Operation Theatre inaugurated at CHC Bambooflat

Health facilities to be taken to the doorsteps of rural populace: Lt. Governor

Port Blair, Nov 9
A long pending demand of the people of Bambooflat and its adjoining area got fulfilled today with the opening of an Operation Theatre at CHC Bambooflat this morning. The Lt. Governor, A&N Islands, Prof. Jagdish Mukhi inaugurated the much needed health facility by unveiling the plaque in the presence of the Adhyaksh, Zilla Parishad, South Andaman, Shri Jaydeep Kumar Dey, Up-Adhyaksha, ZPSA, Smt. Bhageshwari, Principal Secretary (Health), Shri Raajiv Yaduvanshi, State BJP President, Shri Vishal Jolly, Ex-Adhyaksha Zilla Parishad South Andaman, Ms Mariyam Bibi, Director Health Services, Dr. Shipra Paul, doctors and Staff of CHC Bambooflat and a good number of general public of the area.

Addressing the gathering, soon after inaugurating the Operation Theatre, the Lt. Governor congratulated the Administration and the Directorate of Health Services for their concerted efforts towards fulfilling this long pending demand of the residents of Bambooflat. The Lt. Governor said, proper health facilities should be taken to the door steps of people in the rural areas for the benefit of the masses and the health institutions must be equipped with all necessary facilities to meet the needs of the people.

Sharing his observation of the Islands and its people, the Lt. Governor said, he has high opinion about the residents of these Islands i.e. they are honest, hardworking and law abiding citizens besides their sense of cleanliness. He also appreciated the fact that people of all walks of life, residing in these Islands including the Administrative Officers, avail health facilities in Govt. Hospitals here.

The Lt. Governor stated that Health sector in A&N Islands will be given due importance and the Administration will strive to solve the problems and cater to the needs of the Islanders pertaining to health care. Accordingly, within a year, the process of referring of patients to mainland shall be done

away with, he said. He further informed that cardiology facilities will be made available here in the Isles. Accordingly, first a Cardiology Department, followed by a Neurology Department will be set up at GB Pant Hospital for the convenience of the patients. Super Specialty services will also be made available in the Isles. The Lt. Governor also stated that the posts for Cardiologist and Cardio Surgeon will also be created to meet the needs of the Islanders and a Cath Lab, equipped with all required facilities will be set up soon.

Similarly, a Central University will also come up here in the Isles which has also been the long pending demand of the people, he said. The Lt. Governor reiterated that the Administration will strive to ensure availability of all required facilities in various sectors for the Islanders in the coming days.

The Lt. Governor also remarked that earlier, a tendency of depression was quite evident among Islanders due to the feel of isolation and unavailability of required facilities. But with passage of time, the scenario has changed due to globalization and advancement in technology. People are now well connected and they are also updated about various developments taking place

Smti Tigga had a telephonic conversation with the Director of Health Services regarding the issue and the Director (Health Services) assured her that a health camp will be set up in Diglipur area along with the sufficient Doctors, a communication said.

Root hits superb ton as England dominate day one

Rajkot, Nov 9
Indian bowlers were made to toil as England began their campaign on a promising note, riding on star batsman Joe Root's 11th century to finish the opening day of the first cricket Test at a solid 311/4 here on Wednesday.

England's leading batsman in recent years, Root was his customary elegant self and made 124 off 180 balls, while Moeen Ali was one short of his fourth Test hundred when the stumps were drawn after 93 overs at the Saurashtra Cricket

Association Stadium.
Root's effort was the first Test century by a visiting batsman in India since Michael Clarke's 130 at Chennai in February 2013. This was also the first time in the last 21 innings a visiting side crossed a 300 plus score in India.

The 25-year-old Root's maiden ton on the Indian soil was laced with one six and 11 fours, while Ali struck nine boundaries. The duo shared 179 runs for the fourth wicket to bail England out from a tricky 102/3.

Ben Stokes (19) was the other unbeaten batsman at stumps. To India's good fortune, the well-entrenched Root was dismissed midway into the last session through a return catch by Umesh Yadav who bent low to accept the firm drive but then, in his enthusiasm, flicked the ball back over his head.

Luckily for the home team, which looked bereft of ideas on how to dismiss the classy batsman, the third umpire ruled in India's favour after Root stood his ground, indicating the pacer had not completed the catch.

Rising star Aditi Ashok will spear head the Indian challenge in a star-studded line-up of golfers, including defending champion Emily Pedersen, when the USD 400,000 Hero Women's Indian Open golf tournament gets underway from November 11 here.

will see 114 top professionals from around the globe fighting for the top spot.

The Indian challenge will be led by Aditi Ashok, Hero Order of Merit leader Amandeep Drall, and local professional Vani Kapoor.

Aditi, playing as a rookie on the LET has had a dream run this year. She is currently placed third in the Rookie of the Year ranking after a series of top-10 finishes and will look to continue the good work.

"My form has been very good coming into the tournament. I have prepared well this time around. I have also had a few top 10 finishes and I feel that I have improved as a player since the beginning of the year. Hopefully, I will do well at my

home event," she said.

Another player to look out for is Vani Kapoor. Vani finished tied fifth at the Hong Kong Ladies Open and is currently placed second in the Order of Merit with total earnings of Rs 9, 49, 150 and six victories. She will be playing on her home turf at the DLF Golf and Country Club and will lead the charge of a strong Indian contingent along with Drall.

Pedersen looks eager for an encore but it won't be easy for the Dane and she is expected to face tough competition from Beth Allen, who is in excellent form after winning the last tournament in Abu Dhabi. "It feels great to be back. I won my maiden title here last year, so I have lots of good memories here.

Selectors want Dhoni to continue till 2019 World Cup

New Delhi, Nov 8
After TOI reported that ODI and T20 captain MS Dhoni could play for India till the 2019 World Cup in England, the national selection committee too has backed the idea. Sources said selectors don't want to change the current hierarchy of the ODI team and would be quite happy if Dhoni continues to play for India till the 2019 World Cup.

"It would make the job of the selectors easy if Dhoni continues to play the way he is playing today. His fitness level is as good as a newcomer's in the team. He seems to be getting better with age and none of the selectors have discussed leaving out Dhoni in the future. He is an essential member of the ODI team and there is no one in sight who can replace him," a source in the selection committee told on.



Of course, the selectors would still want to take a good look at the team after the 2017 Champions Trophy and speak to Dhoni about his future plans. "If Dhoni is willing to play for another three years, it would be good for the team. His motivation level is still good and the day he feels he is not able to make a difference, he will certainly not continue to play cricket at the highest level," the source added. The selectors

are also not in a hurry to take a call on the ODI team's captaincy issue, because "none can come close to Dhoni's astute captaincy when it comes to the shorter versions of the game". Dhoni is now also batting higher up the order, which the selectors feel has given extra edge to India's batting. It was also revealed that Yuvraj Singh and Gautam Gambhir could also get back in the fray for selection if they continue to perform.

Nico Rosberg on the brink of maiden Formula One Championship title

Sao Paulo, Nov 9
Win in Brazil on Sunday, win the Formula One title: Nico Rosberg's task sounds simple enough but is a lot harder to achieve. The German is one step away from securing his first championship, which he will do if he wins at Interlagos regardless of where Mercedes team mate, triple champion and title rival Lewis Hamilton finishes. The odds are in Rosberg's favour – he has won for the past two seasons from pole position in Sao Paulo whereas the anti-clockwise circuit has yet to reward Hamilton with a victory. And yet the pressure of being within touching distance of a lifelong



dream can play on the mind, and increase the pressure, while the fickle Sao Paulo weather can wreak havoc with the best laid plans. Last year, Hamilton had already won the title and his focus was elsewhere. This time he comes on the back of two

successive wins and, like Rosberg, seeking a hat-trick. Another win for the Briton would take the battle down to the wire at Abu Dhabi's Yas Marina and, if Rosberg were to fail to score in Brazil, a potential 'winner takes all' scenario.

She said, ultrasound facility will be made available in this hospital so that expecting mothers need not come to GB Pant Hospital for the same. She said, the newly inaugurated OT will cater to about 35,000 people in and around Bambooflat area.

Giving a brief description about the OT, Dr. M. M. Suleman, Gen. Surgeon said that the new facility has been put in place within a record time of 7 months. He said laparoscopic surgery can be done in this state of the art Operation Theatre which has a high-tech advanced OT table. Operation cases will be taken up weekly twice with the help of the anesthetist from GB Pant Hospital, he added.

The inaugural function concluded with the vote of thanks proposed by the CMO (i/c), CHC Bambooflat, Dr. M.P. Susamma.
