Defence Minister describes Lt. Gen Hanut as charismatic & clear thinking General

Lt. Governor A&N Islands & Puducherry delivers lecture on "Leadership in the Future Networked Battlefield"

New Delhi, May 10
Lt Gen Hanut Singh Memorial Lecture was held at Kothari Auditorium, DRDO Bhawan, New Delhi yesterday. The General passed away last year on 11th April, 2015 and as a tribute this memorial lecture was held for the first time. It has been organized by Centre for Joint Warfare Studies. The Defence Minister, Shri Manohar Parrikar was the Chief Guest on the occasion.

Lt Gen Hanut Singh popularly known as 'the Doyen of Mechanised Warfare in India' and 'Soldier Saint' was an archetypal Indian Warrior in the classical, heroic mould of Indian history. He is better known for his heroics in epic tank battle at Basantar during 1971 Indo Pak War during which almost 50 Pakistani tanks were destroyed as against loss of only 13 tanks of Poona Horse of Indian Army. The Pakistanis themselves called Poona Horse 'Fakr e Hind-the Pride of India'; a compliment from the vanquished enemy.

The Defence Minister during his inaugural address stated that military leaders of the stature of Lt Gen Hanut Singh are remembered for the leadership that they provide during important battles. He was a charismatic and clear thinking General who exhibited sound leadership qualities and out of box thinking which should be emulated by young soldiers and future generation of leaders.

He highlighted the challenges for higher military leadership in 21st century and suggested ways to overcome them, suggesting a roadmap for future. Lt Gen Ajay Singh (Retd), former Governor of Assam also delivered a lecture on "General Hanut Singh - the Doyen of Mechanised Warfare in India". He highlighted his leadership attributes through battle accounts in Battle of Basantar during 1971 Operations. A short film on life & times of Lt Gen Hanut Singh was also screened.

Shashank Manohar resigns as BCCI President, ICC Chairman

New Delhi, May 10
Shashank Manohar has resigned as President of the Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) and Chairman of the International Cricket Council (ICC). His move comes in anticipation of him being re-nominated as ICC Chief during the governing body's annual board meeting scheduled for next month.
When Mr. Manohar took over as BCCI president for a second term last October, days after the demise of then president, Jagmohan Dalmiya, he was designated as the ICC chairman. However, with the ICC set to revert to its old rule of not allowing its chief to hold a post in his/her home board, Mr. Manohar has stepped down. The deadline for filing the nomination for the ICC chief's post is May 23. The BCCI will have to propose Mr. Manohar as its ICC presidential candidate. BCCI has two weeks to elect



new president Mr. Manohar's resignation leaves the BCCI a headless body for the second time in less than a year. According to its controversial rulebook, which has been under the scanner of the apex court, secretary Anurag Thakur will now have to call a Special General Body Meeting within two weeks to elect a new President. The new president, who will have to be nominated by at least one of the six full members from

the east zone, will be in charge till the 2017 AGM. An aspiring candidate should have attended at least two AGMs and have held the post of an office-bearer or Vice-President in the past. IPL Chairman Rajeev Shukla and BCCI Secretary Anurag Thakur are the frontrunners to occupy the vacant chair. Ajay Shirke, former treasurer, and current Vice-President G Gangaraju are also in contention for the post.

Nico Rosberg predicts Lewis Hamilton will 'bounce back' for F1 title

Johannesburg, May 10

Mercedes driver Nico Rosberg has insisted that he is enjoying his winning streak, but admitted that it is only a matter of time before his team-mate and triple world champion Lewis Hamilton will bounce back.

Rosberg has made a perfect start to his F1 season and currently holds a 43-point lead over Hamilton in the championship after winning his fourth successive race of the season at the Russian Grand Prix. With his fourth win in a row, Rosberg has brought his winning streak tally to seven, which was achieved only by F1 legend Michael Schumacher, Alberto Ascari and Sebastian Vettel. In contrast, Hamilton had suffered from few technical



issues and poor starts, thus making a second, third, seventh and second finish in the first four races of the season. Admitted that he had never expected to win four consecutive races, German driver Rosberg said he was extremely glad to achieve it, but agreed that sooner or later his run would surely come to an end. Rosberg pointed out that Hamilton has been driving extremely strongly in the recent times and that the time is not far away when he would fight back. The 30-year-old believes he would surely going to see some tough battle against Hamilton in the coming future and, therefore, admitted that he has to prepare himself mentally for such kind of situations. Hamilton hasn't won a race since claiming the world championship in Austin last year and has 17 more races left to defend his title.

ICAR-CIARI conducts field day on cultivation of marigold



Port Blair, May 10

ICAR-Central Island Agricultural Research Institute (CIARI) conducted field day on cultivation of marigold in modified planting system today at CIARI experimental farm, Garacharma. The field day was attended by 40 farmers from different villages of South Andaman. Introductory remarks were given by the Director In-Charge, Dr. A. Kundu and the i/c Head, Division of Horticulture and Forestry, Dr. R. K. Gautam.

The Course Coordinators of the field day Dr. V. Baskaran, Sr. Scientist and Dr. K. Abirami, Scientist explained in detail about production technology of

marigold in modified planting system and nursery technology for production of marigold planting material. The different techniques like preparation of ridges and furrows with reconstituted media, pinching technology, removal of male plants and propagation through terminal cuttings were demonstrated to the farmers.

The farmers were motivated by the field maintained at CIARI and showed their willingness to take up marigold cultivation in large area. The planting materials of marigold saplings were distributed to the farmers by the Director-In-Charge CIARI and I/C Head, H & F, a communication said.
