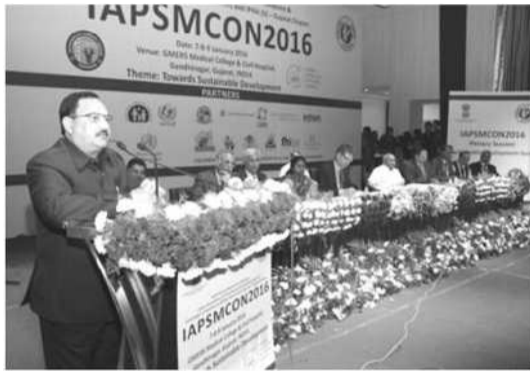

India facing challenge of controlling communicable, non-communicable lifestyle diseases: Health Minister

Gandhinagar, Jan 10
Union Health Minister Shri JP Nadda has said that the health sector in the country is facing the biggest challenge of controlling communicable, non-communicable and lifestyle diseases. He said, despite progress in health sector, many things are still required to be done. Shri Nadda was addressing the 43rd Annual Conference of Indian Association of Preventive and Social Medicines, IAPSM at Gandhinagar in Gujarat recently. He said the



country has made significant progress in the health sector despite the factors like vast population, health being a

state subject and low literacy level. Referring to the success of National Health Mission (NHM), Shri Nadda

said the country has partially overcome the challenge of communicable diseases, but the task is unfinished to control the non-communicable diseases and lifestyle diseases. He said, Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi's 'Swachh Bharat' programme is aimed at making India healthy. On the issue of budget allocated to the health sector, Union Health Minister said that budget is not a constraint, but many states have not been able to utilize the funds allotted to them.

Centre mulling to relieve teachers from poll duties: MoS HRD

Ahmedabad, Jan 10
Union Minister of State for Human Resource Development, Shri Ram Shankar Katheria has said that the Centre is mulling to relieve government school teachers from non-academic assignments in order to improve the quality of education.

He said deliberations are on to find out the solution so that teachers are not occupied in non-academic work like election duties which adversely affects the education of the children. Shri Katheria was addressing the 19th Nirma International Conference on Management at Nirma

University in Ahmedabad recently. He said that the Government school teachers are given election and Census data collection duties. They are also given assignments for implementing various Government schemes.

The issue of putting teachers for election as well as Census duties has been a widely debated issue in India. Supreme Court has also asked the Government not to assign such duties to teachers during working hours. Various teachers' associations as well as schools have also raised objections against such practice.

Plan to install 2500 WiFi hotspots by next fiscal: Telecom Minister

New Delhi, Jan 10
Telecom Minister, Shri Ravi Shankar Prasad said today that government is targeting to reach the 50-crore internet subscribers mark in



the next 6-7 months, besides installing 2,500 wi-fi hotspots by the next fiscal. The Minister was speaking at the inauguration of stock exchange BSE's free wi-fi service to public. Noting that wi-fi services are crucial to connect India, Shri Prasad said that state-owned telecom firm BSNL plans to install 2,500 wi-fi hotspots

at 256 places by the next fiscal. The wi-fi hotspot project will provide a major fillip to the 'Digital India' initiative. The government had unveiled the Digital India initiative last year, comprising various projects worth about Rs 1 lakh crore to transform the country into a digitally empowered knowledge economy.

ANIIDCO procuring milk from farmers of N&M Andaman

Augmentation of infrastructure on cards; milk chilling centres to be set up at four places

Port Blair, Jan 10
The Andaman and Nicobar Islands Integrated Development Corporation Ltd. since January 2014, has been procuring milk from the farmers of North & Middle Andaman and has also set up milk chilling centres at Kadamtala, Mohanpur and Diglipur. To facilitate the same with the aim to reach

out and benefit maximum number of farmers, the Corporation has initiated collection of milk for the first time from the farmers of panchayat of Shivapuram, Basantipur, Harinagar and Swadeshnagar in North & Middle Andaman with effect from 8th January 2016 by deploying milk collection van. Milk collection by

ANIIDCO is benefitting the farmers in disposal of surplus milk and is also providing self employment opportunities to the rural youth.

The Corporation is also in the process of augmenting of infrastructure for milk collection from North & Middle Andaman for which a Detailed Project Report

(DPR) has been submitted to Animal Husbandry Department for availing loan from NABARD. Under the augmentation plan, milk chilling centres will be set up at Rangat, Dharmapur, Tugapur and Nabhagram, a communication from the General Manager (Milk Plant) said.

India must win one game to retain second spot

Dubai, Jan 10
India will need to win at least a game in the upcoming one-day series against Australia to retain their current second position in the ICC ODI Team Championships, even as second-placed Virat Kohli looks to close in on AB de Villiers in the batting chart.
World champions Australia go head to head with former winner India in a five-match series in Perth on Tuesday.
Australia (127) lead second-ranked India (114) by 13 points and even if they lose all the five matches of the series, they will drop points but still finish a point ahead of India.
In contrast, if India loses all the five

matches, then they will slip behind South Africa and will join fourth-ranked New Zealand on 111 points, but will be ranked third when the ratings are calculated beyond the decimal point, an ICC release stated.
In the ICC Player Rankings for ODI batsmen, India boast three batsmen inside the top 10, while Australia only have Glenn Maxwell in 10th position.
Virat Kohli is the highest-ranked batsman from either side in second position. He trails number-one ranked AB de Villiers of South Africa by 96 points but is ahead of another South African, Hashim Amla, by 28 points. This means the India Test

captain will be aiming to produce solid performances to not only consolidate his second position but to also narrow the gap with the top-ranked de Villiers.
Sixth-ranked Mahendra Singh Dhoni and seventh-ranked Shikhar Dhawan are separated by just 11 points, which means there can potentially be some changes in the middle of the pack depending on how these two batsmen perform.
Batsmen sitting outside the top 10 and aiming for upward movement include Rohit Sharma (13th), Aaron Finch (14th), George Bailey (15th), Steven Smith (20th), David Warner (23rd), Ajinkya Rahane (28th) and James Faulkner (30th).

Intending pilgrims may note that a person can perform Haj through Haj Committee of India only 'once in a life time'. If anyone gets a confirmed seat by giving false information it shall be cancelled at any stage, even at the time of boarding the flight. The entire amount deposited by such Repeaters shall also be forfeited.

Application must have a machine readable valid Indian International Passport issued on or before Feb 8 and valid at-least upto Mar 10, 2017.

Applicants must give details of their account in a Bank having IFS code.

Only physically and mentally fit applicants are eligible to apply.

Applicants must submit a Solemn Declaration on plain paper in the format given in the instruction booklet, a communication from the Chairman, A&N Islands State Haj Committee said.

viz., "M/s Blue Bird Bar-cum-Restaurant", Garacharma, "M/s Amber Bar cum Restaurant", Garacharma and "M/s Holiday Inn Bar cum Restaurant", Delanipur were fined Rs. 30,000/- each for violation of Rule 3.1.1.6 of Food Safety and Standards Rules, 2011. Yet, in another case at the Court of Additional District Magistrate, two food business operators viz., M/s Athithi Place Bar cum Restaurant, Delanipur and M/s C.C.S Ltd. (Wholesale Section) Aberdeen Bazaar, has been disposed of by giving necessary instructions.

The State Food Commissioner has further cautioned the Trading Community, that the time period set by the community for disposing of cheap quality plastic cups/glasses has expired and therefore the Food Safety Officers of this Commissionerate will undertake a special drive on this matter immediately and errant Food Business Operators will not be spared and will be charged under relevant sections of Food Safety and Standards Act, 2006, a communication from the Commissioner Food Safety said.
