Solid Waste Management key in creating 'Smart Cities'

Hudrabad, Oct 9
Smart leadership with clarity, vision and courage is needed for transforming cities in the country into Smart Cities, Union Minister for Urban Development Shri M. Venkaiah Naidu said on Friday. Participating in an international symposium on Municipal Solid Waste Management organised by the Confederation of Indian Industry here, Shri Naidu said that the local bodies should look at raising their revenues without squeezing the citizens

in the name of taxes. Those at the helm of affairs at the local bodies should take the lead in ushering in changes. "An ideal Municipal Commissioner is one who hits the roads in the morning to monitor works and the same applies for Deputy Commissioners and others," he suggested. Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi was keen on involvement of citizens in Swachh Bharat campaign and the drive was turning into a people's movement, he said. "Cleanliness and hygiene

should become part of our lives and it is encouraging to see the involvement of all," he said. Appropriate handling of municipal solid waste was a key component of Swachh Bharat mission and the need was to identify and adopt sustainable practises. Shri Naidu said that proposals on waste to compost and waste to energy were being worked out and the Union Government was even contemplating proposals on recycling of construction debris.

New Delhi, Oct 9

In a significant initiative, the Ministry of Urban Development has stopped physical printing of Government of India's Gazette Notifications and introduced e-publishing of the same, putting an end to the long wait for the important documents. This shift to e-publishing came at the behest of Minister of Urban Development Shri M.Venkaiah Naidu from the

first of this month.

Gazette Notification is an important legal requirement to validate, authenticate and to make effective various kinds of Laws, Acts, Rules, Orders and Government decisions. All user groups had to wait for a few months for copies of such notifications as physical printing of the same was a time taking exercise. The Ministries and Departments of

government used to submit their Gazette publication requirements to the Government Printing Presses where the work of type setting, printing and publishing was undertaken. Hard copies were then made available for sale for usage by all government and private users.

Seeking to end such delays, Ministry of Urban Development has directed the Department of Publication to

stop physical printing and switch over to e-publishing of all Gazette Notifications on its official website <http://www.egazette.nic.in> within five days of receipt of the same from respective Ministries and Departments. The records for the gazette will be maintained by the Department for all future references.

Norwegian Nobel Committee said in Oslo that the prize was awarded to the Tunisian National Dialogue Quartet for its decisive contribution to the building of a pluralistic democracy in Tunisia in the wake of the Jasmine Revolution of 2011. There were 273 nominees for the Peace Prize of which 205 were people and 68 organisations.

The Ld. Additional Sessions Judge Asis Kumar Sikhdar has convicted accused C. Edumban on Sept. 29, 2015 for murdering a minor boy namely Alagusundaram and he was sent to judicial custody for reflection of his mind for hearing of the point of sentence to be imposed upon him on Sept. 30.

The accused C. Edumban was produced from judicial custody on Sept. 30 and after hearing him about the imposition of sentence, Ld. Additional Sessions Judge has sentenced him to suffer rigorous imprisonment for life and to pay fine of Rs.10,000/- in default of payment of fine he has to suffer rigorous

imprisonment for further period of 2 yrs, a communication from the Public Prosecutor said.

Sania and Martina enter
China Open doubles final

Indian tennis ace Sania Mirza and her Swiss partner Martina Hingis are just a win away from clinching their eighth title of the season as the duo entered the final of the women's doubles event of the China Open here today.

The top seeded Indo-Swiss pair recorded an easy 6-2 6-3 victory over the wild card Chinese duo of Chen Liang and Yafan Wang in the semifinal match, which lasted one hour and six minutes.

Sania and Hingis, who have just won the Wuhan Open, outplayed their less fancied opponents in all departments of the game. They broke the opponents' service five times in the match — four in the first set and one in the second. They now await the result of the other semifinal match between the duo of Casey Dellacqua of Australia and Yaroslava



Shvedova of Kazakhstan and Chinese Taipei pair of Hao-Ching Chan and Yung-Jan Chan. The Indo-Swiss combination has bagged seven women's doubles titles this year so far, including two Grand Slams — Wimbledon and the US Open — since they started playing together in March. Their WTA titles together this

year include Indian Wells, Miami, Charleston, Guangzhou and Wuhan. They won their last three tournaments without dropping a single set.

Nadal outlasts
Sock to reach China
Open semis

Beijing, Oct 9
Rafael Nadal reached his first hard-court semifinal of the year by outlasting Jack Sock of the United States 3-6, 6-4, 6-3 at the China Open on Friday. The third-seeded Spaniard had lost before the semifinals in seven previous hard-court tournaments in what has been a disappointing season. His last title on hard courts came in Doha, Qatar, in January 2014. Nadal was more consistent than his American opponent, making 25 unforced errors to Sock's 35. After dropping serve twice in the opening set, he only faced one more break point, which he saved.

opening 2018 World
Cup qualifier

Santiago, Oct 9
Eduardo Vargas and Alexis Sanchez scored second-half goals as Chile overcame Brazil 2-0 in their opening 2018 World Cup qualifier. Vargas struck in the 72nd minute with a first-time volley that slipped through the hands of goalkeeper Jefferson after Mauricio Isla's free-kick on Thursday, reported Xinhua. Sanchez then put the result beyond doubt at the Estadio Nacional stadium by playing a one-two with Arturo Vidal and drawing Jefferson off his line before firing into an unguarded net. "It's an important step because Brazil have a great record against us in World Cup qualifiers," Chile coach Jorge Sampaoli said.

Under the provisions of the Information Technology Act, 2000, downloaded and printed Gazette copies are sufficient for all official and legal purposes. e-publishing assumes importance since many Gazette Notifications pertain to projects of national interest including matters related to land acquisition. Quick availability of the same enables early start for further processes.

Besides substantial saving in time, e-publishing does away with the need for printing about 3.50 pages of such notifications every year leading to a saving of publication cost of Rs.40 cr per year being incurred on 90 tonnes of paper besides power, chemicals, color, dyes etc and as such is a major environment friendly initiative. The Government of India Printing Presses are under the administrative control of the Ministry of Urban Development.
