPP Suryachakra Power Plant, Bambooflat suffered major damages due to fire accident on 05.11.2016. As a result, there is shortfall of around 5 MW power during evening peak hours from 1745 hours to 2245 hours.

The Electricity Department has been exercising load shedding during evening peak hours since 05.11.2016 to fill the 5 MW shortage of power. Presently, the collective generation from all the power plants (departmental as well as private) during evening hours is to the tune of 31-32 MW against a peak demand of about 36-37 MW, thereby creating a shortfall around 5 MW. Rotational load shedding of 45 minutes on alternate day basis during evening hours from 1745 hours to 2245 hours is carried out to fulfill the gap in generation.
