42-mega food parks to be operational within three years: Minister

Mumbai, Oct 10
Union Minister for Food Processing Industries, Smt. Harsimrat Kaur Badal said that all the 42-mega food parks sanctioned by the Government will be fully operational within the next three years. She was speaking to reporters on the sidelines of the World Packaging Congress in Mumbai on Friday.

Speaking about the food processing sector's potential,

Smt. Badal said the present government has brought freshness and thrust with Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi pro-actively promoting "Make in India". She informed that several international delegations have inquired about possible collaboration. She added that schemes including the 2,000 crore rupees corpus for cheaper loans through NABARD, subsidies to set up food parks, cold storages,

abattoirs and 100 percent foreign direct investment in food processing are expected to boost the sector.

Smt. Badal said even though India is one of the largest producers of food globally, only 10 per cent of this food is processed. She said food processing could significantly reduce wastage, generate employment, offer better prices to farmers and help in reducing food inflation.

49 criminal cases disposed of during National Lok Adalat

1st ODI: India hope format change sparks revival against South Africa

Kanpur, Oct 10
After two defeats to South Africa in the Twenty20 international series, India will hope a return to their preferred format sparks an upswing in form with the first of five ODIs starting on Sunday at Kanpur's Green Park. The 2015 ICC World Cup semi-finalists will welcome back several key players, but stopping an upbeat South African outfit will take some doing. South Africa too are back in more familiar territory after their 2-0 success in the Twenty20 games, having played ODIs more recently than India, and that too with almost a full-strength squad. AB de Villiers' team will go into the five-match series as favourites against MS Dhoni's India, who will aim to avoid a



repeat of the recent T20Is in Dharamsala and Cuttack. India return to the ODI format after the short tour of Zimbabwe, in which several fringe players were selected. Now that the first-choice team has been picked, a familiar pattern should set back in with Shikhar Dhawan and Rohit Sharma opening, Virat Kohli batting at one-drop, Suresh

Raina and Dhoni forming the fulcrum of the batting. Ajinkya Rahane, however, could face more drinks-running time owing to Ambati Rayudu's strong form in Zimbabwe. That said, Dhoni's comment after the Kolkata washout that India would have played Rahane in that match does hint at his comeback.

India look to seal hockey series against New Zealand

Christchurch, Oct 10
Having beaten New Zealand in back-to-back matches, India would look to continue their winning streak and seal the series in their favour when they take on the hosts in the fourth and final game here on Sunday. After losing the first match of the series in Nelson, India came back strongly to register back-to-back wins, leaving New Zealand stunned and searching for a victory against the in-form Indian

team. In the final game of the tour on Sunday, India will look to continue their attacking strategy and look for early goals to keep pressure on New Zealand. The Indian forward line, led by Ramandeep Singh, displayed a brilliant performance as they pushed the Kiwi defenders to the backfoot throughout the series. Nikkin Thimmaiah, Akashdeep Singh and SV Sunil continuously attacked the Kiwi 'D' and did not allow hosts' defence to settle

down. They were well-supported by midfielders, led by captain Sardar Singh, who covered almost all parts of the field and kept the home side players busy. Dharamvir Singh, who scored the last minute goal in the previous match, SK Uthappa, Devindar Walmiki and Chinglensana Singh would look to continue with their control at the midfield in the final match also.

1 silver, 3 bronze for Indian boxers at Military

New Delhi, Oct 10

In the final, Dheeraj fought valiantly even though he sustained a bruise on his hand in the opening minute of the bout. Ultimately, Abdelli prevailed by a 3-0 verdict. Dheeraj who defeated boxers from

Tanzania, Cameroon, Germany and Kazakhstan en-route to the final of the lightweight category said that he was disappointed to miss out on a certain gold medal. "I was in really good rhythm all through the competition. In the first three rounds, I managed unanimous victories and they gave me a lot of confidence. Even today, I was very confident of coming out on top against the Algerian however the hand injury that I sustained hampered my approach," said the boxer who is backed by the JSW Sports. Mohammed Husamuddin (56kg), Devanshu Jaiswal (81kg) and Narendra Berwal (+91kg) claimed bronze medals after losing in the semifinals.

Nadal beats Fognini to reach final of China Open

Beijing, Oct 10
Rafael Nadal reached his first hard-court final after more than a year on Saturday, beating Fabio Fognini 7-5, 6-3 in the China Open semifinals. The third-seeded Nadal's previous hard-court final was at the Sony Open in Miami in March 2014. The Spaniard last won a hard-court tournament two months before that in Doha, Qatar. Each player dropped serve twice in the opening set before Nadal got another decisive break, when



Fognini served at 6-5 down. The Italian had beaten Nadal three times this year, including in the third round of the U.S. Open.

Garbine Muguruza advances to China Open final

Beijing, Oct. 10: Garbine Muguruza edged past Agnieszka Radwanska in a thrilling 4-6, 6-3, 6-4 encounter to reach the final of the China Open here on Saturday. It was the No. 5-seeded Muguruza's fourth win in a row against the former World No.2. She sealed the victory after two hours and 13 minutes. The first momentum swing came midway through the first set - after Muguruza powered to an early 4-2 lead, Radwanska reeled off four games in a row to sneak out the 41-minute opening set 6-4.

Then, the big swing - Muguruza reeled off 11 of the next 15 games to not only take the second set 6-3, but built a 5-1 lead in the third. The No.4-seeded Radwanska began closing in, winning the next three games to make it 5-4. She even had a point for 5-all but it was just too little, too late. Muguruza had bigger and tidier numbers for the match. She finished with a -1 differential of winners to unforced errors (43 to 44) while Radwanska finished with a -3 differential (24 to 27).
