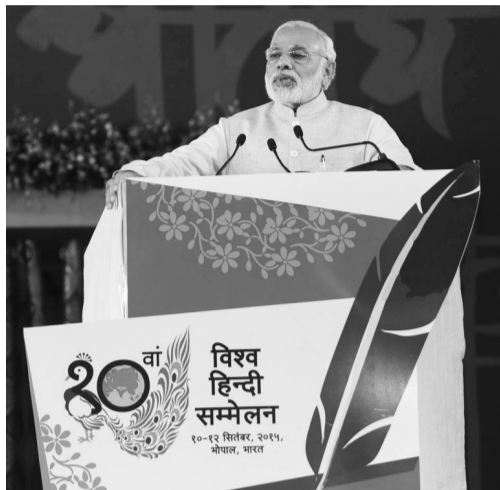

Bhopal, Sep 10
The Tenth World Hindi Conference began in Bhopal today. Inaugurating the three day event, Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi said that Hindi will be one of the three most influential languages of digital age after Chinese and English. He said that there will be a big market of language in the coming days. Shri Modi said that it is the responsibility of every generation to protect and conserve their heritage and to carry it to next generation. The Prime Minister said that it is responsibility of all to make Hindi prosperous. Remembering Subhash Chandra Bose, Balgangadhar Tilak and others, Shri Modi said that most of the agitations for Hindi were launched by those whose



mother tongue was not Hindi. He suggested that other Indian languages should be

Prime Minister said that each state has a treasure of its own language and there is a need to link these treasures. Human-crocodile conflict issues & its mitigation reviewed Security and safety of beaches is our top priority: Lt. Governor

Port Blair, Sept. 10

The Lt. Governor, A&N Islands took a detailed review on the human-crocodile conflict issues and its mitigation with the officials of Department of Environment and Forests on Sept. 8, 2015, and emphasised that the security and safety of beaches is our top priority. The meeting was attended by the Chief Secretary, PCCF & Principal Secretary (E&F), PCCF (Wildlife), Secretary (Tourism) and CF (Wildlife). Dr. B.C. Choudhury, member IUCN Species Specialist Group, an expert on crocodiles and issues related to human-crocodile conflict, also participated in the review meeting.

In the meeting, it has been decided to conduct a population assessment study during November/December 2015 to estimate the population density/encounter rates.

After detailed discussion, a number of decisions were taken to deal with the Human Crocodile Conflict issues. Accordingly, the Department of Environment and Forest should take up necessary measures to drive away crocodiles in all tourist beaches. Dedicated teams shall be in place in each beach with needed traps and harpoons to deal with problem animals in cases of eventuality.

Adequate number of metal traps, cages and floating cages shall be made available in all major beaches.

Rescue boats with OBM engines shall be deployed in

all beaches of tourist importance and it will be ensured that the boats are run regularly in the vicinity of beaches to drive away the crocodiles, if any, and have a deterrent impact.

Advisories in the form of sign boards will be placed at all beaches which will also indicate the 'no go areas' for safety point of view.

The tourists/visitors at the beaches will be sensitized about safety precautions to be followed. Besides, awareness programmes for villagers, students and visitors will be conducted, by involving PRIs.

Identification of creeks and nullahs, which are vulnerable, will be carried out and executive staff in such areas will be deployed for monitoring the movement of crocodiles. A population analysis of crocodiles in the

nallahs and creeks close to human habitation and people dependent only on such creeks, for day to day movement, will also be done. The feasibility to prevent the entry of crocodiles by installing some barriers in such areas will also be explored.

Apart from this, directives to hotels, restaurants and resorts will be issued to avoid dumping of animal & poultry

wastes in and around their premises and creeks/nallahs. Fine against those violating the instructions/orders shall be imposed. Similarly, all fishermen are also to be advised to stop dumping of fish remains/wastes in and around the jetty and close to beaches, a communication from the Conservator of Forests (Headquarter) said here today.

The Department of Mechanical Engineering of DBRAIT is organizing a three days workshop on 'design, fabrication and flying of remote controlled aircraft', from Sept. 11 to 13, 2015.

The Principal Secretary & Commissioner (Education), Shri Raajiv Yaduvanshi will inaugurate the programme in the conference hall of the institutes auditorium at 9 am tomorrow (Sept. 11). Smti. R.Menaka, Secretary (Education)(i/c) will be the chief guest of the valedictory session to be held on Sept. 13.

The workshop will be conducted in groups in the conference hall of the DBRAIT Auditorium. Two trainers from AeroTriX, a division of Skyfi Education Labs Pvt. Martina Hingis partners Leander Paes, Sania Mirza to enter US Open finals

New Delhi, Sept 10
Indian tennis stars Sania Mirza and Leander Paes enter finals at the 2015 US Open on Thursday, partnering with Swiss legend Martina Hingis in their women's doubles and mixed doubles outings respectively.



In the high-stake second mixed doubles semi-finals, Paes and Hingis fended off a strong challenge from India's Rohan Bopanna and Chinese Taipei's Yung-Jan Chan to make the final. The fourth-seeded Indo-Swiss pair won the match in straight sets 6-2, 7-5 in 61 minutes at Flushing Meadows' Court 17. They will play unseeded pair of Bethanie Mattek-Sands and Sam Querrey. The all-American team beat Andrea Hlavackova of Czech Republic and Lukasz Kubot of Poland 6-4, 6-3 in the first semi-final.

Roland Garros, where Mattek-Sands and Querrey won the title. Earlier, Hingis partnered Indian doubles sensation Sania Mirza to make the women's doubles final with a straight sets win over their 11-seeded Italian opponents Sara Erani and Flavia Penenetta. The top-seeded pair won the match 6-4, 6-1 in 77 minutes at Court no. 17. Hingis-Mirza pair are making their

second successive Major final after winning the title at All England Club in July. In the final, they will play the winner of the second semi-final between the fourth-seeded pair of Casey Dellacqua (Australia) and Yaroslava Shvedova (Kazakhstan) and Anna-Lena Groenefeld (Germany) and Coco Vandeweghe (United States).

India bag rich haul of 7 medals on penultimate day in CYG

Samoa, Sept 10
Indians collected a rich haul of seven medals, including two gold, on the penultimate day of competitions in the 5th Commonwealth Youth Games in Samoa today.

Archer Prachi Singh bagged a gold in the girls recurve individual event while the tennis mixed doubles team of Sasikumar Mukund and Dhruithi Tatachar Venugopal clinched another yellow metal to boost India's medal tally. Boxer Gourav Solanki (52kg), archer Nishant Kumawat (boys mixed individual) and the squash mixed team of Velavan Senthil Kumar and Harshit Jawanda were the

silver medal winners, while pugilists Leichombam Bhimchand Singh (49kg) and Prayag Chauhan (64kg) settled for bronze. With just a day left in the Games, India occupy sixth spot in the medal tally with a total haul of 17 medals which include 7 gold, 4 silver and 6 bronze. Ahead of India in the medal table are: Australia, England, South Africa, Malaysia and New Zealand. India's medal tally will increase on the last day of competitions tomorrow when two Indians will be figuring in the Tennis singles finals. While Sasikumar will figure in boys event, Dhruithi will be playing in the girls summit clash.

Kashyap wins; Saina, Srikanth, Prannoy lose in Japan Open

Tokyo, Sept 10
Commonwealth Games champion Parupalli Kashyap emerged as the lone survivor at the Japan Open in an otherwise disappointing day for India as top shuttlers Saina Nehwal and Kidambi Srikanth made an early exit from the Super Series tournament in Tokyo on Thursday. Unseeded Kashyap prevailed over World No. 4 Srikanth 21-11 21-19 in an all-Indian men's singles contest, which lasted 45 minutes, to set up a clash with sixth seed Chou Tien Chen of Chinese Taipei on Friday. Kashyap, who is ranked eight in the world, has a 2-1 record against the World No.7, who had beaten him at the All

England this year. It also turned out to be a dismal day for World No.1 Saina Nehwal and World No.12 H S Prannoy as they failed to cross the second round. World Championship silver medalist Saina suffered a 13-21 16-21 loss to local star shuttler Minatsu Mitani in the women's singles, while Prannoy failed to get across Lee Dong Keun and went down 9-21 16-21 to the Korean. In a repeat of the Syed Modi Grand Prix Gold final match, Kashyap and Srikanth clashed at the Tokyo Metropolitan Gymnasium and the World No. 10 showed his prowess as he produced a sharp game to stump his fellow Indian.

Govt asks States to be proactive in implementation of Digitisation of Cable TV

Hyderabad, Sep 10

The government today asked the States to be proactive in implementation of the Digitisation of Cable TV networks as it will ultimately improve the potentiality of economic growth and employment generation. Addressing the seventh Regional Workshop on Cable TV Digitisation in Hyderabad this morning, Information and Broadcasting Joint Secretary Ms R Jaya called upon the States to be partners and well prepared to meet the deadlines of the Cable TV digitisation. She said the first and second phase digitisation enhanced the entertainment tax collection by 40 per cent. The joint secretary said 830 satellite TV channels have been given permissions and



another 200 applications are under consideration of the ministry. All the four metro cities and 38 other cities with more than 10 lakh population have been covered during the I and II phases of the cable TV digitisation. The third phase of the digitisation is under way to cover 7,709 municipal corporations and municipalities by December

this year. The rest of the country especially rural areas will be covered by the end of 2016. Speaking on the occasion, Advisor to the Ministry Yogenderpal said a programme code and advertisement code will be implemented stringently. He said not showing mandatory channels will be seriously viewed by the government.
