## PM addresses District Collectors; urges them to prepare vision documents to be achieved by 2022

New Delhi, Aug 9  
The Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi, today addressed District Collectors across the country via video-conference, on the theme of 'New India - Manthan'. The first-of-its-kind interaction with District Collectors marked the occasion of the 75th anniversary of the Quit India Movement, and is aimed at catalysing 'New India - Manthan' at the grassroots level. The Prime Minister explained that the date of August 9th, is intrinsically linked with the mantra of 'Sankalp se Siddhi' - 'Achievement through



Resolve'. He said the date symbolizes the willpower and ambition of the youth. Shri Narendra Modi recalled how the senior

leaders of the freedom movement were arrested at the beginning of the Quit India Movement, and youth across the country

successfully carried the movement forward. The Prime Minister said that when youth assumes a leadership role, goals are

sure to be achieved. He described the Collectors, as not just representatives of their districts, but also of the youth of that region. He said collectors are fortunate, because they have been given the opportunity to dedicate themselves to the nation. The Prime Minister said that the Government is asking each individual, each family, each organization to aim for certain goals which they should accomplish by 2022. He said that as representatives of their districts, collectors now have to decide where they want to see their districts in 2022, what deficiencies must be overcome, and what services must be ensured. The Prime Minister noted that some districts have

## Centre launches Swachh Survekshan Gramin

New Delhi, Aug 9  
The Centre has launched 'Swachh Survekshan' (Gramin) to encourage states and districts to improve sanitation coverage and solid liquid waste management. Launching this in New Delhi yesterday, Rural Development Minister Shri Narendra Singh Tomar said, toilet usage have increased to 91

per cent in the country whereas overall toilet coverage in rural India has reached to 66 per cent. Shri Singh said, all districts of the country will be ranked under the Swachh Survekshan Gramin on the basis of performance, sustainability and transparency. So far, 4,600 villages and 1.4 lakh households have been

covered under Swachh Survekshan (Gramin) Survey. Shri Tomar informed that 160 districts have been declared Open Defecation Free (ODF) and more than 2.2 lakh villages are ODF so far. Replying to media query, Shri Singh said, given the progress, the country will achieve the goal of swachh bharat by 2019.

There has been considerable improvement in both landline and mobile services in the Islands during the last one year, with enhancement in the bandwidth speed to 1.2 gbps, said the Chief General Manager, BSNL, Port Blair Circle, Shri V. Jagadeesan while addressing a press conference at Sanchar Bhavan here today.

This will be further enhanced to 2 gbps shortly with the hiring of another satellite connection. Another Satellite Station has been set up at Shadipur, which will boost the connectivity in the Islands, he said. continuous connectivity both for mobile as well as landline users. Once the Optical Fibre Cable (OFC) laying work is completed, the connectivity problems in the Islands will be overcome, he said. **Axar Patel to replace Ravindra Jadeja for 3rd Test**

Colombo, Aug 9  
Left-arm spinner Axar Patel has been named as a replacement for suspended Ravindra Jadeja in the 15-member Indian team for the third cricket Test against Sri Lanka, starting in Kandy on August 12. "The All-India Senior Selection Committee on Tuesday named Axar Patel as the replacement for Ravindra Jadeja in the team for the 3rd Test, which starts from August 12, 2017, at Pallekele International Cricket Stadium," BCCI acting secretary Amitabh Choudhary said in a release. Axar was part of the India A team that outplayed South Africa 'A' last night by seven wickets to retain the tri-series trophy they won four years ago. Jadeja was on Sunday



suspended for the third Test as his accumulated demerit points reached six within a 24-month period following his latest breach of the ICC Code of Conduct during the second Test. India have sealed the Test series against Sri Lanka after winning the second Test at the SSC in Colombo by an innings and 53 runs. The visitors had won the

**PV Sindhu, Saina Nehwal get byes in first round of World C'ship**

New Delhi, Aug 9  
Olympic silver medallist P V Sindhu and former World No. 1 Saina Nehwal received first-round byes at the World Championship starting in Glasgow, Scotland from August 21. Two-time bronze medallist P V Sindhu will open her campaign against either Korea's Kim Hyo Min or Egypt's Hadia Hosny in the second round and is likely to meet China's Sun Yu for a place at the quarterfinals. The 2015 World Championship

silver medallist Saina will take on the winner of the match between Switzerland's Sabrina Jaquet and Ukraine's Natalya Voytsekh and is expected to clash with Korean second seed Sung Ji Hyun for a place in the pre-quarterfinals. India's top male shuttler Kidambi Srikanth, who clinched two successive titles at Indonesia and Australia and reached the finals at Singapore Open, will open his campaign against Russia's Sergey Sirant.

Among other Indians in men's singles, 15th seed B Sai Praneeth, who won his maiden Super Series title beating Srikanth at Singapore, will face Hong Kong's Wei Nan, while Ajay Jayaram will take on Austrian Luka Wraber in the opening round. Sameer Verma, playing his maiden World Championship after being given a direct entry in the main draw, will square off against Spain's Pablo Abian.

**World Athletics C'ships: Wayde Van Niekerk retains men's 400m title**

London, Aug 9  
In World Athletics Championships, Olympic Champion Wayde Van Niekerk won the men's 400 meters event and retained his title in London last night. The World Record holder South African Niekerk, clocked 43.98 seconds to finish at the top of podium. Steve Gardiner of Bahamas finished second in

the event while Abdalelah Haroun of Qatar claimed the Bronze. In the men's 800 meter French man Pierre-Ambroise Bosse with a time of One minute 44.67 seconds is the new World Champion. Pierre had finished 4th in the Rio Olympics but he surprised everyone with his sudden spurt in the last 350 meters to claim the Gold medal

in World Athletics Championships. In the Women's 200 meter event, the Olympic Silver medalist Dafne Schippers, the 100 meters Silver medalist in this World Championships Marie-Josée Ta Lou, the 400 meters Olympic Gold medalist Shaunae Miller Uibo have qualified for the Semi finals of the event.

**Shreyas Iyer helps India A clinch tri-nation cricket series vs South Africa**

Oval, Aug 9  
Shreyas Iyer's century and Vijay Shankar's 72 powered India A to a comfortable seven-wicket win against South Africa A in the final of the tri-nation cricket series at the LC de Villiers Oval in Pretoria on Tuesday. Afghanistan A were the third side after Australia had pulled out. Chasing a target of 268 to win, South Africa A made early inroads as India A lost openers Karun Nair (4) and Sanju Samson (12), but a 141-run stand between Shreyas Iyer and Vijay Shankar put India A in the driver's seat. After Shankar's dismissal, Manish Pandey put up an unbeaten 109-run stand with Iyer to take India to a victory. India A achieved their target with 19 balls to spare, scoring 270 for three in 46.5 overs in reply to



South Africa A's total of 267 for seven in 50 overs. Shreyas Iyer played a characteristic quickfire innings of 140, which came off 131 balls, studded with 11 boundaries and four sixes. He came on to bat at No. 3 and forged a strong partnership with Shankar, who scored a fluent 86-

ball 72 with the help of five boundaries. Vijay Shankar was dismissed at the team total of 161, and India A still had a lot to do in order to achieve a victory. India A captain Manish Pandey, who has been in a rich form, added the remaining runs with Iyer to take his team past the finish line.

Coast Guard Helicopter. Following the well co-ordinated efforts of the Director Tourism and Coast Guard officials, the critical person, Shri Neeraj Arya, who was evacuated to GB Pant Hospital, also recovered soon. Meanwhile, a Coast Guard communication received here said that in a swift operation, Indian Coast Guard Chetak helicopter undertook medical evacuation on the request from Director (Tourism) for an early evacuation of a critical patient to Port Blair. Immediately on receipt of information, Coast Guard came into action and configured its Chetak helicopter into ambulance and brought the critical patient to Port Blair by evening of Aug 7 and the patient was immediately taken to GB Pant Hospital.

**Six local poachers apprehended from Jarawa reserved area**

Port Blair, Aug 9  
Six local poachers have been apprehended for entering and indulging in fishing activities in the Jarawa Reserved Area on Aug 3. A joint patrolling team comprising of Police, AAJVS and Forest Dept led by SI Mohd. Rafique, I/c OP Tirur, proceeded for joint patrolling in Jarawa Reserve Area of western coast from Temple Myo Dinghy Ghat in Forest Engine Dinghy on Aug 3. On the same day at 6 pm, when the joint patrolling party reached at Jarawa Reserved Area Hiren Tikrey,

they noticed that 6 persons all R/o Mayabunder were indulging in fishing activities with one engine dinghy. The joint patrolling party reached them and asked to produce permit/license to enter into Jarawa Reserved Area but they failed to do so. Consequently, they were arrested U/s 7/8 of PAT Regulation 1956. The whole operation was conducted under the command of Inspector Shabana Haneeff, SHO PS Ograbraj and close supervision and guidance of

Shri M.A Nausad, SDPO (Bambooflat). Meanwhile, the general public, especially the fishermen community have been requested to refrain themselves from entering into or indulging in fishing activities in the prohibited areas (Jarawa Reserved Area) failing which legal action will be initiated against them. Any information in this regard may be passed on to Police Control Room (Ph. 100, 232100) or PMF Control Room (1093, 239247) and identity of the informer would be kept secret.

always lagged in basic services such as electricity, water, education and health. He said that when the socio-economic conditions improve in the 100 most backward districts, it would give a big boost to the overall development parameters of the country. This puts an onus on the Collectors of these districts to work in a mission mode. The Prime Minister encouraged replication, and scaling up of best practices from districts where good results are being achieved in a particular field or scheme. The Prime Minister asked the Collectors to seek help from colleagues, intellectuals of the district, and students of schools and colleges, to prepare a vision document, or resolution document for their district before the 15th of August. This Resolution Document, should include those 10 or 15 objectives which they feel should be achieved by 2022. The Prime Minister informed the collectors of the website www.newindia.in - which contains information and activities related to the 'Sankalp Se Sidhhi' movement. He said that just as he is doing this 'Manthan' with the collectors, they can do the same in the districts. The Prime Minister mentioned the important features about the New India website, such as an online quiz on the freedom struggle, and a comprehensive calendar on various events being held as a part of the 'Sankalp Se Sidhhi' movement. The Prime Minister compared the development work in a district to a relay race. He said that just as the baton is passed on from one athlete to the next in a relay race, with the ultimate objective of winning the race, similarly, the development baton passes on successively from one collector to the next. The Prime Minister said that many times, schemes fail to have the desired impact, just because people are not aware about them. He said collectors must make people aware about the benefit of initiatives such as LED bulbs, BHIM App etc. Similarly, the Prime Minister said that the Swachh Bharat Abhiyan is dependent upon a responsive administration, and awareness among people. He said real change in this regard can only come through public participation. The Prime Minister urged Collectors to move beyond files, and go to the field, to understand ground realities, such as the condition of health services in remote parts of the district. He said that the more a Collector visits the field, the more active he will be on file. On GST, the Prime Minister asked collectors to explain to traders in their district, how it is a "Good and Simple Tax." He asked them to ensure that each trader is registered under GST. He also asked them to avail of Government e-marketplace for all procurement in their district. The Prime Minister recalled Mahatma Gandhi's message that the ultimate goal of governance should be to improve the lives of the poorest of the poor. He urged the collectors to ask themselves every day whether they had done something to bring change in the lives of the poor. He asked collectors to listen carefully to the poor, who approach them with their grievances. In conclusion, the Prime Minister said that the District Collectors, are young and capable and could make resolutions for New India of 2022, in respect of their district. He expressed confidence that their resolutions would be achieved, and in the process, the country too, would reach new heights of achievement.
