## PM addresses concluding session of 47<sup>th</sup> Governors' Conference

New Delhi, Feb 10  
 The Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi, addressed the concluding session of the 47th Governors' Conference at Rashtrapati Bhawan today. The Prime Minister said Governors occupy a unique high position, owing to their vast years of experience, and the prestigious nature of their post. He said they can hence work as catalytic agents in the States, speeding up and improving processes without themselves becoming a part of them. The Prime Minister noted



that India is the only major economy across the world, which is moving ahead strongly despite the global economic crisis. He said that with the world taking note of India, India is not a mute spectator to global developments, and has played a key role in recent global fora such as CoP-21, and WTO. The Prime Minister stressed

on the importance of cooperative federalism, which he said must be implemented in letter and spirit. He said the Centre and States must work together as "Team India." He added that the spirit of cooperative federalism must also extend to cooperative, competitive federalism, with healthy competition for development among states. The Prime Minister urged all Governors to think about some form of legacy which they would leave behind at the end of their terms, as their contribution to the States.

### Govt investing over Rs 60,000 cr to improve fuel quality: Minister

New Delhi, Feb 10  
 Environment Minister Shri Prakash Javadekar today said the Government is investing more than 60,000 crore rupees to improve the quality of fuel and it will be ready with fuel for Euro six norms by 2019. Speaking at an event in New Delhi, Shri Javadekar however said there are latest technologies

which could help in solving the problem of pollution. He said but the real answer lies with improving the quality of fuel in cars. Terming the Government's decision leapfrog to Bharat stage six emission norms for vehicles by 2020 as a real game changer, Shri Javadekar said fuel will be Euro six compliant in next 1,200 days and that is the permanent solution.

### Enrollments under PMKVY crossed ten-lakh mark

New Delhi, Feb 10  
 The enrollments under Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojana, PMKVY, have crossed ten-lakh mark. The enrollments have been done under 382 active job roles out of which 70 percent have already completed their trainings. The states that reflect maximum enrollments are Uttar Pradesh, Tamil Nadu, Madhya Pradesh, West Bengal and Andhra Pradesh. National Skill Development Corporation is implementing the flagship

## Veer Savarkar Airport well prepared to handle International flights: Airport Director

The Airport Authority of India (AAI) is fully prepared to handle International flights in A&N Islands. All the required facilities are available at the existing Terminal of the Veer Savarkar Airport, Port Blair, even the Customs team is available on need basis, said the Airport Director, Shri GK Khare while speaking to 'The Daily Telegrams' here recently.

The Airport Director further stated that once the new terminal is ready, it will have facilities to handle arrival and departure of domestic and international flights through separate terminals. Following the successful night landing of flights in Port Blair Airport, the AAI Port Blair is also going to increase the staff strength at the Airport to handle night flights. The Director informed that currently AAI is managing the



night flights by existing staff while 24 additional CISF personnel were recently deployed for handling night operations.

The Airport Director stated that the 'Security Hold Area' (SHA) at the existing Terminal is being extended to handle the

increased passenger flow, the work for which is nearing completion. Once complete, it will be able to handle over 400 passengers at a time against the 220 passengers at present. Apart from this, air conditioning facility in the terminal has been further

upgraded as per the demand of the passengers. The Port Blair Airport is having 8 parking bays out of which 6 exist with AAI and 2 with Coast Guard, the Director added. The Airport Director further informed that night parking facility is also available at VSI Airport, Port Blair and the CRJ Aircraft of 'Air India' is availing this facility here. The night parking charges are also quite affordable. When asked why not so many airlines are opting for night parking in A&N Islands, the Airport Director said that providing accommodation to pilot and crew members of the aircraft, according to him, may be costlier for the airline companies. 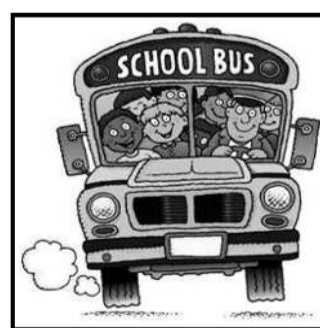

**12th SAG: India continues to dominate with 111 gold, 58 silver, 13 bronze medals**



Guwahati, Feb 10  
Indian Athletes today again ruled the Track and Field events of the 12th South Asian Games. They bagged 7 Gold and 4 Silver medals. Gold medals came in both 100 metres Hurdles and 400 metres races, Men's Javelin Throw, Men's Long Jump and Women's High Jump.

**Beti Bachao Beti Padhao Scheme expanded in additional 61 districts**

New Delhi, Feb 10  
The Ministry of Women and Child Development has expanded Beti Bachao, Beti Padhao scheme in additional 61 districts (covering 11 states). Beti Bachao Beti Padhao (BBBP) Scheme was launched on 22nd January, 2015 at Panipat in Haryana. It is a tri-ministerial effort of Ministries of Women and Child Development, Health & Family Welfare and Human Resource Development. In the first phase, 100 districts with low CSR were selected for BBBP Scheme implementation for creating awareness and advocacy about the issue. During the last one year, the BBBP Scheme is being implemented under the overall guidance and supervision of concerned District Magistrate/Deputy Commissioners. Seeing the overwhelming response by stakeholders in the
