PM Modi, Bangladesh PM inaugurate Bandhan Express train service through video-conferencing

New Delhi, Nov 9
Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi and his Bangladeshi counterpart Prime Minister Smti Sheikh Hasina jointly inaugurated the 'Bandhan Express' train service between Kolkata and Khulna through video conferencing this morning. West Bengal Chief Minister Ms Mamata Banerjee also joined the inauguration ceremony from Kolkata. Bandhan Express has joined the Kolkata-Dhaka Moitree Express to become the second cross-border train plying between the two countries. In his inaugural speech, Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi said the words 'Bandhan' and



'Moitree' define the core of the bilateral relationship between the two neighbours. As connectivity increases, people to people contacts will improve which will give a boost to economic development of both the countries. He said both

countries are working to restore the pre-1965 rail and road connectivity that existed between the economies. The two Prime Ministers also inaugurated the International Passenger Terminal at Kolkata which will offer end to end

simplified immigration and customs clearance services for passengers of both Moitree and Bandhan Express. Speaking on the occasion, the Bangladesh Prime Minister Smti Sheikh Hasina said the

India thrash Turkmenistan 3-0, end AFC U-19 campaign on high



Damman, Nov 9
India blanked Turkmenistan 3-0 in the last Group D match to end their campaign in the AFC U-19 Championship Qualifiers on a rousing note in Damman on Wednesday. Skipper Amarjit Singh opened the scoring in the 74th minute, Abhishek Halder doubled the lead in the 80th and Edmund completed the tally with a strike in the 92nd as India dominated the proceedings for the better part of the game. The crowd that gathered at

the Prince Mohammad bin Fahad Stadium chanted 'India! India!' as Luis Norton de Matos' players registered their first win of the tournament. Dominating possession and making frequent forays into the rival citadel, the Indians created innumerable scoring chances in the first half but were somehow not able to break the deadlock. India's domination continued in the second half and even as Turkmenistan rarely

threatened the opposition citadel, lady luck finally smiled on Matos' team when Amarjit found the back of the net. There was more to come from India as Halder doubled the lead by tapping the ball into an empty six minutes later, and Edmund completed the rout in the injury time. India, thus, ended the Qualifiers with four points from three matches. They started with a drubbing at the hands of Saudi Arabia and drew Yemen in their second match.

Rajasthan teenager picks 10 wickets for no run in T20 game

In an astonishing achievement, a 15-year-old left-arm medium pacer from Rajasthan on Wednesday picked up all 10 wickets without conceding a run in a domestic T20 game. Govt doubles import duty on wheat to 20%

It has also imposed import duty of 50 per cent on peas to check cheaper shipments from countries like Canada and to boost domestic prices.

2. Rehabilitation/Up-gradation of N.H-4 for the stretch from 242.0 km to 298.00 km (total 55.45 Km length), awarded cost of Rs:259.00 crores (2 lane road with hard shoulder). Revised estimate sent to MoRTH for AA & ES. Letter of Authority issued to M/S Vasishta Metena on 31.03.2017 & agreement executed on 17.04.2017. The trees appearing in both side of the road are to be removed with the permission of Forest Department. Same is awaited from Forest Department.
3. Since the existing road condition is very bad, the NHIDCL has taken the matter seriously for routing maintenance of N.H.-4 for the distance from Chidiya Tappu to Diglipur as a package-I,II & III(Stretch of 0-12 Km, 21-28 Km, 45-107 Km, 107-220 Km & 220-330.70Km(Total 304.70 Km length), awarded cost of Rs:9.23 crores.
