Spread awareness about organ donation; President tells doctors, teachers and religious leaders

New Delhi, Nov 10

The President of India, Shri Ram Nath Kovind, graced the 'Dehdaniyoni Ka Utsav', organised by the Dadhichi Deh Dan Samiti, in New Delhi today. Speaking on the occasion, the President said that body/organ donation is true to the ethos of our ancient civilization. It is believed that Maharishi Dadhichi had donated his body so that the Gods could make a weapon from his bones and defeat the forces of evil.



The thought that in our lifetime, or even after death, our body or body organs could be useful to or help treat another person is both humanistic and inspiring. The President said that an estimated 500,000 people

die every year in our country due to unavailability of organs that can be transplanted. Of them, 200,000 suffer from liver diseases and 50,000 from cardiovascular diseases. In addition, approximately 150,000

people await kidney transplantation. The President appealed to doctors, educational institutions, teachers and religious leaders to spread awareness about body and organ donation. He said that due to poverty

some people may be compelled to sell their body organs, and this was unacceptable. If we institute a culture of voluntary donation, then the illegal market will gradually come to an end.

The RBI has asked banks to provide doorstep banking facilities to senior citizens of more than 70 years of age and differently-abled persons by December this year. Banks have been directed that senior citizens and specially-abled persons, including the

visually-impaired, should be provided basic services like pick-up of cash and instruments against receipt, delivery of cash against withdrawal from accounts, delivery of demand drafts, submission of Know Your Customer (KYC) documents and Life Certificates at the premises or residence of

such customers. RBI, in a communication to banks, including small finance and payments banks, said that Banks are advised to implement these instructions by 31st December, 2017, in letter and spirit and give due publicity in their bank

Hardik Pandya rested from three-Test India vs Sri Lanka cricket series

New Delhi, Nov 10
Hardik Pandya has been rested for the three-Test series between India and Sri Lanka. The Baroda all-rounder was earlier named in the Indian cricket team squad for the first two Test matches. The Board of Control for Cricket in India said Pandya was rested to manage his workload. The 24-year-old has been playing virtually non-stop cricket, including making his Test debut against Sri Lanka in Galle in July 2017. The national selectors have not named a replacement for Pandya, who seemed to have hurt his left hand during the rain-hit T20 match against New Zealand on Tuesday. Pandya will undergo strength conditioning at the National Cricket Academy in Bangalore.

Sri Lanka begin testing India tour with warm-up game

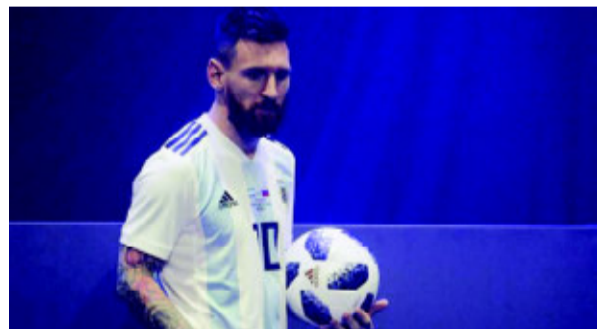
Kolkata, Nov 10
Chasing an elusive dream of winning their first cricket Test in India, Sri Lanka will begin their gruelling tour with a two-day tour fixture against a depleted Board President's XI on Saturday. Sri Lanka who will play their first Test in India since 2009-10 have a forgettable record in the country as they are yet to win from 16 appearances and have suffered 10 defeats in their head-to-head record spanning 1982-2017. It's an improbable task for skipper Dinesh Chandimal who will play his maiden Test in India and would bank upon the experience of Angelo Mathews and Rangana Herath the only two members who were part of their side which suffered 0-2 defeat seven years back. Having suffered a 0-9 humiliation at home across three formats, the Islanders are here in India in a gap of two months but with a confidence-boosting surprise 2-0 Test series win over **Bangladesh head coach Chandika resigns**



Pakistan in UAE last month. The Lankans will play three Tests and as many ODIs and T20Is in the long series concluding in Mumbai on December 24. Chandimal and Co. will hope to start well against a third-string Board's side led by Sanju Samson. The match is scheduled at the Jadavpur University second

campus ground, the deck of which primarily supports seam bowling. Giving importance to the Ranji Trophy, the Board has opted for a third-string outfit primarily comprising of players from -- Hyderabad, Kerala, Madhya Pradesh and Punjab who are not featuring in the ongoing fifth round of the domestic tournament.

South Africa vs India Test series could begin from January 5

New Delhi, Nov 10
After initial plans of hosting India in December for the Boxing Day Test, South Africa's plans were foiled with India arriving in the last week of December in the country and wanting some time to get used to the conditions including by playing a practice match. With that in mind, India's Test series against South Africa is slated to begin on January 5 or 6 in Cape Town. The two teams are scheduled to play four Tests, three ODIs and three T20Is as per ICC's Future Tours Programme. The boards have been going

back and forth to finalise the schedule since the start of the year. In August BCCI had made it clear that India's ODI series against Sri Lanka would only conclude on December 24 and the team would reach South Africa in the last week. Usually the norm is for the New Year's Test to be played at Newlands from January 2 but due to BCCI's persistence the

first Test won't begin until three or four days later. BCCI reiterated its stance of the Indian team needing preparation time ahead of the long series and desire to play at least one warm-up game. South Africa will thus play nine Tests including a Boxing Day Test – for which an opponent is yet to be finalised – in a short summer window.
