Farmers should be given more focus, says VP

Chennai, Dec 10
Vice President Shri M Venkaiah Naidu has said, farmers should be given more focus in the country. He said this after conferring the Yerarignar award to renowned agriculture scientist Dr MS Swaminathan at a function in Chennai. The Vice President said, agriculture is the basic culture of India adding that the electronic National Agriculture Market system, e-NAM, which is being experimented in 40 mandals, should be expanded nationwide to avoid middlemen exploiting farmers. He insisted that agriculture should be made



a viable and an appealing profession for the next generation. Shri Naidu also asked the media to give more importance to agriculture rather than getting drawn towards sensationalism. He also asked research institutions to transfer new technologies to farmers. The Vice President lauded

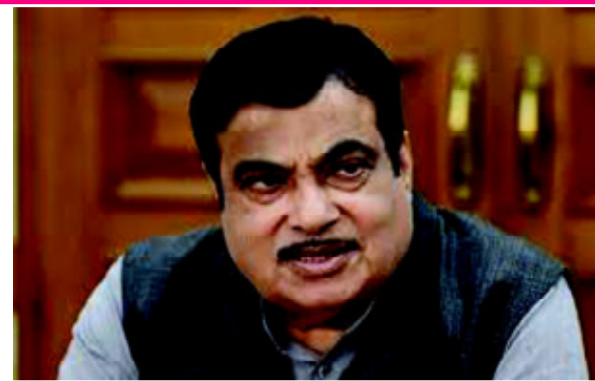

24 companies offer to invest over Rs. 60,000 cr in SEZ adjoining JNPT: Minister

New Delhi, Dec 10

Union Shipping and Ports Minister Shri Nitin Gadkari has said that 24 companies have offered to invest over 60,000 crore rupees in a special economic zone adjoining the country's largest container port Jawaharlal Nehru Port Trust. He said this will create employment for 1.25 to 1.50 lakh people.

Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi had laid the foundation for the facility in May 2014 and the government was targeting to create 1.50 lakh jobs in the facility.



Shri Gadkari said, works of over 2 lakh crore rupees have already started under the ambitious Sagarmala project and port-rail connectivity will alone witness investment of 1 lakh crore rupees under the

project. He said the ministry is constructing the Indore-Manmad railway line at an investment of 6,000 crore rupees and is also looking to connect neighbouring districts directly.

Sri Lanka beat India by seven wickets to end 12-match losing streak

Dharmasala, Dec 10
The susceptible technique of Indian batsmen in seamer-friendly conditions was thoroughly exposed as Sri Lanka comfortably beat India by seven wickets in the first ODI of the three-match series. The win also enabled Sri Lanka break the ignominy of 12 straight defeats in ODIs and also their first win against India in the current year after losing all international matches at home as well as the Test series. It was an inauspicious start to Rohit Sharma's India captaincy as the home team was shot out for 112 in 38.2 overs, a target which the islanders crossed in 20.4 overs. Suranga Lakmal (4/13), Nuwan Pradeep (2/37) and Angelo Mathews (1/8) stifled the hosts with a fine display of seam and swing bowling in ideal conditions as Thisara Perera won a crucial toss. Had former skipper Mahendra Singh Dhoni not stood tall amid ruins with a face-saving 65 off 87 balls, India at one point of time reduced to 29 for 7 and in danger of recording their



lowest ever ODI score. Their previous lowest was 54 against a formidable Sri Lanka in Sharjah back in 2000. During Sri Lanka's chase, Upul Tharanga blasted 49 off 46 balls with the help of 10 boundaries as the visitors overhauled the target with 29.2 overs to spare. With Sri Lanka taking a 1-0 lead, India's chances of grabbing the No 1 spot in the ICC ODI rankings is pretty minimal. With regular skipper Virat Kohli taking a break due to his impending marriage, the Indian top-order did not cover itself in glory as the likes of Shikhar

Dhawan, Rohit, Shreyas Iyer, Dinesh Karthik looked all at sea against moving delivery. While most of the batsmen are not Test regulars, the performance does raise questions about Indian team's ability to counter seam and swing. It was second time on the current tour after the Eden Gardens Test that Indian team's ability was put to test and they again came a cropper. Port Blair, Indian batsmen looked clueless as Lakmal, Pradeep and Mathews with half of the Indian batting line-up was gone for just 16 runs and at one stage.

India beat Germany 2-1, win Hockey World League Finals 2017 bronze medal

Bhubaneswar, Dec 10
India defeated a spirited but depleted Germany 2-1 to win the bronze medal at the Hockey World League Final on Sunday. SV Sunil (20') put India in the lead in the first half but a poor defending saw Mark Appel (36') equalise in the second half. Harmanpreet Singh (54') then converted a penalty corner six minutes before the final hooter to seal the match in India's favour. Germany fan or not, you have to feel for Germany. They were down to 13 [including goalkeeper] men against their semi-final clash against Australia. On Sunday, they were further reduced to 11 meaning they won't be able to rotate players through substitution. A few of them were lying down after the match, in pure exhaustion and disappointment after the energy-sapping defeat. The scoreline after the first half read in India's favour but the depleted Germans fought and it was clear they had the upperhand - compact in defence and superior in attack. Indian defence was shoddy to say the least as they allowed one penalty corner after



another in quick succession. There were six penalty corners for the four-time Olympic champions after the first two quarters. That they failed to convert was due to goalkeeper Suraj Karkera's blocks and that their first choice dragflicker and captain Martin Haner was missing in action due to illness. The Germans weren't ready to go down without a fight. But India got a crucial lead when a brilliant diagonal ball by Harmanpreet Singh from the midfield threaded through the German defence and found Akashdeep Singh on the left inside the D but his reverse hit was blocked and SV Sunil swept the resulting rebound, diving, inside the cage to put India 1-0 ahead in the second quarter.

Tsunami Memorial Football final to be played today

The final of Tsunami Memorial Open Knock Out Football Tournament will be played between Chowra XI and USC at Netaji Stadium tomorrow (Dec. 11). Meanwhile, in the first semi-final match played today, MVFC defeated Chowra by 2-0. In the second semi-final, USC defeated INFOTECH in tie-breaker. Both the teams were locked at 2-2 at the end of the stipulated time. Eventually, in the tie-breaker USC won by 7-5.

Jitu Rai, Heena Sindhu win medals at Asian Championships

New Delhi, Dec 10
Pistol aces Jitu Rai and Heena Sidhu bagged a bronze each to continue India's medal charge at the 10th Asian Championship 10m Rifle/Pistol in Wako City, Japan on Sunday. Jitu won an individual bronze in the men's 10m Air Pistol, which also helped the Indian team comprising Shahzar Rizvi and Omkar Singh besides Jitu, to bag the Team gold in the event. Heena claimed an individual bronze in the women's 10m Air Pistol. Her effort, along with teammates Shri Nivetha Paramantham and Harveen Srao, helped the Team clinch a silver. India added another individual bronze through Anmol Jain in the junior men's 10M Air Pistol as well as the Team silver in the event, thanks to the combined exploits of Anmol,



Gaurav Rana and Abhishek Arya. Having won 11 medals on the first two days of the competition, India's medal count stands at four gold, six silver and seven bronze for a total of 17 medals so far. In the men's 10m Air Pistol, it was Shahzar Rizvi who topped qualification with a score of 583. He along with Jitu, who shot 577 to finish fifth in qualifying, made it two Indians in the eight-man final. The experienced Omkar Singh missed out, shooting 575 to

finish 10th but enough to secure the Team gold for the trio with a combined score of 1735, full six points ahead of second-placed China and seven ahead of third-placed Vietnam. In the 24-shot final, Jitu narrowly pipped Shahzar to claim bronze with a score of 219.6. Shahzar was more than a point ahead of Jitu till the 18th shot, but two scores of 10.9 and 10.6 by Jitu in the 19th and 20th shot meant Shahzar was fourth with a total of 199.6, just 0.3 behind Jitu at that stage.

Russia's Denis Yuskov sets world record in men's 1,500 meters

Oval, Dec 10
Russia's Denis Yuskov broke the men's 1,500-meter world record on Saturday in the World Cup speedskating event at the Utah Olympic Oval. Yuskov finished in 1 minute, 41.02 seconds to break the mark of 1:41.04 set by American Shani Davis on the same ice in a World Cup race on Dec 11, 2009. Dutchman Koen Verweij was second in 1:41.63, and countryman Thomas Krol was third in 1:42.63. American Joey Mantia was fourth in 1:42.77, Davis 13th, and American Brian Hansen was 16th.

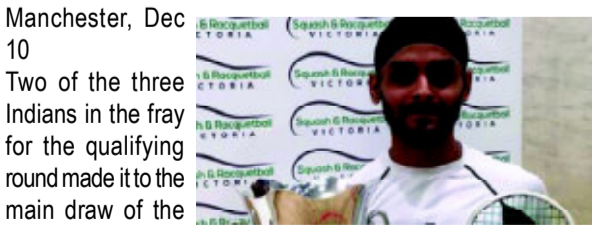
