## Praiseworthy action by Administration & ANC 2376 tourists from Havelock & Neil safely brought back to Port Blair; passengers express gratitude

Port Blair, Dec 9

The tourists who were continuing to stay at Havelock and Neil Islands due to deep depression formed over south Bay of Bengal which later intensified into cyclone storm 'Vardah' got a sigh of relief when they reached Port Blair by Pawan Hans Helicopters, Defence Helicopters, ships of Directorate of Shipping Services and of ANC. Three vessels of the Indian Navy, Tangocharli-65 (T-65) and T-67, INS LCU-37, two Coast Guard Ships ICGS Rajveer, ICGS Kanaklata Barua and a DSS speed boat MV Kamorta were pressed into service to bring back these passengers. Despite very rough condition of the sea, the operation was carried out smoothly.

Earlier, in the morning at a high level meeting held at Raj Niwas, the Lt Governor, A&N Islands, Prof Jagdish Mukhi directed the Andaman Nicobar Command and the Administration to immediately start the evacuation of tourists from Havelock & Neil Islands.

The Commander-in-Chief, ANC, Chief Secretary, DGP and senior officers of the Administration were present in the meeting.

The C-in-C informed that as many as seven ships and three M17 helicopters have been pressed into service. The Lt Governor



directed that Pawan Hans helicopters should also start sorties for early movement of tourists to Port Blair. The Lt Governor further directed the Director of Shipping Services to ply the Administration's ships to Neil Island as naval ships will not be able to berth in the jetty.

According to a press release issued by the Directorate of Disaster Management, during the day long operation, 2376 tourists from Havelock & Neil Islands were brought to Port Blair by ships of Directorate of Shipping Services, 4 Naval vessels and MI 17, Pawan Hans Helicopters. Their further journeys from Port Blair to mainland were also planned accordingly.

The passengers were elated to be received at Helipad, Haddo Wharf and unanimously expressed their gratitude to the Administration and ANC

for their prompt action in bringing them back to Port Blair. They also stated that they were provided all facilities at their respective places of stay during the cyclonic weather.

As soon as the weather condition improved today morning (Dec 9), the A&N Administration without wasting time immediately pressed into service the Pawan Hans Helicopters besides seeking help from the ANC to send helicopters to bring back the tourists.

The Chief Secretary, Shri Anindo Majumdar, the Relief Commissioner, Shri Raajiv Yaduvanshi and the Deputy Commissioner, Shri Udit Prakash Rai received the first batch of tourists who arrived from Havelock at the Helicopter Terminal at Port Blair, with flower bouquets and enquired their well-being. They were also present at the Haddo Wharf, to ensure a warm reception and transportation of the tourists to their respective

places of stay. Flower bouquets were presented to the first disembarking tourists by the Chief Secretary and other officers at the jetty.

**Our Correspondent adds:** About 1000 tourists landed at Haddo wharf, with smiles on their faces, waving their hands to a large gathering assembled at the wharf, expressing their satisfaction and happiness over the arrangement made by the Administration and ANC. They expressed hearty gratitude to the sailors and officers of Indian Navy and Coast Guard ships also for the well disciplined services provided to them during their embarkation and till their disembarkation at the Haddo wharf. IndvsEng: Vijay, Pujara lead India's strong reply after Eng post 400

Mumbai, Dec 9  
Murali Vijay (70\*) and Cheteshwar Pujara (47\*) resurrected the Indian innings after K.L. Rahul (24) was dismissed early in chase of England's 400 on Day 2 of the fourth Test in Mumbai. The duo — which has a partnership average of 65, the highest among all Indian batsmen — put on yet another masterclass on Friday, to take the hosts to 146/1. The England spinners didn't have the same kind of success as their Indian counterparts. India lost only one wicket in the day, when off-spinner Moeen Ali managed to sneak one in between Rahuls' bat and pad early in the innings. Indian spinners continued to torment England, as Ravichandran Ashwin (six for



112) and Ravindra Jadeja (four for 109) made full use of the spin and bounce on offer at the Wankhede. However, it wasn't a bad outing for the visitors, whose total of 400 is nearly 80 runs more than the average first innings score at the venue. Jos Buttler's gritty 76 powered the visitors who resumed at 288/5 on Day 2. England lost the hard-hitting Ben Stokes on 31 just few overs into the day. Chris Woakes' (11) stay was cut

short by a sharp spinning delivery from Ravindra Jadeja, who opened the bowling with Ashwin. The all-rounder's defensive prod induced a faint edge that Parthiv Patel pocketed with ease. A few overs later, he sent Adil Rasheed (4) back with an arm-ball. The 26-year-old Buttler notched up his sixth half century in 106 balls. The wicketkeeper-batsman held the lower order together, even as they nudged and struggled to cope against

the spin trio of Ashwin, Jadeja and Jayant Yadav. However, just when things started to look downhill for England, the lanky Jake Ball and Buttler stitched together a crucial partnership of 51, showing some obdurate defence and the ability to keep the scoreboard ticking. Post lunch, Ashwin returned to dismiss Ball (31) with a loopy ball that jumped on the batsman who was looking to cut it. Buttler was the last batsman to be dismissed. India leads the five-Test match series 2-0.

Ashwin equals Kapil Dev's record of 23 five-wicket hauls

New Delhi, Dec 9  
Spin wizard Ravichandran Ashwin on Friday equaled Kapil Dev's record of 23 five-wicket hauls in Test



cricket. Ashwin, 30, didn't wait too long as he got the wicket of Ben Stokes in the third over of the second day's play of the fourth Test between India-England, being played at Wankhede Stadium. The offspinner from Chennai has been in sublime form these last couple of years. Kapil took 131 matches to reach the figures, while Ashwin just took 43. Ashwin, however, is still behind Anil Kumble (35 in 132 matches) and Harbhajan Singh (25/103). The record for most five-wicket hauls in Test cricket belongs to Sri Lankan legend Muttiah Muralitharan (67/133), followed by his great rival Aussie Shane Warne (37/145). New Zealand great Richard Hadlee (36/86) just beat the current India coach to the third spot by a single count. Another Aussie great Glenn McGrath makes up the top five with (29). Ashwin, at this rate, is likely to overtake most of them.

Men's Junior Hockey World Cup: India beat Canada, 4-0

Lucknow, Dec 9  
India beat Canada, 4-0, in their opening group match of Men's Junior Hockey World Cup in Lucknow yesterday evening. Mandeep Singh, Harmanpreet Singh, Varun Kumar and Ajit Pandey were the goal scorers as India topped Pool-D after the first day. Earlier in the other Pool-D game, England had defeated South Africa, 4-2. In Pool-C, New Zealand got the better of Japan 1-0, while defending champions Germany beat Spain, 2-1. Top 16 teams of the world are participating in the competition. Pakistan is not taking part. India will play its second group game against England tomorrow. Meanwhile, the International Hockey Federation said that the timing of last match of the tournament of every day has been advanced due to dense fog. Yesterday's last match between India and Canada started 15 minutes early from its scheduled start of 7 pm. As per the revised schedule, the last match of every day will now be played from 6 pm instead of earlier scheduled 7 pm and 8 pm.
