



National Surfing Championship 'Little Andaman Pro 2026' to begin today at Butler Bay Beach

Little Andaman, Apr. 8
 The Department of Tourism, Andaman & Nicobar Administration, in association with the Surfing Federation of India, is set to host the national-level surfing championship 'Little Andaman Pro 2026' for the very first time in the islands. Scheduled from April 9 to 12, the four-day championship will take place at the picturesque Butler Bay Beach, marking a significant step forward for water sports and adventure tourism in the region.



Presented by Andaman & Nicobar Tourism, the championship will bring together some of India's top-ranked surfers and stand-up paddle (SUP) athletes competing in the Senior Division across Surfing and Stand-Up Paddle disciplines.

86 surfers, including international competitors, who will compete across multiple categories such as Men's Open Surfing Shortboard, Women's Open Surfing Shortboard, Men's Open Stand-Up Paddleboard (SUP), and Women's Open Stand-Up Paddleboard (SUP). With the hosting of Little Andaman Pro

2026, the Andaman and Nicobar Islands are poised to script a new chapter in adventure tourism and ocean sports, firmly establishing Little Andaman as an emerging surfing destination in India. The championship represents an important step in expanding India's competitive surfing circuit. By

introducing athletes to new and technically challenging wave environments, the event provides valuable exposure beyond the typical beach breaks of mainland India. Events of this scale play a vital role in strengthening the national surfing talent pipeline by offering athletes the experience and competitive

Little Andaman Pro 2026 Signals Rise of Andaman and Nicobar Islands as India's Next Surfing Hub

The Andaman & Nicobar group of Islands are fast emerging as India's next major surfing destination, with Andaman & Nicobar Tourism taking a decisive step in promoting the sport by hosting the first-ever national surfing and stand-up paddling championship in the region, the Little Andaman Pro 2026.



Organised by the Surfing Federation of India (SFI) and fully supported by Andaman Tourism, the championship, scheduled from April 9-12 at Butler Bay, marks a significant milestone in the expansion of India's surfing map beyond traditional coastline locations. Known for its pristine coastline, coral reefs and consistent swell patterns, Little Andaman offers ideal

conditions for high-performance surfing. The reef break at Butler Bay, in particular, is increasingly being recognised as one of the most promising surf locations in the country, capable of hosting top-level competitions and attracting surfers from across India and beyond. The initiative is expected to not only elevate the standard of competitive surfing in India but also provide a

major boost to tourism in the islands by positioning Andaman as a premier destination for ocean sports and adventure travel. The move reflects a growing emphasis on leveraging sports as a driver for tourism, with destinations increasingly investing in niche sporting events to attract new audiences and create unique travel experiences. Mr. Arun Vasu,

President, Surfing Federation of India, highlighted the importance of expanding the sport into new geographies, saying, "The introduction of a national championship in Little Andaman is a big step forward for Indian surfing. Competing in reef break conditions like Butler Bay gives our athletes exposure to

South Andaman faces water stress; Public cooperation appreciated and further conservation urged

The A&N Administration sincerely appreciates the residents of South Andaman for their continued support and responsible approach towards the judicious use of water, particularly in light of declining water levels across major sources, including the Dhanikhari Dam.

The current situation has arisen due to significantly reduced rainfall recorded at Dhanikhari over the past year, resulting in a substantial decline in water availability. The rainfall data clearly indicates a concerning trend of inadequate precipitation, especially the North-East Monsoon of last year, which has directly impacted reservoir levels.

wastage observed in the water supply system. Timely reporting will enable authorities to take swift corrective measures and prevent unnecessary loss of this vital resource. The Administration reiterates that conserving water at this critical juncture is essential to ensure equitable distribution and sustained supply for all residents. Continued public cooperation will be key to overcoming the present challenge and safeguarding water resources for the future, a press release from APWD said.

District Administration (SA) evicts unauthorized encroachment and restores Govt. land at Garacharma village

In its continued efforts to safeguard Government land from illegal occupation, the Revenue Department of South Andaman carried out a focused eviction operation today at Naushad Colony, Bathubasti under Garacharma village.

During the inspection, fresh unauthorized encroachments in the form of 2 temporary structures and 1 No. of fencing were identified over Government land. Acting promptly, the team mobilized necessary manpower and earth-moving machinery, including a Hitachi unit, to carry out the clearance operation. As a result of the drive, an area measuring



approximately 500 Sq. mtrs was successfully cleared and restored to the Government khata. The eviction was carried out in a peaceful and orderly manner, ensuring that the land was freed from encroachment and brought back under the official revenue record. The District Administration, South

NSCBPTI conducts comprehensive oil spill response training in collaboration with Indian Coast Guard

Objections and suggestion are invited from the Stakeholders/Persons to be affected thereby. The objection and suggestions (if any) should reach the office of Andaman & Nicobar College (ANCOL), Sri Vijaya Puram, within 30 days from the date of its publication for consideration :-

1. Short Title and Commencement:-

i. These rules may be called the Andaman and Nicobar Administration Group 'A' Gazetted, Non-Ministerial post of **College Librarian** Recruitment Rules, 2025.
ii. They shall come into force on the date of their publication in the official Gazette.

2. Application:-

These rules shall apply to the post specified in Column (1) of the Schedule annexed to these rules.

3. Number of posts, Classification and Scale of Pay:-

The number of posts, its classification and the Level of Pay/Pay scale attached thereto shall be as specified in para 2 to 4 of the Schedule annexed to these rules.

4. Methods of Requirement, Age Limit and Qualification:-

The methods of requirement, age limit, qualifications and other matters to the said posts shall be as specified in paras 5 to 13 of the said schedule annexed to these rules.

5. Disqualification:-

No persons-

- a. Who has entered into or contracted a marriage with a person having a spouse living, or
- b. Who having spouse living, has entered into or contracted a marriage With any person; shall be eligible for appointment to the said posts:

Provided that the Lieutenant Governor (Administrator) of Andaman and Nicobar Islands, may, if satisfied that such marriage is permissible under any personal law applicable to such person and the other party to the marriage, and there are other grounds for so doing, exempt any person from the operation of these Rules.

6. Power to Relax:-

Where the Lieutenant Governor (Administrator), Andaman and Nicobar Islands, is of the opinion that it is necessary or expedient so to do, he may, by order, for reasons to be recorded in writing, and in consultation with the UPSC, relax any of the provision of these rules with respect to any class or category of persons.

7. Savings:-

Nothing in these rules shall effect reservation, relaxation of age limit and other concessions required to be provided for the Scheduled Caste/Schedule Tribes, Ex- Servicemen and other specified categories of persons in accordance with the orders issued by the Central Government from time to time in this regard.

Sri Vijaya Puram, dated the 6th April, 2026.
No.70/2026/ F/No.2-116/2026-Rev.— In exercise of the power conferred under Rule 8(ii) of the Census Rules, 1990, read with Government of India, Ministry of Home Affairs Letter No. 9/3/2026-CD (Cen.)1, dated 12.03.2026, the Lieutenant Governor (Administrator), Andaman and Nicobar Islands appeals the general public of Union Territory of Andaman and Nicobar Islands to cooperate in furnishing accurate and unambiguous information in respect of the questions that may be put to them during census, failing which they shall be punishable with penalties prescribed under Section 11 of the Census Act, 1948 :

(i) The Census is the primary source of data up to the lowest administrative units, i.e. villages in rural areas and town / wards in urban areas on Housing Condition; Amenities & Assets, Demography, Literacy, Religion, Economic Activity, Migration, Fertility etc. It is widely used for planning and formulation of policies and effective Public Administration by the Central / State / UT Governments. Apart from this, Census data are used for delimitation and reservation of Constituencies for Parliamentary, Assembly, Panchayats and other Local Bodies. Thus, the public are to cooperate in census taking and provide the correct information. Some of the important provisions in the Census Act, 1948 are reproduced below for information of the public.

(ii) Section 8:- Asking of question and obligation to answer :

(1) A Census-Officer may ask all such questions of all persons within the limits of the local area for which he is appointed as, by instructions issued in this behalf by the Central Government and published in the Official Gazette, he may be directed to ask.
(2) Every person of whom any question is asked under Sub-section (1) shall be legally bound to answer such question to the best of his knowledge or belief.

Provided that no person shall be bound to state the name of any female member of his household, and no woman shall be bound to state the name of her husband or deceased husband or of any other person whose name she is forbidden by custom to mention.

(iii) Section 9:- Occupier to permit access and affixing of numbers :

Every person occupying any house, enclosure, vessel or other place shall allow Census-Officers such access thereto as they may require for the purposes of the Census and as, having regard to the customs of the Country, may be reasonable, and shall allow them to paint on, or affix to, the place such letters, marks or numbers as may be necessary for the purposes of the census.

(iv) Section 10:- Occupier or manager to fill up schedule :

(1) Subject to such orders as the Census Commissioner may issue in this behalf, a Census-Officer may, within the local area for which he is appointed, leave or cause to be left a schedule at any dwelling-house or with the manager or any officer of any commercial or industrial establishment, for the purpose of its being filled up by the occupiers of such house or of any specified part thereof or by such manager or officer with such particulars as the Census Commissioner may direct regarding the inmates of such house or part thereof, or the persons employed under such manager or officer, as the case may be, at the time of the taking of the census.
(2) When such schedule has been so left, the said occupier, manager or officer, as the case may be, shall fill it up or cause it to be filled up to the best of his knowledge or belief so far as regards the inmates of such house or part thereof or the person employed under him, as the case may be, at the time aforesaid, and shall sign his name thereto and, when so required, shall deliver the schedule so filled up and signed to the Census-Officer or to such person as the Census-Officer may direct.

(v) Section 11:- Penalties

(1) –(a) Any Census-Officer or any person lawfully required to give assistance towards the taking of census who refuse to perform any duty imposed upon him by this Act or any rule made thereunder, or any person who hinders or obstructs another person in performing any such duty, or
(aa) any Census-Officer or any person lawfully required to give assistance towards the taking of a census who neglects to use reasonable diligence in performing any duty imposed upon him or in obeying any order issued to him in accordance with this Act or any rule made thereunder, or any person who hinders or obstructs another person in performing any such duty or obeying any such order, or;
(d) any person who intentionally gives a false answer to, or refuse to answer to the best of his knowledge or belief, any question asked of him by Census-Officer which he is legally bound by Section 8 to answer, or
(e) any person occupying any house, enclosure, vessel or other place who refuses to allow a Census-Officer such reasonable access thereto as he is required by Section 9 to allow, or
(f) any person who removes, obliterates, alters, or damages any letter, marks or numbers which have been painted or affixed for the purpose of the census, or
(g) any person who, having been required under Section 10 to fill up a schedule, knowingly and without sufficient cause fails to comply with the provisions of that Section, or makes any false return there under, or
(h) any person who trespasses into a census office, shall be punishable with fine which may extend to one thousand rupees and in case of a conviction under part(a) shall also be punishable with imprisonment which may extend to three years.
(2) Whoever abets any offence under Sub-section (1) shall be punishable with fine which may extend to one thousand rupees.

(vi) Section 15:- Records of census not open to inspection nor admissible in evidence :

No person shall have a right to inspect any book, register or record made by Census-Officer in the discharge of his duty as such, or any schedule delivered under Section 10, and not withstanding anything to the contrary in the Bharatiya Sakshya Adhiniyam, 2023 (47 of 2023), no entry in any such book, register, record or schedule shall be admissible as evidence in any civil proceeding whatsoever or in any criminal proceeding other than an prosecution under this Act or any other law for any act or omission which constitutes an offence under this Act.
