PM announces scrapping of currency notes of Rs 500, 1000 denomination

New Delhi, Nov 8
1,000 and 500 rupee notes will cease to be legal tender from midnight tonight and those who are in possession of these notes can deposit the notes in their accounts in banks and post offices from 10th of this month to 30th of December this year. In a special nationwide televised address this evening in New Delhi, Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi said, those who are unable to deposit the notes within the deadline for some reasons,

can change them till 31st of March next year by furnishing ID proof. He said, new currency notes of 500 and 2000 rupees denomination notes to be introduced. He said, RBI has decided to limit the notes with higher value. Shri Modi said, ATMs will not work for next 48 hours and thereafter amounts upto 2 thousand rupees can be withdrawn from ATMs. He said, during this period, old notes of 500 and 1000 denominations will be accepted in Government hospitals for the time

being. He said, banks will be closed tomorrow. Petrol Pumps, CNG Stations, Milk Booth, Consumer Cooperative stores and crematoriums will accept old notes in the next 72 hours. Railway booking counters, ticket counters of Government Buses and airline ticket counters will also accept the old notes for the next 72 hours. Shri Modi said, his government has waged a war against corruption. He said, corruption, fake

Mahatma Gandhi's grandson Kanu Gandhi dies at 87

Surat, Nov 8

Kanu Ramdas Gandhi, grandson of Mahatma Gandhi and a former NASA scientist, passed away in Surat, Gujarat yesterday evening. He was 87. Ailing since the past few weeks, Kanu Gandhi was admitted to a private hospital in Surat after he suffered a heart attack and brain haemorrhage which had left him paralysed. Kanu Gandhi returned to

India in 2014 after a four-decade long stay in the US, where he had worked with NASA for 25 years. He is survived by his wife Shivalaxmi who was a professor and researcher in Boston Biomedical Research Institute. President Shri Pranab Mukherjee and Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi have condoled the death of Kanu Gandhi.

Indian wushu team win 5 medals in 8th Sanda World Cup

Xian, China, Nov 8
India wushu team has bagged an impressive five medals, including four silver and one bronze, in the eighth Sanda World Cup held at Xian, China. The event that ended yesterday witnessed participation from 80 best Sanda players of 13th World Wushu Championship 2015. India were represented by five players. Arjuna Awardee and world silver medalist Y Sanathoi Devi won the silver for India in 52kg category after



losing to China's Luan Zhang. The other silver medallist for India were Uchit Sharma in the 52kg, Suraya Bhanu Pratap Singh in 60kg and Monika in 56kg categories. Pooja Kadian in 75kg category secured the lone bronze medal.

Vijender to defend WBO Asia Pacific title on December 17

New Delhi, Nov 8
Indian boxing star Vijender Singh will defend his WBO Asia Pacific super middleweight title on December 17 on home turf but the opponent for the clash will be decided later. "Vijender will be seen defending his WBO Asia Pacific Super Middleweight Champion title on 17th December 2016, at the Thyagaraj Stadium, New Delhi," Vijender's India promoters Infinity Optimal Solutions said in a release. The fight night will also see top

Indian boxers, including Akhil Kumar and Jitender Kumar, make their pro-boxing debut. The names of these boxers and their international opponents would be revealed soon. Till date, Vijender has a record of 7 out of 7 wins with 6 knockouts in 27 rounds. The Haryana-dasher had won the title in front of delirious home fans in the capital. Commenting on his next fight, Vijender said, "I have been in Manchester, UK for the last two

months, training hard for my next fight. My trainer has been giving me high intensity training sessions, which has made my punches more powerful than before. "I am ready to fight anybody as suggested by the World Boxing Organisation (WBO). I am confident that I will be able to defend my title with as much pride as I won it. I am looking forward to 17th December 2016, and hope to repeat history," he added.

1st Test: In-form India start favourites against inconsistent England

Rajkot, Nov 8
India-England five-match Test series will begin tomorrow with opening clash at Rajkot which is a debutant as the Test venue. After their triumphs over West Indies and New Zealand the morale of Team India which is also ranked World No.1 now, is high. The Rajkot Test promises to be an engrossing contest. Four years back, in 2012 England posted a 2-1 win against India in a four-game rubber. Team England have several bright batsmen including skipper Alastair Cook and Kevin Pietersen.

But, they have also been defeated by Bangladesh in a recent Test match in Dhaka and the two match series ended in 1-1 draw. On the other hand, Virat Kohli would be extremely keen to improve his team's batting against the visitors. On the bowling side also there are spinners like Ravichandran Ashwin whom Alastair Cook called a world-class bowler and compared his rapid rise to that of Graeme Swann.
