## President asks Governors to maintain sanctity of Constitution

New Delhi, Feb 9  
The President of India, Shri Pranab Mukherjee opened the 47th Conference of Governors at Rashtrapati Bhavan today. In his opening address at the Conference, the President said our nation has grown from strength to strength since independence. It is primarily due to our steadfast adherence to the principles enshrined in our Constitution. It is an enduring document that reflects our aspirations and the avenues to achieve them, in an inclusive manner. It is incumbent on us all who hold constitutional positions to maintain the sanctity of this sacred text.

The President also said that Union Government's schemes have to run in close partnership with State Governments for their successful implementation. Shri Mukherjee said, schemes like Make-in-India, Start-up India, Smart City Mission and Swachh Bharat Mission have

The Literary works of Dr. Diwan Singh, a great patriot, and his struggle for freedom at Andaman and Nicobar Islands, has been preserved at the Shaheed, Dr. Diwan Singh Kalapani Museum at Chandimandir (30 minutes from Chandigarh). The small museum, built with the efforts and contribution of his family, was inaugurated by the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Punjab in December 2013. It is located in the vicinity of Chandimandir.

Dr. Diwan Singh had organised the Indian Independence League and Indian National Army in 1942. During the Japanese occupation of the Islands in Second World War, he was falsely charge-sheeted for spying and arrested. He was subjected to the most inhuman treatment in the Cellular Jail. He suffered in silence repeating the name of God and on Jan 14, 1944, became a martyr for the cause of truth and freedom of the country.

The General Officer Commanding - in - Chief, Western Command, Chandimandir has invited the Hon'ble Lt. Governor, Lt. Gen A K Singh (Retd) and the people of Andaman & Nicobar Islands to visit the museum.

**India steamroll Sri Lanka to enter fifth Under-19 World Cup final**

Mirpur, Feb 9  
Three-time champions India continued their invincible run to enter the ICC Under-19 World Cup final for a fifth time with an emphatic 97-run win over Sri Lanka in the semi-finals on Tuesday.  
India did well to reach 267/9 after a shaky start before putting up an impressive effort with the ball to dismiss Sri Lanka for 170 in 42.4 overs.  
The batting stars were Anmolpreet Singh (72 off 92) and Sarfaraz Khan (59 off 71), who amassed his fourth fifty plus scores in five innings player in the tournament.  
The three time champions now await either West Indies or hosts Bangladesh in the final to be played on February 14.  
Indians, put in to bat on an overcast morning, were put under pressure right away with its formidable opening pair of Rishabh Pant and captain Ishan Kishan falling cheaply to leave their team at 27/2 in the 10th over.  
Batting was not easy but Anmolpreet and the in-form Sarfaraz steadied the ship with a 96-run stand off 126 balls for the third wicket.

India needed a move on in the last 10 overs and the late burst came courtesy Sundar and Armaan Jaffer, who smashed 29 off 16 balls before Mayank Dagar's 17-run cameo off 10 balls took his team to a competitive total in a crunch match. Defending the target, the Indian bowlers did not allow the Lankan chase to take off.  
India missed quite a few chances on the field but the bowlers were still good enough to keep things tight for the opposition. After a batting cameo, Dagar did his bit with the ball as well, grabbing 3/21 in 5.4 overs of his left-arm spin.  
Pacer Avesh Khan, India's leading wicket-taker in the tournament,

struck in the very first over, dismissing Avishka Fernando leg before wicket even though the ball appeared to be drifting down. Soon after, the run out of Kaveen Bandara made it 13 for 2 in the fourth over. The chase was not a huge one but Sri Lankan batsmen failed to rotate the strike and a regular loss of wickets meant the asking run rate kept going up.  
Sri Lanka's hopes of reaching their second ever final were all but over when the scoreboard read 133 for six in the 35th over.  
Kamindu Mendis (39) and Shammu Ashan (38) got starts but failed to get that one big score needed to overhaul the target.

**South Asian Games: Archers top with 10 gold, four silver**

Shillong, Feb 9  
Indians bagged all the five gold medals up for grabs in the recurve event along with two more silver to make a clean sweep of the archery competition in the 12th South Asian Games here on Tuesday.  
Having claimed men, women and mixed pair team gold in the morning session, the recurve archers bagged two gold and as many silver in the all-Indian final in the afternoon to sign off in style with a maximum possible of 10 gold and four silver in total.  
Making a comeback after the 2014 Asian Games, Tarundeep Rai retained his SA Games individual title to finish with a hat-trick of gold along with Deepika Kumari as the duo also bagged the mixed pair and their respective team events.  
The two-time Olympian Rai, who had bagged the SA Games gold in 2010, held nerve under pressure to down his Army colleague Gurucharan Besra 6-2 in the individual final. Up 4-2 after three sets, Rai shot 19 (10-9) in his first two set of arrows, while Besra

also shot an identical 19 (9-10) as the former needed a Perfect 10 under windy conditions at the Polo Grounds. Showing nerves of steel, Rai was bang on target to clinch the fourth set 29-28 en route to retaining his gold as Besra had to settle for a silver. "It's difficult to assess the wind conditions, but it was my day. The medal means a lot to me as it has given me a perfect start in the Olympic year," Rai told PTI.

**Lionel Messi undergoes tests for kidney problems**

Barcelona, Feb 9  
Barcelona striker Lionel Messi is expected to play in Wednesday's King's Cup semi-final against Valencia despite missing training on Monday to have tests on his kidneys, the La Liga club said.  
"Barcelona striker Lionel Messi will undergo several tests on Monday and Tuesday to assess the evolution of the kidney problems he suffered last December," Barcelona said in a statement on their website (www.fcbarcelona.com)  
"Messi will return to his normal duties with the first team on Wednesday."

**Pak World T20 participation was discussed in Dubai: PCB**  
Karachi, Feb 9  
The Pakistan Cricket Board has revealed that the issue of Pakistan's participation in the World T20 in India in March-April had been discussed at the recent International Cricket Council in Dubai. PCB Chairman Shaharyar Khan said that a proposal was also floated about having Pakistan's matches at neutral venues if it didn't get permission from its government to tour India for the World T20 in March.

**David Miller to lead Kings XI Punjab in IPL 9**

New Delhi, Feb 9  
South African batsman David Miller was today named as the captain of Kings XI Punjab team for the upcoming Indian Premier League season 9. Speaking about his new role Miller, who has been associated with Kings XI since IPL season 4, said: "I am honoured to lead the Kings XI Punjab squad this year. I would like to thank the franchise, promoters, management and all the team members for the confidence they have in me."  
"Kings XI have assembled an exciting squad with a good mixture of youth and experience and I am really looking forward to the opportunity that lies ahead."

**India football team eyes a trip to the US to gain experience**

Kolkata, Feb 9  
Should Stephen Constantine pull it off, the senior India football team could tour the USA on work for the first time this August. Sunil Chhetri and his mates could play between three and five games including international ties in a country that is a favoured pre-season destination of top European clubs.  
"I had gone last September to the USA in a personal capacity to see some friends who are obviously involved in football and I really wanted to see how things are progressing in the US, having lived there for 10 years in the past. The progress there is really amazing

especially in the MLS (Major League Soccer) and the USL (United Soccer League) where you have 20 and 29 teams now in their respective leagues," the India national coach, Constantine, told.  
"During this visit, I came up with the idea to try and play some games there and give visibility to our Indian players so there have been a few emails and plenty of phone calls. We are moving in the right direction... The general idea is we will play two-three games against some MLS and USL clubs and also one or two internationals... I think it would be a great experience for our players," Constantine said.

**DDCA clears major hurdle, gears up to host World T20 matches**

New Delhi, Feb 9  
The Delhi and District Cricket Association (DDCA) breathed a sigh of relief after the South Delhi Municipal Corporation (SDMC) agreed to give them the occupancy certificate as well as No Objection Certificate to host the World T20 and IPL matches.  
The association withdrew its application from the Delhi High Court on Tuesday after both parties decided to resolve the matter outside the court.  
The biggest hurdle for DDCA was to get the occupancy certificate from the SDMC and until Monday, the SDMC had demanded a fee of Rs 50 lakh from the association and compliance to complete the work within 20 days. It had asked the DDCA to correct a total of 47 violations inside the stadium.  
The DDCA, in its defence, told the court that more than 40% of the work

was completed and the safety issues will be taken care of. The DDCA also agreed in court to give SDMC verbal assurance on maintaining safety standards and said that if anything happens on that front, the DDCA will be held responsible. "We have given them verbal assurance that safety measures inside the stadium will be taken care of. Even the SDMC inspected the venue and was happy with the development. We are happy that the matches are on now," said DDCA treasurer Ravinder Manchanda, who also showed photos of the work that has been done on SDMC's demand.  
Earlier, when the hearing began, the SDMC counsel argued that if DDCA can comply with the demands within 20 days and makes sure the safety issues are taken care of, the SDMC will have no problem in granting them the occupancy certificate.

**Government urges Banks to pitch in for Swachhta Mission**

New Delhi, Feb 9  
The Government today asked the Banks and Micro-Finance institutions to come forward in a big way for credit-disbursal to achieve the goal of Swachh Bharat Mission of making India Open Defecation Free by 2019. Addressing a Conference on Innovative Financing for Clean India here, the Union Minister of Rural Development and Drinking Water and Sanitation Shri Birender Singh said that there is incentive of Rs 12,000 for toilet construction for BPL families, but to achieve the universal coverage, there is need for easy financing by banks and other financial institutions. He said that Finance Ministry has included water and sanitation as new sectors for priority sector lending by commercial banks,

but this monumental policy change must translate from intent to action. Asserting that sanitation is closely linked with poor health, low education status, malnutrition and poverty, the Minister informed that since the launch of the Swachh Bharat Mission on 2nd October, 2014, more than 14.7 million toilets were constructed in the rural

areas, but still close to 50 percent of our rural population does not have access to a toilet. He said that the solid and liquid waste management component of the Swachh Bharat Mission, SBM provides scope for small and medium private sector institutions to engage in waste management and improvisation of village environmental management infrastructure.

**Special lecture for DBRAIT students held**

Prof. Satish Vasu Kailas, from Department of Mechanical Engineering, Indian Institute of Science, Bangalore, delivered a Lecture in DBRAIT Auditorium yesterday on the topic 'closing the loop, sustainability and well being' for the students and staff of BRAIT. During his presentation, he focussed upon both physical and mental sustainability wherein he

highlighted the challenges faced by the world due to over using of natural resources. Prof. Kailas, also explained the problems 'we may have to encounter in future due to over exploitation of natural resources'. **Coast Guard saves 2 lives**

Port Blair, Feb 9  
The alertness of the duty staff of Indian Coast Guard Ship C-145 resulted in saving of two precious lives in aerial bay harbour, Diglipur on Feb 2. At about 1845 hrs, Ranjan Dutta, E/F of ICGS C-145 while taking rounds of the ship heard sounds from outside. He immediately rushed outside and despite the darkness, managed to locate two fishermen in the water and their dinghy (Regn no. - MN-997) sinking at a distance of 25-30 meter from him. Without wasting any time the

sailor immediately took a rope and threw it towards the helpless fishermen. Due to the darkness and current, it was only after several attempts that the fishermen were able to grab the rope and could be then pulled out safely towards Jetty along with submerged dinghy. Enquiry revealed that the local dinghy was hit accidentally by mechanized fishing boat. The master of the mechanized boat, Shri Krishna Das, tried to rescue the crew of the dinghy but was unable to do so because of damage to his boat's propeller.
