Scientists from BARC evaluating potential locations for Small Modular Reactors to meet archipelago's rapidly growing power requirements

Scientists from the Bhabha Atomic Research Centre (BARC) have begun assessing potential sites for Small Modular Reactors (SMRs) across the Andaman and Nicobar Islands. This move could strengthen the archipelago's energy resilience as India expands strategic and civilian infrastructure near the Strait of Malacca.

A team from the Department of Atomic Energy is on visit to the islands from September 4 to 8 to assess potential sites across all three districts. The exercise follows a recommendation to explore SMRs to meet



the archipelago's rapidly growing power requirements. Electricity demand is expected to rise sharply as major infrastructure projects take shape, including the International Container T r a n s h i p m e n t

Terminal, a greenfield airport and deep-water multipurpose ports.

The BARC team has also briefed Admiral D.K. Joshi, PVSM, AVSM, YSM, NM, VSM (Retd.), Hon'ble Lieutenant Governor, A&N Islands & Vice

Chairman, Islands Development Agency on potential sites and other features of the proposed SMR plan.

The proposed SMR sites assume added significance against the backdrop of the Great Nicobar Project, one of

India's most strategically important infrastructure initiatives in the region. The project envisages an International Container T r a n s h i p m e n t Terminal at Galathea Bay, a greenfield international airport, a township and associated power infrastructure. The Government has described the project as having strategic, defence and national-security significance.

The project is also aimed at strengthening India's presence in the Andaman Sea and Southeast Asia while establishing a major maritime hub close to

Aarogya Setu 2.0: empowering citizens with secure, consent-based digital health services

Sri Vijaya Puram, Sept. 8
Aarogya Setu 2.0, launched by the Union Minister for Health & Family Welfare, Govt. of India on 29th June, 2026, is an important Personal Health Record (PHR) application available under the Ayushman Bharat Digital Mission (ABDM), bringing together a range of digital health services to make healthcare information and services more accessible and convenient for citizens.

Aarogya Setu 2.0 is a digital health application that helps citizens create and manage their ABHA (Ayushman Bharat Health Account) and securely access their



digital health records. It provides consent-based sharing of health information, allowing users to control who can access their records. The app also uses AI and OCR technology to digitise paper-based medical documents and convert them into structured digital records. Other features include Smart Reports, Scan & Register for healthcare facilities, Scan & Pay,

appointment booking, teleconsultation, health and wellness tracking, healthcare facility discovery, PM-JAY information, family health management, blood availability, and AI-based health insights. It works as a citizen-facing platform within the Ayushman Bharat Digital Mission (ABDM), making healthcare information and services more accessible, organised,

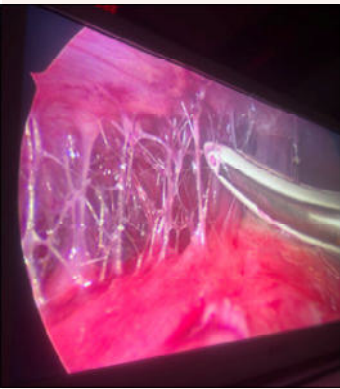
and digitally connected.

Under ABDM, the Ayushman Bharat Health Account (ABHA)/Health ID, provides citizens with a unique digital health identity. This enables secure access to personal health records and facilitates their seamless sharing across healthcare facilities, strictly based on patient consent.

The Scan and Share facility available through the Aarogya Setu 2.0 PHR application enables citizens to scan the QR code displayed at participating healthcare facilities and share their ABHA details, with patient consent, for

Major minimally invasive lung surgery successfully performed on 15-month-old child at GB Pant Hospital



Sri Vijaya Puram, Sept. 8
In a significant achievement in paediatric surgical care in the Islands, a 1-year-3-month-old girl successfully underwent a major minimally invasive lung surgery at GB Pant Hospital, Sri Vijaya Puram.

The child had been suffering from recurrent lung

infections and pneumonia since the age of eight months, including an episode requiring nearly six weeks of hospitalisation and intravenous antibiotics under the Paediatric team. During her recent illness, a Paediatric Surgical consultation was sought. A CT scan of the chest revealed a rare

congenital lung abnormality called Congenital Cystic Airway Malformation (CCAM/CPAM). The child underwent a thoracoscopic-assisted right upper lobectomy, a technically challenging procedure in such a young child, in which the affected portion of the lung was removed through minimally

invasive techniques. The three-hour surgery was performed by Professor Dr. Saji Vargheese, Minimal Access and Paediatric Surgeon, and Dr. Anis Akharkhavi, Paediatric Surgeon, along with their surgical team.

Applications invited for allocation of 4 MBBS seats from Central Pool for spouse & children of civilian victims of terrorism

All concerned have been informed that as per the communication received from the Under Secretary to the Govt. of India, Ministry of Home Affairs, CTCR Division, New Delhi, the following 4 (four) MBBS seats has been earmarked from the Central Pool for spouse and children of terrorist victims in the following medical colleges/institutes for nomination for the academic year 2026-27:-

The Ministry further informed that the following order of priority has been prescribed for allocation of aforesaid MBBS seats to the spouse or children of Civilian Victims of Terrorism :-
(a) Priority-I: Children whose both parents have been killed by terrorists.
(b) Priority-II: Children of families whose sole bread earners has been killed by terrorists.

(c) Priority-III: Wards of victims with permanent disability and serious injury caused by terrorist operations. The Eligibility Criteria is as under:-
(i) C a n d i d a t e must either be spouse or children of the deceased/disabled civilian victim of terrorism.
(ii) He/She has completed 17 years of age at the time of admission or will

complete the age on or before 31st December of the year of his/her admission to the first year of the Undergraduate Medical Course and is an Indian National.
(iii) Educational Qualification :
As per Graduate Medical Education Regulation of National Medical Commission, the candidate must have passed in subjects

of Physics, Chemistry, Biology/Bio-Technology and English individually and must have obtained a minimum of 50% marks for Unreserved & Gen-EWS category; 40% marks for SC/ST/OBC category. For person with disabilities (PwD) - 45% marks for Unreserved & Gen-EWS category; 40% marks for SC/ST/OBC category, taken together in Physics, Chemistry, Biology/Biotechnology at the qualifying examination.

(iv) Qualifying percentile in NEET (UG)- 2026 :

As per Graduate Medical Education Regulation of National Medical Commission, it shall be necessary for the candidates to obtain minimum 50th percentile for Unreserved & Gen-EWS category, 40th percentile for SC/ST/OBC category. For person with disabilities (PwD) - 45th percentile for Unreserved & Gen-EWS category; 40th percentile for SC/ST/OBC category. The percentile shall be determined on the basis of highest marks secured in the All India common merit list in National Eligibility cum Entrance Test for admission of MBBS/BDS courses.

Accordingly, application in the prescribed format (Annexure-I), in duplicate enclosing all necessary documents are invited from interested/eligible candidates for allocation of said MBBS seats earmarked from the Central Pool for spouse and children of Civilian Victims of Terrorism.

The duly filed-in application enclosing all necessary documents including the documentary evidence of Civilian Victims of Terrorism may be submitted in person to the Development-IV Section, Secretariat, Sri Vijaya Puram on or before 11th September, 2026 upto 3.00 pm positively. Incomplete application summarily be rejected.

No application will be entertained or accepted after the expiry of the stipulated date and time as specified above, a press release received from Deputy Secretary (Hr Edn) said.

key international shipping routes.

Its location gives the project significance beyond trade and connectivity. It has said that a strong and permanent defence presence on the island would help India monitor and secure maritime routes. The Strait of Malacca is central to this strategy. A major maritime chokepoint, it carries substantial volumes of global trade and energy supplies between the Indian Ocean and the Pacific. Dr. Narayan, HOD Anaesthesia, Dr. Ramya Naidu, Anaesthesiologist, and their team. Following surgery, the child was closely monitored in the Surgical ICU with support from the Paediatric and Paediatric Intensive Care teams. The child made an excellent recovery and was discharged home in stable condition on the seventh postoperative day.

CCAM/CPAM is a rare congenital condition that can lead to repeated infections and pneumonia in children and may require surgical removal of the affected lung segment or lobe.

The successful treatment of this complex case highlights the availability of specialised Paediatric and Minimal Access Surgical expertise and advanced surgical, anaesthesia and intensive care facilities at GB Pant Hospital. It also demonstrates that even complex paediatric surgical conditions can be successfully managed within the Islands, reducing the need for families to travel to mainland India for treatment.
