Efficient use of water is challenge for Indian agriculture & industry: President

New Delhi, Oct 10 President Shri Ram Nath Kovind has said, better and more efficient use of water is a challenge for Indian agriculture and the industry. Inaugurating India Water Week in New Delhi today, he said, the issue of water is becoming more critical in view of climate change and related environmental concerns. Shri Kovind said, in view of this, there is a need to set new benchmarks in villages and in cities being built.



The President said, currently, 80 per cent of water in the country is used by agriculture and only 15 per cent by the industry. In coming years, this ratio will change and the total demand for water will also rise. He said, efficiency of water use and reuse has to be built into the blueprint of industrial projects. Shri Kovind said, in urban areas, 40 billion litres of waste water is produced every day and it is vital to adopt technology to reduce the toxic content of this water and to deploy it for irrigation and other purposes. The President also urged for a localised water management approach which should empower village and neighbourhood communities and build their capacity to manage, allocate and value their water resources. The President said providing safe drinking water to a population spread across six hundred thousand villages and urban areas is not just a project proposal, it is a sacred commitment. Union Ministers Sri Nitin Gadkari, Ms Uma Bharti and others were also present on the occasion.

ICC Set to approve World Test Championship

Dubai, Oct 10
The International Cricket Council, ICC is set to approve plans for its long-awaited World Test Championship at a meeting in New Zealand this week.
The sport's governing body has argued for years that a Test championship is needed to boost the five-day format's

popularity as crowds and television viewers flock to the big-hitting Twenty20 version of the game.
But squabbling over formats and fears that some nations will be disadvantaged have twice stymied efforts to launch a league structure since 2010. The Sydney Morning Herald reported that plans for a nine-

ten Test championship were now well advanced and the ICC was set to give the concept a green light on Friday at a meeting in Auckland. It said the first edition of the competition would run over a two-year cycle beginning in 2019, culminating in a final between the top two teams at Lord's.

Confident India aim to retain No.1 status in Asian hockey

Dhaka, Oct 10
Eyes firmly set on retaining the numero uno status in the continent, favourites India face a tricky campaign-opener against Japan in the men's Asia Cup hockey tournament starting here on Wednesday.
The Asia Cup will be the beginning of new phase in Indian hockey as it would be newly-appointed coach Sjoerd Marijne's first test post the sacking of Roelant Oltmans.
It would be an arduous task for the 43-year-old Marijne to fill in the big shoes of Oltmans, who made a significant contribution to Indian hockey in his four-year tenure, lifting the Asian powerhouse from 12 to sixth in the world rankings.
Last edition's runner-up India, led by midfielder Manpreet Singh, will be eyeing a perfect

start to their campaign in Pool A which also features arch-rivals Pakistan and hosts Bangladesh.
Pool B, meanwhile, consists of defending champions Korea, Malaysia, China and minnows Oman.
The opening match of a tournament always holds greater significance for any team and India too would be hoping for a positive start ahead of their clashes against Bangladesh and Pakistan on October 13 and 15 respectively.
"The opening match is always challenging because we need to get over early nervousness and find our rhythm. The team is upbeat and ready for the first challenge," said skipper Manpreet on the eve of their opener. For Manpreet and India, the Asia Cup is a chance

to assert their supremacy in the continent.

Venus Williams heads back to Sydney after 20 years
Sydney, Oct 10
Evergreen Venus Williams will headline the Sydney International in January to kick off her 2018 season, returning to the tournament after a 20-year absence. The American veteran, 37, shows no signs of slowing down and enjoyed one of her best seasons this year, making the final of Wimbledon and the Australian Open and the semis at the US Open.

MV Pilobhabi & MV Pilopanja to operate between Chatham-Bambooflat

In order to provide hassle free harbour ferry free service between Chatham and Bambooflat, the Directorate of Shipping Services has deployed 3 vehicle ferry vessels regularly between Chatham and Dundspoint during peak hours. However, in a press release received here today, the Deputy Director, DSS clarified that today (Oct 10) one of the vehicle ferry vessel MV Karamatang developed with a technical snag in its steering, and as such the DSS withdrew this vessel from the service on the assumption that the passenger and vehicular traffic in the above sector would be managed by operating 2 bigger vehicle

ferry vessels- MV Pilopanja and MV Pilobhabi. Unfortunately at 0945 Hrs today, another vehicle ferry vessel MV Pilobhabi, operating in this sector also broke down, due to which the commuters faced difficulty and inconvenience. The vessel MV Karamatang was immediately attended and made operational by 11.30 am and the situation was normalised. However, again in the evening hours MV Karamatang was withdrawn from the service due to reoccurrence of the defect. Later MV Pilobhabi

was made operational and the stranded vehicles and passengers were cleared. Two vehicle ferry vessels MV Pilobhabi and MV Pilopanja will be operated between Chatham and Bambooflat till resumption of MV Karamatang. The Deputy Director (SS) further stated that since the technical snags on board vessels are unavoidable, DSS takes prompt action to attend the repair on war footing to resume normalcy, and sought the support and cooperation of commuters during such difficulties.
