### Telecom Department to take up work on fast track mode

Port Blair, Dec. 10

On the request of A & N Administration, a meeting was convened by Secretary (Telecom), Department of Telecom, Govt. of India on Dec. 3 at Sanchar Bhawan, New Delhi to discuss various Telecom issues related to Andaman and Nicobar Islands. The meeting was attended by Chief Secretary and Special Secretary (IT), Andaman and Nicobar Administration.

After detailed discussions, it was decided that the project of laying submarine cable connecting Port Blair with Chennai by a dedicated submarine cable will be taken up by Department of Telecom on fast track mode. The DPR for the project has been submitted by Telecom Consultant of India Limited (TCIL) and has also been discussed with all stake holders.

The entire project of connecting Port Blair plus 5 Islands (Havelock, Little Andaman, Car Nicobar, Kamorta and Campbell Bay) will be taken up in single phase as suggested by A & N Administration.

With the revised delegation of power, the present project comes under the purview of Telecom Commission. Approval of the proposal by Telecom Commission is expected by January, 2016. Marine Survey for laying submarine cable by vendor will be completed by December, 2016 and the laying of cable will be completed by April/ May, 2018, a communication from the Special Secretary (IT) said here today.

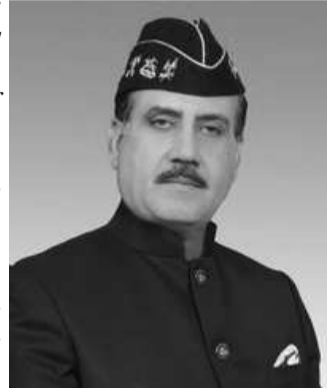
## APPEAL

Corruption saps the very vitals of the society. It affects all people, but more particularly, the socially and economically weaker sections. Hon'ble Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modiji has called for a transparent and efficient administration. He has rightly noted that the integrity of public servants and transparency in public offices is necessary to ensure good governance. The Andaman & Nicobar Administration gives utmost importance to eradicate corruption at all levels and provide a transparent and responsive administration.

As part of its infrastructure development initiatives, the Fisheries Department is developing Fish Landing Centers (FLCs) in different parts of the Islands. Giving status of the 14 Fish Landing Centers, the Director Fisheries, Shri J. Chandrasekhar, while speaking to 'The Daily

Telegrams', informed that 80 percent work relating to construction of Fish Landing Centers at Wandoor, Guptapara, Panighat, Neil Island and Uttara has been completed and these FLCs are expected to be ready by March 2016.

These Fish landing Centers are being developed

by the Andaman Lakshadweep Harbour Works (ALHW). Apart from this, 60 percent construction work of FLC at Hut Bay is complete while the work for FLC at Betapur has also begun. The Director further said that these FLCs will facilitate easy landing and hygienic handling of fish

catches by the fisher folks and each FLC shall have RCC sloping ramp for organized and hygienic fish landing, fish sorting-cum-auction hall, net repairing shed, engine repairing shed, fish drying platform, provision of ice-storage and other basic amenities such as water,

ICC happy with Eden progress for  
World T20 finals

Kolkata, Dec 10  
The International Cricket Council inspection team foresees "no roadblock" in Eden Gardens hosting the ICC World Twenty20 finals, even as it's learnt that they want two more dressing rooms in the venue.  
Led by ICC head of events, Chris Tetley and BCCI tournament director M V Sridhar, a joint team today did an inspection of the venue and they asserted that there's absolutely "no problem". It's, however, learnt that the ICC has suggested for two more dressing rooms in order to accommodate the women's teams as the World T20 men's and women's finals will be held on the same day but in different sessions.

"Today has been extremely positive and we're really looking forward to the World Twenty20 to be played here," Tetley told a news conference after a marathon recce that went on for more than five hours.

Asked whether the Eden got ICC's green signal, Tetley said: "It's not a matter of green signal, it's a matter of discussing preparations on all aspects of staging the tournament. I don't foresee any roadblocks."

Ankle surgery set to keep Mitchell Starc out of World T20

Sydney, Dec 10  
Australian left-arm quick Mitchell Starc has decided to undergo surgery on his ankle and is likely to miss the World Twenty20 in India early next year, Cricket Australia said on Thursday.  
Starc has long suffered from bone spurs in his right ankle and decided to take the opportunity to have an operation to resolve the problem while sidelined by a foot injury sustained against New Zealand. "Mitchell met with specialists late last week to get an opinion on his recent foot injury and ongoing right ankle impingement," the team physiotherapist David Beakley said in a news release.

Anand to meet Grischuk in round six of London Classic

London, Dec 10  
Five-time World Champion Viswanathan Anand will have his task cut out when he takes on Russian Alexander Grischuk in the sixth round of the London Chess Classic in London.  
With three draws, one win and a lone loss, Anand is sitting on 2.5 points from the first five rounds and the Indian ace will have to change gears and look for some victories as the Classic approaches its business end.

Three refugees expected to qualify for 2016 Olympics

Switzerland, Dec 10  
Three refugee athletes who have fled their homes are expected to qualify for the 2016 Rio Olympic Games, the International Olympic Committee (IOC) has announced.  
Three refugees identified are a swimmer from Syria now in Germany, a Congolese judoka in Brazil and an Iranian taekwondo fighter in Belgium, said Pere Miro, the deputy director general for relations at the IOC on Wednesday.  
Working with aid agencies, the IOC created a \$2 million fund in September to help refugees with 17 national Olympic committees involved, Xinhua news agency reported.  
The IOC would be ready to help their preparation, Mr. Miro added.

India submit official bid to host 2016 IAAF World Junior Athletics

New Delhi, Dec 10  
India has officially launched its bid to host the 2016 IAAF World Junior (Under-20 boys and girls) Athletics Championships after the previous host elect Russia was stripped of the privilege in the wake of the doping scandal which recently hit the country. The Championships was originally scheduled to be held at the Russian city of Kazan from July 19 to 24 next year but now will have to be reallocated at another country following doping-related suspension of the Russia's membership by the IAAF. India is among three countries which have expressed interest to host the Championships, the other two being Perth in Australia and Bydgoszcz in Poland. India has not yet named the host city but Athletics Federation

1st ever vaccine against dengue fever to be publicly available

Paris, Dec 10  
The first-ever vaccine against dengue fever which affects up to 400 million people per year will be publicly available for the first time after being cleared for use in Mexico, French manufacturer Sanofi said yesterday.  
It's a very important moment in the history of public health, Olivier Charmeil, head of the company's vaccines division described Dengvaxia as the innovation of the decade. It took 20 years in research and development to create Dengvaxia. Until now, scientists have been stumped by dengue, which has four separate strains. The World Health Organisation says dengue has become the

fastest-growing mosquito-borne disease, with as many as 400 million people infected every year. It can trigger a crippling fever, along with muscle and joint pain. There is no known cure and children are at particular risk. The deadliest form of the disease kills 22,000 people per year, the WHO says.  
Sanofi Pasteur has requested authorisation to roll out the vaccine in 20 countries. Several million doses of the vaccine are ready to ship, and Sanofi expects annual production to reach 100 million doses by 2017.
