## India-US relationship has overcome hesitations of history: PM Modi in US Congress

New Delhi, Jun 9 Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi has said the relationship between India and United States has overcome the hesitation of history. He also said now comfort, candour and convergence define our conversations. Addressing the joint session of the US Congress, Shri Modi said in every sector of India's forward March, US is an indispensable partner. Saying that terrorism was a global challenge and that it was incubated in India's neighbourhood, the Prime Minister said from the western borders of India to Africa, it goes by different names - Lashkar-e-Taiba or Al Qaeda or ISIS and they all speak the same language of terrorism. In the last of his three-day visit to Washington, Shri Modi said his dream is to



economically empower billion of Indian citizens through many social and economic transformations and New Delhi sees Washington as an indispensable partner in this direction. He added a stronger and prosperous India is in America's strategic interest. "Nothing is confirmed yet. Nothing has been confirmed yet. Hosting a day night Test will depend on the success of the Duleep Trophy. We are also organising the country's first day

Also we will get a feedback from CAB on their D/N experiment," the source said. Eden's chances are bright since the other two Test venues for the New Zealand leg are Indore and Kanpur. Kanpur's floodlights have been a problem while Indore, for a match of this magnitude, may not be the best venue. The CAB has procured a dozen pink kookaburra balls for the super league final next week which will be telecast live.
