ISRO to launch 31 satellites on Jan 12

New Delhi, Jan 9
India will achieve yet another historic milestone with the launch of its 100th satellite along with 30 others in a single mission from Sriharikota on Friday. The Indian Space Research Organisation said it was back in the game with the launch. This will be the first Polar Satellite Launch Vehicle mission after the unsuccessful launch of the navigation satellite IRNSS-1H in August last year.

New Delhi, Jan 9
Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi today said India does not eye anyone's territory and resources and asserted that its model of development aid is not based on give and take. He said, India has always played a constructive role in the world arena and it does not measure its policy towards any nation on the basis of profit or loss but views it through the prism of human values. Shri Modi's comments came amid increasing Chinese efforts to expand its influence in the Indian sub-continent.



Addressing the first conference of Persons of Indian Origin (PIO) parliamentarians from across the globe, Shri Modi also asked them to invest in India and act as catalysts in the country's growth. He said, at a time when the world is divided by ideologies, India believes in the mantra of 'sabka saath, sabka vikas' and asked PIO Parliamentarians to spread India's message of inclusiveness. *(Contd. on last page)*

Playing of national anthem not mandatory in cinema halls: SC

New Delhi, Jan 9

The Supreme Court today said, the playing of national anthem is not mandatory in cinema halls before the screening of a film. The court modified its November 30, 2016's order by which it had made playing of the anthem mandatory.



A bench, headed by Chief Justice Dipak Misra, said a 12-member inter-ministerial committee, set up by the Centre, would take a final call on the issue adding that it should comprehensively look into all aspects.

The court also allowed the petitioners to make representations before the panel. The bench, while disposing of the petitions pending before it, also made it clear that the exemption granted to disabled persons from standing in the halls when the anthem is being played, will remain in force till the committee takes a decision. The top court accepted the government's affidavit which had said that the panel has been set up to suggest changes in the 1971 Prevention of Insults to National Honour Act. Attorney General KK Venugopal told the bench yesterday that the committee will submit its report within six months.

Assistance for 'Fish Transport Infrastructure' under Central Sector Scheme - 'Blue Revolution'

Port Blair, Jan.9
The Department of Fisheries, A&N Administration is implementing a component 'Assistance for Fish Transport Infrastructure' under the Central Sector Scheme - 'Blue Revolution' wherein subsidy is provided for purchase of insulated truck and auto-rickshaw with ice box. Accordingly, the pattern of subsidy for Insulated Truck is 40% of the unit cost with a ceiling of Rs.6.00 lakh per truck for general category

beneficiaries or 60% of the unit cost with ceiling of Rs.9.00 lakh per truck for Scheduled Caste, Scheduled Tribes, Women and their Cooperatives. The eligibility criterion for insulated truck is Fisheries Cooperative Societies / Federation, Self Help Group, Tribal Cooperative Societies and Registered Firms engaged in domestic marketing of fish in the Islands or Registered Fish Processing Unit set up in the Islands having processing facilities and engaged in procurement,

processing, marketing of fish in the Islands and to Mainland or Bonafide Fisher having registered Motorized or Mechanized Fishing vessel with Fishing License for last two years and current year. Similarly, the Pattern of Subsidy for Auto - rickshaw with Ice box is 40% of the unit cost with a ceiling of Rs. 80 thousand per Auto - rickshaw with Ice Box for general category beneficiaries or 60% of the unit cost with ceiling of

Rs.1.20 lakh per Auto - rickshaw with Ice Box for Scheduled Caste, Scheduled Tribes, Women and their Cooperatives. Eligibility criterion for Auto - rickshaw with Ice box is Local unemployed youth / Fish vendor having stayed in these Islands for a continuous period of at least 10 years / Self Help Group (SHG) / Fisheries Cooperative Societies / Federation / Tribal Cooperative Society and Registered Firms engaged *(Contd. on last page)*

U-19 World Cup: India beat South Africa in warm-up match

Christchurch, Jan 9

In a warm-up ODI match ahead of the U-19 World Cup in Christchurch, India notched up a massive 189-run win over South Africa. Bengal pacer Ishan Porel who bagged four wickets contributed in a big way to the victory. Batting first, India U-19 team scored 332 for 8, riding on

twin half-centuries by Aryan Juyal (86) and Himanshu Rana (68). In reply, the Proteas were bundled out for 143. Electing to bat, India started off well with openers Prithvi Shaw (16) and Manjot Kalra (31) sharing an opening stand of 54 runs. However, pacer Akhona Mnyaka got rid of the Indian top

order quickly, dismissing Shaw and Shubman Gill in the span of two balls. He claimed Kalra's wicket 10 balls later. Aryan and Himanshu then steadied the Indian innings. Chasing the huge total, the South African batsmen never settled down, losing wickets at regular intervals.

Colombo, Jan 9

Veteran all-rounder Angelo Mathews has been reinstated as the skipper for the Sri Lankan ODI team on Tuesday. Ironically, his appointment comes just six months after he had stepped down from the helm (in July) when Sri Lanka had suffered a miserable (3-2) series loss against Zimbabwe.

The 35-year-old had provided a urine sample as part of the BCCI's anti-doping testing program during a domestic T20 competition in March last year.
