**Dharamsala, Ranchi among 6 venues to host Test for first time**

Kolkata, Jun 10  
Six new Test centres will be hosting five-day matches for the first time during a busy home season for the Indian cricket team, which will be starting with the New Zealand series in September. In a statement, BCCI Secretary Ajay Shirke said that Rajkot, Vizag, Pune, Dharamsala, Ranchi and Indore, were upgraded as Test centres in November last year, will host five-day matches for the first time. The Indian team will have a busy international schedule in the coming home season with 13 Test matches, eight One-Day Internationals



and three T20 Internationals scheduled by the BCCI. The new centres would also host Tests this season against the visiting New Zealand, England, Australia and Bangladesh. The announcement was made by the BCCI after the meeting of its Tour Programmes and Fixtures Committee.

**Financial aid for Heena Sidhu increased to 1 crore**



New Delhi, Jun 10  
In a huge boost for Heena Sidhu, the Sports Ministry on Wednesday increased the financial aid for the Rio Olympics-bound ace pistol shooter from Rs 75 lakh to Rs one crore under the Target Olympic Podium (TOP) scheme for her training till

the showpiece event. Heena secured an Olympic quota for the country in January when she led from start to finish and claimed the gold medal in women's 10-m air pistol at the Asia Olympic Qualifiers for Shooting. Besides raising the amount of her financial assistance, the Ministry has also approved the release of 90 per cent of total estimated cost for the former world number one's training, which is scheduled from June to August. "Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports has approved the enhancement of budget for Heena Sidhu from Rs 75 lakh to Rs one crore under TOP Scheme for training and other support till Olympics 2016," the Sports Ministry said in a statement. "It has also approved release of advance for her training during June-August, 2016."

**Tamil Nadu teen IM Visakh becomes first Indian to win Mayor's chess**

Chennai, Jun 10  
Tamil Nadu teenager and International Master NR Visakh created history yesterday by becoming the first Indian to clinch the Mumbai Mayor's International Open Chess Tournament and lead a top-three sweep in Mumbai. The 17-year-old International Master drew his final round match with fellow-Indian and GM Diptayan Ghosh and was tied for the top place on 8 points with Ghosh and Chandigarh's Himlal Gusain in a three-way tie. The arbiters declared Visakh (ELO 2400) as the champion on a



better tie-break as he reached a draw with Ghosh in 16 moves.

**World's highest-paid athletes: Cristiano Ronaldo tops Forbes 2016 list**

Madrid, Jun 10  
Real Madrid Cristiano Ronaldo has become the first athlete from a team sport in almost 20 years to top Forbes annual list of the World's Highest Paid Athletes. The financial magazine has calculated the earnings, including all salaries, prize-winnings and bonuses earned by active athletes between June 1st, 2015 and June 1st, 2016. Ronaldo, with earnings of 88 million US Dollars, takes the top spot for the first time, which is also the first time for a soccer player.

**Thousands bid farewell to boxing legend Muhammad Ali**



Kentucky, Jun 10  
Thousands of fans, faithful and dignitaries joined together shoulder to shoulder the funeral of Muhammad Ali at his hometown Louisville in Kentucky, United States yesterday. The jenazah, or funeral in Arabic, was held at a convention space in Freedom Hall, the complex where the former heavyweight world champion defeated Willi Besmanoff in 1961 in his last fight in Louisville. Civil rights activist Jesse Jackson and boxing promoter Don King were among the high-profile guests in attendance. The attendees at the service were young and old; black and white; Muslims, Christians and Jews. Luminaries including former US President Bill Clinton, Turkish President Tayyip Erdogan and comedian Billy Crystal will attend the event. Ali, known for his boxing prowess, showmanship, political activism and devotion to humanitarian causes, died on last Friday of septic shock in an Arizona hospital. He was 74.

**Heavy downpour leads to massive damage in Kerala**



Thiruvananthapuram, Jun 10  
In Kerala, heavy downpour continues unabated in almost all parts of the State as the monsoon has further intensified. Wide-spread loss of properties and destruction of standing crops have been reported from different parts. So far, over 100 houses have been partially hit and two houses completely wiped out in the current spell of monsoon. Pathanamthitta district received the highest rainfall of 76 mm in

the last 24 hours. Kannur district suffered extensive damage and destruction of properties. In all, ten relief camps have been opened across the State. Weatherman said, heavy rain will continue till Saturday.

**Maria Sharapova suspended**

London, Jun 10  
Maria Sharapova was suspended from tennis for two years on Wednesday for testing positive for meldonium at the Australian Open, and immediately responded by saying she would appeal the decision to sport's highest court. The ruling by an independent three-person panel appointed by the International Tennis Federation said Sharapova did not intend to cheat because she didn't know meldonium was

banned, but that she bore "sole responsibility" and "very significant fault" for the positive test. The five-time Grand Slam champion was provisionally suspended by the ITF in early March, when she announced at a news conference in Los Angeles that she failed a doping test in January. Sharapova said then she was not aware that the World Anti-Doping Agency had barred athletes from using meldonium, also known as mildronate, as of Jan. 1.

**UGC forms pay review panel for academic staff of Universities, Colleges**

The University Grants Commission (UGC) has constituted a five-member committee for pay revision of academic staff of Universities and Colleges.
