the time he lived in but continues to remain an inspiration for humanity. Shri Mukherjee said, Gurudev was the perfect ambassador of the country at a time when little was known about India in the outside world.

In his message, Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi said, Gurudev Tagore will always be remembered for his powerful thoughts and contribution to the freedom movement.

## Centre tells states to link prisons with courts via video

New Delhi, May 9 The Centre has asked all States to link prisons with courts through video conferencing for expeditious trial and to save costs of escorting undertrials to courts. In an advisory to all states, Home Ministry has said, prison e-system should be integrated with Crime and Criminal Tracking Network and Systems as well as e-courts on priority basis. It also said, combined training of prison, police,

health department and judiciary on undertrial management should be conducted periodically. The Ministry has suggested that the existing vacancies in all ranks of Prison Departments be filled up expeditiously. The State and Union Territories' governments have also been advised to establish a Welfare Wing under Prison Department comprising welfare officers, law officers, counselors and probation officers.

## South Andaman Police seize banned tobacco

Port Blair May, 9 On receipt of credible information from the reliable sources regarding transportation of banned tobacco by one suspect, a raiding team was immediately formed under the direction of Inspector A.K. Singh, SHO PS Aberdeen under overall supervision of SDPO (SA) Shri Nishant Gupta which succeeded in apprehending the suspect at Delanipur junction on May 7 and recovered 2 bags containing 575 packets 'Bagban 69' tobacco from the possession of Samsuddoha Laskar s/o Shri Safuddin Laskar, 27 years r/o Anarkarkali. The seized banned tobacco and defaulter were handed over to the Food Safety Officer

## Allocation of wheat under PDS restored

Port Blair, May 9 The GoI has restored the allocation of wheat to this UT and as such wheat will be issued to the APL card holders as given earlier i.e., 4 kg per ration card upto three members and 6 kg per ration card above 3 units in addition to the usual quota of fortified wheat flour from June, 2017.

Meanwhile, sugar subsidy to states and UTs @ Rs18.50/- per kg for the year April, 2017 to March, 2018 is under examination by the Ministry of Consumer Affairs, Food and Public Distribution, GOI and therefore, the UT Administration has been advised by the Ministry to await further directions in the matter. Here it is pertinent to state that Govt. of India had abolished levy on PDS sugar wayback in July 2013

and directed all the States/UTs to either stop distribution of sugar under PDS or to purchase sugar from open market by utilizing their own fund for which the ministry will reimburse only Rs. 18.50/- per kg. Keeping in view the

## SBI cuts home loan rates in affordable housing push

New Delhi, May 9 In order to give a fillip to the affordable housing segment in line with the Prime Minister's vision of providing 'housing for all' by 2022, State bank of India declared interest rate deduction in housing loan. "SBI has announced an interest rate cut of up to 25 basis points for affordable housing loans under Rs 30 lakh. In a limited period offer which will be valid till 31st July, salaried woman borrowers can avail loan at an interest rate of 8.35 percent, offering a reduction of 25 basis points while for the non-salaried, the rate cut will be a 20 basis points. For salaried male borrowers, loan will be available at 8.40 per cent; a rate cut of 20 basis points while for the non-salaried, the rate cut will be a 15 basis points. The new rates will be effective from today.

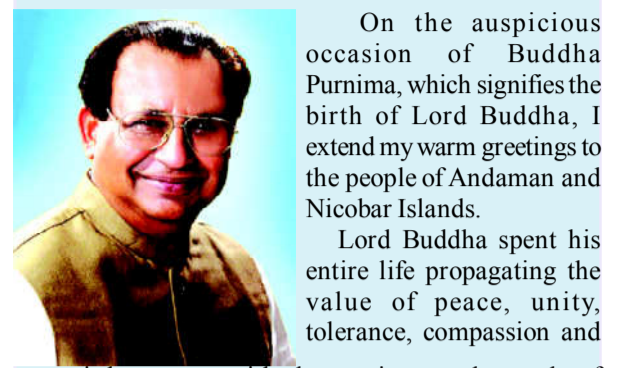
## Strengthening Inter - Island shipping connectivity Construction for two 500 passenger capacity vessels underway at Cochin Shipyard

Staff Reporter, Port Blair, May 9 In order to further improve the Inter - Island shipping connectivity, which is the mainstay of the people living in far flung Islands in the A&N Islands' archipelago, the Department of Shipping Services have stepped up its efforts. As part of this initiative, the Department has placed orders for construction of two 500 pax capacity - cum -150 tons cargo vessels, the construction of which has already begun at Cochin Shipyard Limited. Under the 'Make in India' policy, the Government has placed orders for both the ships at Cochin Shipyard Limited. DSS sources informed while speaking to 'The Daily Telegrams' here recently. DSS sources further informed that both these vessels are in the early stages of construction. The model tests of both the vessels have been completed at Maritime Research Institute Netherlands (MARIN). Giving information about the specification, DSS sources informed that the vessels are having a length of 100 meter, breadth of 17.5 meter and 4.5 meter draft. The vessels, being built at Cochin Shipyard Limited, will cost of Rs 5.92 crores each and are expected to be delivered by 2019. Once inducted in the A&N Island Shipping fleet, the vessels will be deployed in the Inter-Island sector to increase the frequency and to further strengthen the Inter-Island sector, DSS sources informed.

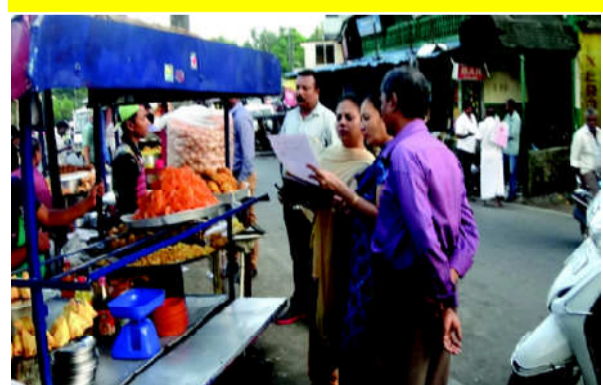

**Nicobar Police conduct special drive against bootleggers 162 liters of country made liquor & 21 kgs of illicit handia seized**

Port Blair, May 9 In the largest ever seizure of illicit alcohol in Nicobar District, a team of Police personnel of PS Campbell Bay recovered 150 liters of illicit liquor from the possession of accused persons namely Ramnath Roy, 46, R/o Old Machi Basti, Campbell Bay on 8.5.2017. The team led by Rani features an experienced mix with the likes of Sushila Chanu, Ritu Rani, Deep Grace Ekka, Sunita Lakra, Vandana Katariya, Namita Toppo, Sunita Lakra, Navjot Kaur, Lilima Minz, Monika, Renuka Yadav, Nikki Pradhan, Savita among others.

## FIBA revises earlier rule banning headgears

New Delhi, May 9  
World basketball governing body Basketball Federation of India, FIBA, has revised its earlier rule banning players from wearing headgear, a move that will enable India's Sikh players to wear turbans and play in the upcoming FIBA Basketball World Cup 2019 Qualifiers in China. FIBA said in a release issued today that the decision to overturn the controversial earlier rule was taken at its first Mid-Term Congress. The rule had forced India's Sikh

players - Amjyot and Amritpal Singh - to remove their turbans before the opening match at the FIBA Asia Cup in Wuhan, China, in 2014. In the first round of FIBA World Cup Qualifiers, India have been drawn in Group C, along with Syria, Lebanon, and Jordan. Group A comprises China, New Zealand, Korea and Hong Kong, Group B has Japan, Chinese Taipei, Australia and Philippines while Group D includes Iraq, Qatar, Kazakhstan and Iran.

## Jhulan Goswami becomes the leading wicket-taker in Women's ODIs

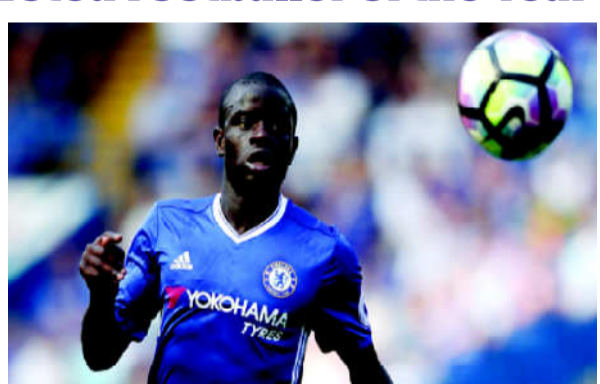
New Delhi, May 9  
Former Indian women's cricket captain Jhulan Goswami has become the leading wicket-taker in Women's One-Day Internationals going past Australian Cathryn Fitzpatrick record of 180 wickets on Tuesday. Goswami, 34, took three wickets against South Africa Women during the ongoing Women's Quadrangular Series in South Africa taking her career tally of wickets to 181 in 153 matches at an average of 21.76. The ICC Women's Cricketer of the Year 2007, Arjuna Awardee, Padma Shri winner and the once the fastest bowler in women's cricket has been the mainstay of India women bowling unit since her debut in 2002. With 271 International wickets (Tests, ODIs and T20),



Goswami is the all-time leading wicket-taker in women's cricket. After winning the ICC Women's Cricketer of the Year 2007 she captained India. She was conferred with the Arjuna Award in 2010, and the Padma Shri two years later. Born in a village in Nadia district of West Bengal, Goswami grew up as a fan of football. Her first tryst with cricket was when she watched the 1992 Cricket World Cup on TV and five years later she was enthralled by watching Belinda Clarke's victory lap after Australia vs New Zealand 1997 Women's World Cup final live at the stadium. Goswami is no mug with the bat as well and averages 25.72 in Tests and has two fifties to her name. In ODIs, Goswami has 919 runs to her name in 153 matches.

## N'Golo Kante voted Footballer of the Year

Chelsea, May 9  
Chelsea midfielder N'Golo Kante edged out his teammate Eden Hazard to be voted the Footballer of the Year by the Football Writers' Association. The former Leicester City player is on the cusp of becoming the first outfield player since Eric Cantona to clinch back-to-back top-flight league titles in England with different clubs, having played a key role in Leicester City's improbable triumph last season, according to an ESPN report. "It is a fantastic honour to win this award," the 26-year-old told the FWA website. "With so many great players in this Chelsea squad and in the England Premier League (EPL), for the Football Writers'



Association to name me their Footballer of the Year is a very proud moment in my career." FWA chairman Patrick Barclay added: "N'Golo Kante could not be a more deserving winner of English football's most prestigious individual award. "In the view of some FWA members, he would have been a worthy recipient last season

for his contribution to Leicester's title success, but the almost unbroken excellent form of Chelsea since he changed clubs has left little room for further debate. "Considering the competition of Eden Hazard and other players from Chelsea in particular, this is a great achievement."
