## Health Ministry asks officials to carry out aggressive campaigns to end Black Fever

New Delhi, Apr 8  
The Union Health Ministry has asked officials to carry out aggressive campaigns to meet the target of eliminating Kala Azar, also known as Black Fever in endemic districts. Health Minister Shri JP Nadda reviewed national programmes for leprosy and Kala Azar in New Delhi yesterday. In a release, the

Ministry said, Shri Nadda has directed officials to work in close coordination with the states and review the progress made by the states in the next three months. It said, a leprosy case detection drive, which is presently being undertaken in 50 endemic districts of various states, will be expanded to 163 districts. The Ministry said, more than 60,000 new

cases were detected through this aggressive detection drive. Shri Nadda said, an expert committee will be formed under the Chairmanship of Director General, Indian Council of Medical Research which will recommend introduction of Mycobacterium Indicus Pranii (MIP) vaccine in high leprosy endemic states.

## UPSC asked to drop identity certificate provision in Central govt jobs

New Delhi, Apr 8  
The Union Public Service Commission, UPSC has been asked not to insist for identity certificate in attestation form filled up before appointment to central government. In a letter to UPSC, Department of Personnel and Training has asked it to dispense

with the provision in future. After selection by the recruiting agencies the appointing authorities undertake character verification exercise of candidates. The candidate has to fill up an attestation form for verification which includes identity certificate.

The Andaman and Nicobar Administration had constituted a Study Group under the Chairmanship of Lt. Gen. Gautam Banerjee, PVSM, AVSM, YSM (Retd.) to prepare a Development Plan-2030 entailing short-term as well as long-term measures for comprehensive and sustainable development of Andaman and Nicobar Islands. The Study Group has presented the Study Report to Lt. Gen. A. K. Singh PVSM, AVSM, SM, VSM (Retd.), Lieutenant Governor of A & N Islands in a well attended function held in the Andaman Nicobar Bhavan, Chanakyapuri, New Delhi yesterday. Shri A. K. Singla, Secretary (Planning) besides Senior Officers who

earlier served in the Islands were also present in the function. Speaking on the occasion, the Lt. Governor said that Andaman & Nicobar is a very different territory with four centres of Gravity: first is its Strategic Importance due to geopolitical factors; second is the people of A & N Islands, majority of whom have been settled after independence; third is Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups living in these forests since ages; and fourth is Ecology, which has to be sustainably maintained, while ramping up the pace of development. All these four centres of gravity have to live in harmony with each other.



The Lt. Governor apprised that after working for about a year since July 2013, he felt that though A & N Islands was progressing and many development projects like Medical College, Health Insurance, Andaman College, Community College, Chartered flights have come up, still there was a gap of a holistic picture of Development. Thus this study group of eminent specialists was requested to take up this study. It is hoped that this will help in enhancing the pace of a balanced development keeping overall picture in mind and

## No weightage to Class 12th marks in JEE ranking from 2017: HRD Ministry



The Ministry said, all other JEE Examination systems will remain unchanged. In November last year, the Mishra committee had recommended major changes in the JEE structure, including setting up of a National Testing Service to conduct tests for shortlisting about four lakh students for the exam. Its recommendations were aimed at weaning IIT dependence on the aspirants away from the coaching institutes.

Saina seals semifinal spot, Sindhu sinks at Malaysia Open

Ace Indian shuttler Saina Nehwal sealed a semifinal spot after a hard-fought victory but compatriot P.V. Sindhu crumbled under pressure to bow out of the women's singles competition at the Malaysia Open Super Series Premier tournament in Shah Alam on Friday.  
World No. 8 Saina dug deep into her vast experience as she recovered from a game deficit to beat Thailand's Pornpit Buranaprasertsuk 19-21 21-14 21-14 in a 58-minute clash at the quarterfinals stage of the \$550,000 event. Saina had beaten Pornpit seven times in their last eight meetings. The Olympic bronze medalist Indian will next meet Tai Tzu Ying on Saturday. Saina has

a 5-8 record against the Chinese Taipei shuttler, who has beaten the Indian in their last five meetings, including in last month's All England Championship. The experience of beating the World No. 4 Ratchanok Intanon at the Korea Open last year, however, did not quite help Sindhu as she suffered her fourth defeat to the Thai girl in five meetings, going down 7-21 8-21 in 29 minutes. With both the matches happening on adjacent courts, Saina and Sindhu both faced defeats in the opening game. Saina managed a comeback, but 20-year-old Sindhu was out of sorts as she was outplayed by her opponent.  
Saina trailed 3-6 early on and even though she caught up after the break at 14-14, Pornpit managed to get the better of the Indian in the opening game. In the second game, Saina led 11-7 at the interval and then moved into a 20-13 lead, despite a fighting Pornpit narrowing it down to 12-13 at one point. The Indian closed the game comfortably to bounce back into the contest.

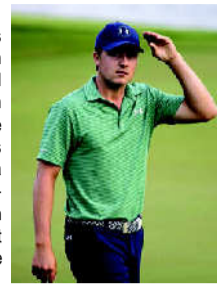

Flawless Jordan Spieth sets early pace at the Masters

Augusta, Apr 8  
Jordan Spieth's love affair with Augusta National continued on Thursday as the reigning Masters champion fired a flawless six-under-par 66 to seize an early three-shot clubhouse lead in the opening round. The American world number two, bidding to become only the fourth player to claim back-to-back Masters victories, took advantage of relatively calm morning conditions to storm to the top of the leaderboard. Shaking off a run of inconsistent form in recent weeks on the PGA Tour, Spieth sank a six-footer at the third, a 13-footer at the sixth and a four-footer at the eighth to reach the turn in three-under 33.



Meanwhile Tottenham Hotspur striker Harry Kane bagged the EPL players of the month award. Ranieri guided his team to three wins and a draw during the month to consolidate their position at the top of the table, where they currently sit seven points clear of Tottenham with six games to play. This is the second time this season that Ranieri, who has also been named Italian coach of the year on the back of Leicester's remarkable season, has won the award. He saw off competition from fellow managers in West Ham United's Slaven Bilic, Swansea City boss Francesco Guidolin and Bournemouth's Eddie Howe.

He further said, 'meghdoot post card', containing customised print, would be despatched to first time voters and for those in low voter turnout areas besides other targeted households in Puducherry, as part of the new initiatives to increase the voter turnout. Emphasising the need for attaching higher importance to create a conducive environment for a peaceful election, Shri Zaidi asked the state and district level officials to reassess the 132 vulnerable hamlets and 19,000 vulnerable persons identified in these locations. All 9.35 lakh voters in Puducherry have been covered under Electors Photo Identity cards (EPICs), Shri Zaidi said.
