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### Cabinet approves 'PM Gramin Digital Saksharta Abhiyan' for digital education

New Delhi, Feb 9, The Cabinet has approved 'Pradhan Mantri Gramin Digital Saksharta Abhiyan' to make 6 crore rural households digitally literate by March 2019. The outlay for this project is over two thousand 351 crore rupees to usher in digital literacy in rural India. An official release said, the 'Abhiyan' is expected to be one of the largest digital literacy programmes in the world. As per government Survey on Education in 2014, only 6 per cent of rural households have a computer and a significant number of these households are likely to be digitally illiterate. Under the Pradhan Mantri Gramin Digital Saksharta Abhiyan,

25 lakh candidates will be trained in the current financial year, two crore 75 lakh in next financial year and three crore candidates in 2018-19. Each of the gram panchayats in the country will be expected to register an average of 200 to 300 candidates. Digitally literate persons will be able to operate computers and access devices like tablets, smart phones and browse internet to actively participate in the process of nation building. The implementation of the scheme will be carried out under the supervision of Ministry of Electronics and IT in collaboration with states and union territories.

Electricity to all households by 2022, says Govt

New Delhi, Feb 9 The government today said that it has set a target of providing electricity to all households by 15th of August, 2022. Replying to supplementary in the Lok Sabha, Power Minister Shri Piyush Goyal said, the government is committed to this and efforts are on to

achieve the goal. He informed that there are over 18 thousand un-electrified villages in the country as on April, 2015 and out of them, over 12 thousand villages have been electrified till 6th of this month. He said, the remaining villages will be connected with electricity by May, 2018.

### Self employment venture through coconut based industries; applications invited

Port Blair, Feb 9 The abundant availability of coconut in the coastal strip of A&N Islands is offering great potential for establishment of coconut based industries in the territory. Some of the activities which have been identified as the thrust areas for promotion & development of coconut based industries are desiccated coconut powder, coconut chips, coconut cream, virgin coconut oil, preserved & packaged tender coconut water & manufacturing of coconut shell handicrafts etc. Interested beneficiaries who intend to adopt these activities as a self employment venture may apply for financial

assistance under the central sponsored subsidy oriented self employment scheme of Prime Minister's Employment Generation Scheme. Under the scheme, the beneficiaries are eligible to avail finance upto a maximum amount of Rs 25 lakh for setting up of such projects. The projects being setup at the rural areas will be eligible for margin money subsidy @ 25 - 35% of the total project cost whereas it will be @ 15 - 25% in case the project is setup at urban area. Simultaneously, the Directorate of Industries & A&N Islands Khadi & Village Industries Board have also decided to promote / encourage entrepreneurs for

establishment of units for supply of packaging materials, preservatives, food additives etc. which will play a vital role in supporting food processing industries in the territory including setting up of projects for coconut based industries. ## More scope for banks to lower lending rates: RBI Governor

Mumbai, Feb 9  
RBI Governor Dr. Urjit Patel has said there is more scope for banks to lower their lending rates as rate transmission has only been to the tune of 85-90 basis points as compared to the RBI's 175 basis point rate cut since 2015. Addressing the post policy press conference in Mumbai yesterday, Dr. Patel said the Monetary Policy Committee believes that the timely and effective transmission of policy rates by banks can be improved by means of a quicker and effective resolution of banking sector's non-performing assets, speedy

recapitalisation of the banking sector and full implementation of the formula for determining the interest rates on small savings. RBI Governor said the Monetary Policy Committee has exercised abundant prudence to keep policy rates on hold, awaiting a clear and unbiased assessment of inflation. The Governor added that the short-term macroeconomic configuration remains clouded due to the transitory effects of demonetisation and transient factors like stubborn CPI inflation and uncertainty over global

food and fuel prices. Dr. Patel, however, added that the Committee is dedicated to achieve the target of 4 percent CPI inflation while keeping in mind the objective of growth. Dr. Patel further clarified that the shift in policy stance from accommodative to neutral will minimise the cost of any collateral damage in order to achieve the target inflation and growth figure. He added that a neutral stance will provide RBI sufficient time and flexibility to make its assessments on how to achieve the said targets.

According to the police, accused person travelled as a passenger in Autorickshaw of the victim namely A.Pandi, auto rickshaw driver, R/o Pathergudda. decision has been taken by the Administration to provide tented accommodations having all the facilities of a five star hotel at Neil and Long Islands within one year's time. Such facilities will surely increase tourism activities in both these Islands, the Lt Governor added.

As many as 17 retired Officers of Indian Forest Service who had served the Islands were recognized for their outstanding contributions. They were presented with mementoes by the Lt. Governor on the occasion.

The Lt. Governor and other dignitaries released a Souvenir in commemoration of 50 years of Indian Forest Service in Isles besides publications brought out by the Department of Environment & Forests, A&N Administration viz. A&N Forest & Environment, Handbook on Forestry in A&N Islands, Common Forest Plants and Forest Statistic 2015. The Lt Governor also released the first album of special cover and special cancellation on the occasion brought out by the Postal Department.

In his address, the Chief Secretary, Shri Anindo Majumdar said, 50 years of Indian Forest Service in A&N Islands is an occasion of celebration which also calls for self introspection and taking stock of the future of the ecology of A&N Islands. He lauded the immense contribution of the pioneers of Indian Forest Service who served the Islands in various capacities despite the challenges. He remarked that the two-day seminar would prove beneficial for the young foresters serving in these Islands.

Lauding the exemplary professionalism of the retired IFS officers, he urged the new members to uphold the tradition and serve the people of these Islands with dedication. The Chief Secretary also acknowledged the internal challenges of the Islands such as demand for more development and settlement, resulting in more responsibilities for the Forest Department. The mandate of the A&N Administration is to strive for a fine balance between development and conservation of the ecology of these Islands; he said adding that it is the duty of the younger generation to ensure sustainable development of the Islands. The Chief Secretary also threw light on excessive exploitation of natural resources resulting in large scale natural disaster and urged for judicious use of forest products and land. He also highlighted about external challenges viz. global warming, climate change and rise in sea level which have become a major cause of concern across the globe.

A short documentary on 'Service of Foresters in A&N Islands' by the Department of Environment & Forests was screened on the occasion.

Speaking on the occasion, the PCCF, A&N Islands, Dr. Alok Saxena said the main mandate of the Indian Forest Service is the implementation of the National Forest Policy which envisages scientific management of forests and to exploit them on a sustainable manner. He also explained the role of IFS officers in conservation of forest, wild life, flora & fauna and lauded the sacrifices made by the IFS officers and foresters who served the Islands despite difficulties. He stressed on the need for conservation of natural resources in the Islands and also mentioned about the loss of forest cover due to the Tsunami. The efforts of the foresters in restoring the forest cover has resulted in increase in forest cover during the past two years, he added.

Earlier, welcoming the gathering, PCCF (WL), Shri M.S.Negi outlined the significance of the celebration of 50 years of Indian Forest Service. He said the Indian Forest Service was constituted in the year 1996 for protection, conservation as well as regeneration of forest resources. India was the first country which introduced scientific forest management, he said, adding that the Indian Forest Service has clear vision of its target and has devised ways to achieve them. He said, external challenges such as global warming and rise in sea level are a major cause of concern. He said, the role of foresters in reducing carbon foot prints is very important in maintaining the biodiversity of A&N Islands and stressed on the need for sustainable development of the Islands.

The inaugural session concluded with the vote of thanks proposed by Addl. PCCF, Shri Tarun Coomer. This was followed by technical sessions.
