MP advocates for granting ST status to Chotanagpur Adivasi settled in Islands

Various communities including the notified ST of Chota Nagpur (now merged with Bihar, Madhya Pradesh, Jharkhand and Odisha State) migrated to this Union Territory during the period of penal settlement for the developmental activities. Thereafter, these communities settled themselves after uprooting their settlement in Chota Nagpur. Unfortunately, due to absent of Constitutional

Notification of recognition in this UT Islands, the Chota Nagpur tribal which includes Uraon, Munda, Kharia, Santhali, Bendia, Gond, Lohra, Baraik, Majhi etc have lost their original status of their home state. These communities are consistently demanding to protect their rights and to regime their status of Schedule Tribe in this territory.

The Member of Parliament, Shri Bishnu Pada Ray has paid serious thought on the issue and in reference to all previous letters/ correspondences, he has taken up the matter with the Ministry of Tribal Welfare, Govt. of India with justification vide letter dated 04.01.2018 and requested to explore possibilities to restore the

ST status of Chota Nagpur Tribals settled in A & N Islands and also to provide 4% reservation for them in the list of Scheduled Tribes of A & N Islands, a communication from MP Bhawan said.

Cabinet approves 49% FDI in Air India

In order to further liberalise and simplify the FDI policy so as to provide ease of doing business in the country, Centre has taken key decisions. Now, 100% FDI in Single brand retail and construction development under automatic route has been approved by the cabinet.

UIDAI introduces concept of 'Virtual ID' to further strengthen privacy and security of Aadhaar number holders

New Delhi, Jan 10
Unique Identification Authority of India (UIDAI) has introduced a concept of 'Virtual ID' to further strengthen privacy and security of Aadhaar number holders. Aadhaar number holder can use Virtual ID in place of Aadhaar number whenever authentication or KYC services are performed. In a circular said, the UIDAI said the Aadhaar card holder can generate the ID from its website and give for various purposes, including SIM card verification, instead of



sharing the actual 12-digit biometric ID. The ID will be a temporary and revocable 16 digit random number mapped to a person's Aadhaar number and it is not possible to derive Aadhaar number from

Virtual ID. Aadhaar-issuing body will start the service from 1st of March this year and it will be compulsory for all agencies that undertake authentication to accept the Virtual ID from the 1st of June.

Nationwide e-way bill system will be rolled out on trial basis by 16th January

Port Blair, Jan.10

All traders, transporters and C&F Agents of A&N Islands have been requested to take note that the nationwide e-way bill system will be ready to be rolled out on a trial basis by 16th January, 2018. This system can be used on a

voluntary basis from that day. The rules for implementation of nationwide e-way bill system for inter-state movement of goods on a compulsory basis will be notified with effect from 1st February, 2018.

Uniform system of e-way bill for inter-state as well as intra state movement will be implemented across the country by 1st June, 2018. This will have far reaching impact on the way goods move from one state to another state or from one (Contd. on last page)

Aanchal Thakur wins India's first-ever international medal in skiing

New Delhi, Jan 10
Resident of Barua, a small village in Manali, Aanchal Thakur on Tuesday created history by becoming India's first ever medallist in an international skiing event when she won a bronze medal at the Alpine Eider 3200 Cup organised by the Federation Internationale de Ski (FIS) in Turkey. Learning skiing from her father and later getting expert guidance and training from Olympian Heera Lala, the 21-year-old Aanchal finally had her day in the sun winning the medal in the slalom category. "Finally something unexpected happened. My first ever international medal. Federation International Ski Race (FIS). At the end turkey served me well," she wrote in her Twitter post soon after.



The congratulatory messages then started pouring in, starting with India's Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi "Well done @alleaanchal for winning an international medal in skiing! The entire nation is ecstatic on your historic accomplishment at the FIS International Skiing Competition in Turkey. Wishing you the very best for your future endeavours," the PM tweeted. Then it was the turn of Sports Minister and Olympic medal-winning shooter Col Rajyavardhan Singh Rathore. "Congrats Aanchal Thakur @alleaanchal for the Slalom Skiing Bronze in the FIS International Skiing Competition in Turkey," Rathore said in his tweet. Aanchal's Twitter bio reflects her determination to do well for the country at the international stage, and this bronze medal could be the beginning of that journey. "Just want to wave India's flag all over the world," the bio reads.

Sarita Devi elected women boxers' representative in BFI Executive Council

New Delhi, Jan 10
The former world and Asian champion L Sarita Devi was on Wednesday elected representative of women boxers in the Boxing Federation of India's (BFI) Executive Council. Sarita, who won a bronze medal at the Asian Championships last year, was voted in by 22 of the 31 team captains at the election conducted during the ongoing National Championships in Rohtak. She beat Railways Sports Promotion Board's Seema Punia, the lone candidate up against her in the polls. "I would be aiming to raise the problems faced by women boxers because I have practical experience of how things work," the Manipuri, who is a four-time Asian champion. "I decided to contest the polls two days ago because as a senior boxer, I thought it is important that I give voice to girls and their issues," she added.



Sarita joins former Commonwealth Games gold-medallist Manoj Kumar as a boxers' representative in the executive council. Manoj was elected to the position in 2016 during the national championships in Guwahati. "I am thankful to the fellow boxers who have voted for me and I would try to ensure that their issues are addressed in the best way possible," she said.

India to tour Ireland for two T20 Internationals in June

New Delhi, Jan 10
India will tour Ireland for two T20 Internationals in June before the full series in England from July to September. This was announced by the BCCI in New Delhi today. India's England tour comprises five Tests, three ODIs and as many T20s. Both the T20 matches against Ireland will be played in Dublin, one on the 27th of June and the other on the 29th. India played Ireland just once in the T20 format when the two sides met in Nottingham during the 2009 World T20. Earlier, India won the only ODI against Ireland by 9 wickets at Belfast in 2007.

India to play two T20Is in Ireland before England tour

New Delhi, Jan 10
Ireland will play 2007 World Twenty20 champions India in two T20 internationals in Dublin in June, Cricket Ireland announced on Wednesday. Both games will be played in the Dublin suburb of Malahide, with the first encounter scheduled for Wednesday, June 27, and the second match two days later on Friday, June 29. It will be the first time that the sides have met on Irish soil since they played an ODI in Belfast back in 2007. The games will be the first T20 internationals for Ireland head coach Graham Ford, and the South African is relishing the prospect of pitting his wits against such high profile opposition. "It's fantastic news for the lads and fans alike," said Ford, who only took the reins of the Irish side last month. "The matches will, of course, be a huge challenge for

the team, but what an opportunity for everyone to showcase their talents in front of a huge audience, both at the games and live on television," added the 57-year-old former South Africa head coach. Ford, who has also coached Sri Lanka, said there was a potentially rich reward awaiting anyone who impressed. "I'm sure the players will respond positively to the occasion with the added incentive of knowing eye-catching displays could result in a possible IPL contract," said Ford. "We haven't played our best cricket in the format in recent years which is reflected in the rankings, but what better time to start climbing the ladder again. "We have a number of players ideally suited to the short-form and on home soil it's a great opportunity to cause a shock or two," added Ford.

Yuki, Ramkumar advance in Australian Open qualifiers

Sydney, Jan 10
India's top singles players Yuki Bhambhani and Ramkumar Ramanathan won their respective matches at the Australian Open qualifiers. Bhambhani, seeded 15th, will now take on Spain's Carlos Taberner, while the 28th

seeded Ramkumar will clash against French man Gleb Sakharov in the second round. However, it was end of the road for Sumit Nagal and Prajnesh Gunneswaran. Prajnesh lost to Germany's Tobias Kamke and Nagal went down fighting to Italy's Alessandro Giannessi.
