He said, the Non-Performing Assets, NPAs in the banks stand at 6.41 lakh crore in the public sector banks while total stressed assets are at 8.02

## P.V. Sindhu, Kidambi Srikanth to lead India in World Badminton Championships

New Delhi, Aug 10

Squad for the upcoming Badminton World Federation (BWF) Badminton World Championships has been announced. The tournament will take place in Glasgow, Scotland from August 21 onwards. The Indian squad has 21 players comprising of both women and men.

Fifth ranked P.V. Sindhu and eighth ranked Kidambi Srikanth are the two top seeded players going into the tournament and will lead in men and women category respectively. In the recently announced BWF rankings, a total of seven Indian men shuttlers were in the top 50 of BWF men singles



category.

With Sindhu and Srikanth coming into the tournament among the top-ranked players in their respective categories, they will get byes in the first round and will gain direct entries into the pre-quarterfinals. In the seven-day long

tournament, Indian squad will be participating in matches in men, women singles doubles and mixed doubles. Among coaches, the team includes Pullela Gopichand, Vimal Kumar, Tan Kim Her, Jwala Gutta, Handoyo Mulyo, Hariawan and Pradnya Gadre.

## FIFA Rankings: Team India drop one spot to 97th, Brazil dethrone Germany as top-ranked side

New Delhi, Aug 10

Indian football team witnessed a slight fall in standings as per the latest FIFA rankings, while Brazil dethroned 2017 Confederations Cup champions Germany to claim top spot.

India slipped to 97th after the Stephen Constantine-coached side achieved one of their best rankings in recent history when they climbed to the 96th spot last month. But in July, there was hardly any international football for Sunil Chhetri and company, and hence the fall.

India still have 341 rating points, with no change from their last month's tally. Canada, meanwhile, jumped five spots to 95th following their performances in the



CONCACAF Gold Cup, leading to India dropping to 97th place.

Among Asian countries, India are the 12th highest ranked team in the continent while Iran leads the chart at 24th spot. As far as the overall standings are concerned, Paris Saint Germain's record-breaking recruit, Neymar's Brazil have knocked Germany off the top of the FIFA rankings released on

Thursday. World champions Germany dropped to second despite winning the Confederations Cup last month after some rolling historical results were devalued.

Lionel Messi's Argentina are in third and modest Switzerland, with a 100 per cent record in World Cup qualifiers, are fourth, which is higher than they have been since 1994.

Francis looked out of it with 80 metres to go but maintained her form amid the carnage to post a personal best time of 49.92 seconds and take a shock gold



medal even though she had no idea she had won.

Bahrain's Salwa Eid Naser, 19, claimed a brilliant silver in 50.06,

her third national record this week, as defending champion Allyson Felix of the United States faded to get bronze in 50.08.

to deal with stressed assets. The bill seeks to amend the Banking Regulation Act, 1949 to insert provisions for handling cases related to stressed assets of banks. Stressed assets are loans where the borrower has defaulted in repayment or where the loan has been restructured.

The bill will replace the Banking Regulation (Amendment) Ordinance, 2017 which was promulgated on 4th of May this year. The legislation will enable the Central government to authorize the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) to direct banking companies to resolve specific stressed assets by initiating insolvency resolution process.

The RBI has also been empowered to issue other directions for resolution, and appoint or approve appointment, authorities or committees to advise banking companies for resolution of stressed assets.

## India vs Sri Lanka, 3rd Test: Virat Kohli-led India eye series whitewash

Colombo, Aug 10

Dinesh Chandimal-led Sri Lanka are on the brink of a series whitewash in the third and final Test against India commencing on August 12. So far in the series, injury-stricken Sri Lanka have failed to tick the right boxes. The Lankan lions, who have been criticised by fans and deemed unfit by the sports minister, now face the third-ranked Test team at Pallekele, following their defeats in Galle and Colombo. A series of loss for the hosts have definitely brought down the confidence of the players. Captain Dinesh Chandimal, who was out of the first Test due to pneumonia, said that a consolation victory over India would help put the smiles back on his players' faces.

"If we can win even one match against a team like this (India), we will be able to really boost the mental state in the team. They are the number one



team," said Chandimal. "We need to pick up the positives and look forward to the next game."

Virat Kohli has become the only India captain to win two Test series in Sri Lanka as his side smashed first innings of 600 and more in the opening two Tests. Cheteshwar Pujara leads India's run-scorers with two centuries and an average of more than 100 in India's three innings so far.

India's bowlers have also

shone with spinners Ravindra Jadeja and Ravichandran Ashwin topping the wicket-takers' chart with 13 and 11 respectively. However, Jadeja will not be playing the third Test as he has been suspended for breaching an ICC conduct code.

Though Axar Patel has been included in the 15-member squad, Kohli now has to choose between Kuldeep Yadav and the former for the final Test.
