## India proposes Joint Task Force on extension of India-Myanmar-Thailand trilateral highways

Laos, Sep 8  
India has proposed a joint task force on connectivity in India-ASEAN Region to work on extension of India-Myanmar-Thailand trilateral highways to Cambodia, Laos and Vietnam. This was announced by Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi during the 14th ASEAN-India Summit at Vientiane, Laos this morning. He also announced to enhance the ASEAN-India fund with an additional grant of 50 million US dollars in the area of Science & Technology. He said India is willing to march with ASEAN to fulfill promise

and potential of strategic engagement. Earlier, in his opening address at the summit, the Prime Minister said that India-ASEAN relations are driven by common priorities, bringing peace, stability and prosperity to the region. He said enhancing connectivity is central to this partnership which is driven by linking our economic success and development experiences. He said India is committed to ASEAN connectivity master plan. Expressing deep concern over terrorism, Shri Modi said export of terror, growing radicalization and spread of extreme violence



are common security threats to our societies. He also announced hosting a commemorative summit on shared values, common destiny next year. Shri Modi and leaders of 10 ASEAN nations participated in the summit. On the sidelines of

ASEAN-India Summit Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi today had bilateral meeting with South Korean President Mr Park Guen-Hye. Two

leaders reviewed bilateral relations which were upgraded to special strategic partnership last year during Shri Modi's visit to South Korea. (Contd. on last page)

## India free from Yaws, Maternal & Neonatal Tetanus, WHO certifies

New Delhi, Sept 8  
India yesterday received certificates from World Health Organisation, recognizing the elimination of Yaws and Maternal and Neonatal Tetanus (MNT) from the country. Union Health Minister Shri J P Nadda in a tweet informed that India received WHO's certificates for MNT & Yaws-free India at 69th session of Regional Committee of WHO at, Colombo.

Margaret Chan and its Director General Poonam Khetrpal Singh. In May this year, WHO had declared India yaws-free after a team of experts verified interruption of disease transmission in the country.

India is the first country under the 2012 WHO neglected tropical diseases (NTD) roadmap to eliminate yaws, a disease known to affect the most underserved population. India had eliminated maternal and neonatal tetanus. (Contd. on last page)

## Evolve action plans to curb alcoholism, drugs abuse: Centre to states

New Delhi, Sep 8  
Centre has asked the state governments to evolve action plans to curb alcoholism and drugs abuse in a range of settings, especially in schools and colleges. The action plan will evolve and strengthen appropriate model for prevention of alcoholism, drug and substance abuse, treatment and rehabilitation of drug dependent individuals in schools, families,

workplaces, communities, health and social services and prisons. The Social Justice Ministry said in an advisory to the states to set up an inter-departmental group under the Chief Secretary to ensure coordination between agencies responsible for ensuring reduction in drug supply and demand reduction activities. The advisory also emphasized on increasing community participation and public cooperation

in reduction of demand for dependence-producing substances.

## Travel by any airlines to J&K on LTC

New Delhi, Sep 8  
Government has decided to extend the facility to travel by any airlines to Jammu and Kashmir on Leave Travel Concession (LTC) to boost the tourism in the state. Under special dispensation scheme for central government employees, this facility is extended for a period of two years beyond 25th of this month.

## ISRO successfully launches advanced weather satellite INSAT-3DR

Sriharikota, Sept. 8  
ISRO successfully launched advanced weather satellite INSAT-3DR today. ISRO's GSLV-F05 carrying INSAT-3DR lifted off from Sriharikota at 4:40 pm on Thursday. INSAT 3DR will maintain continuity in the weather forecasting-related services of its predecessors and a variety of other meteorological functions. The weather satellite have an advanced imager, a

sounder and transponders for data relay and search and rescue missions. Its operational life is planned to be ten years. INSAT 3DR will maintain continuity in the weather forecasting related services of its predecessors and a variety of other meteorological functions. ISRO says the satellite has the ability to provide information on estimated rainfall, sea and land surface temperature, snow



cover and cloud movement from 36000 kilometer height several times a day covering entire landmass of India and its neighborhood including remote and uninhabited areas.

Summer Paralympic Games 2016

kick off in Rio

Rio de Janeiro, Sep 8  
Summer Paralympic Games 2016 kicked off in the Brazilian city of Rio de Janeiro late last night with a colorful opening ceremony at the Maracana stadium. The rhythms of samba singers set the atmosphere in front of a packed stadium. The samba beats were followed by a giant projection of Brazil's Paralympic swimmer Daniel Dias, and a carnivalesque reproduction of a Rio beach scene. The world's most competitive differently-abled also paraded ahead of 11 days of contests. International Paralympic Committee President Philip Craven said, these are going to be the people's Games. He said, over 4,300 athletes from 159 countries plus members of the international refugee team were taking part in the games. Mr Craven said, the Paralympics, which will be broadcast in 154 countries, had the power to change the way people around the world

think about the differently-abled. India is fielding its largest-ever contingent of 19 athletes who will feature in 10 disciplines. The Sports Ministry has

announced that the Gold medalist Paralympians will be awarded 75 lakh rupees. Silver medalists will get 50 lakh rupees and bronze medalists 30 lakhs.

Stanislas Wawrinka enters semifinals of US Open



New York, Sept 8  
In US Open men's singles event, Swiss third seed Stan Wawrinka outlasted tiring former champion Juan Martin del Potro in four sets to advance to the semi-finals. Twice grand slam winner Wawrinka ended the rousing comeback effort by the Argentine with a 7-6, 4-6, 6-3,

6-2 win to close out Day 10 at the year's last grand slam. Wawrinka will next meet sixth seed Kei Nishikori of Japan who upset world number two Andy Murray in five sets in their quarter-final. Other men's semi-final will pit world number one Novak Djokovic against French 10th seed Gael Monfils.

Ajay Jayaram outmuscles Kashyap to reach Indonesia Open third round

Balikpapan, Sept 8  
Ace Indian shuttler Ajay Jayaram trounced compatriot Parupalli Kashyap in straight games to progress through to the third round of the Indonesia Grand Prix Gold here on Wednesday. Third seed Jayaram displayed a superior performance as he overcame Kashyap 21-7, 21-12 in a lopsided men's singles contest that lasted just 27 minutes Kashyap, whose Rio

Olympics dream was derailed by a string of injuries, was playing in his first competitive tournament since March when he suffered a knee injury at German Open. The Jayaram will next face local favourite Reksy Aureza Megananda for a place in the quarterfinals later in the day. HS Prannoy, the 2014 champion, was also imperious in his second round victory over Joo Ven Soong.

US swimmer Ryan Lochte banned for 10 months

DoT unveils new norms on SIM upgradation



New Delhi, Sept 8  
The Department of Telecom, DoT has come out with new guidelines on SIM upgradation from 2G to 3G or 4G. It can be done only with a clear go-ahead from mobile users and on their request. The new guidelines have already come into effect. To upgrade the SIM card, the subscriber will have to generate a request through customer care or online or point of sale of the company.

Once the request is received, the operator will issue a new SIM card to the subscriber. The new norms will put an end to automatic upgradation of SIM to allow high-value service by some operators. On receiving affirmative confirmation from the subscriber, the operator may initiate the process of deactivation of the old SIM card and activation of the new one.
