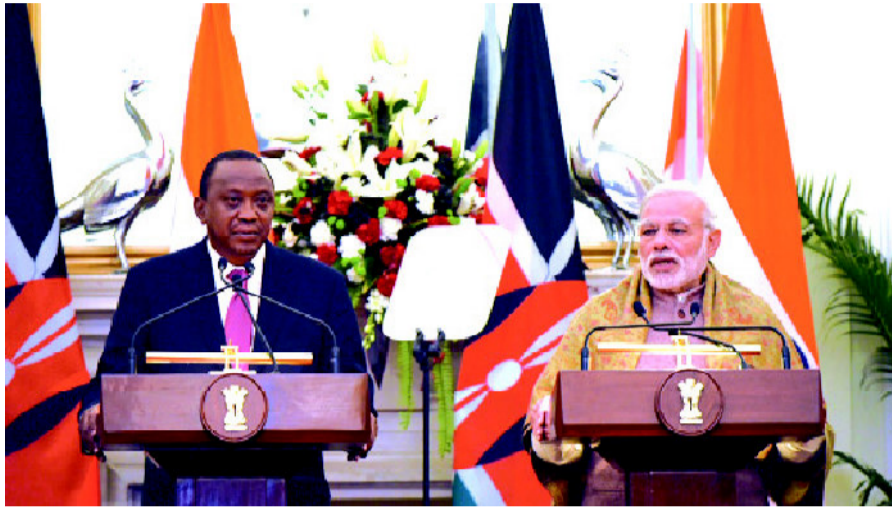

## India, Kenya sign agreements in area of agriculture

New Delhi, Jan 11  
 India and Kenya today signed agreements in the area of agriculture which were inked after delegation level talks between Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi and Kenyan President Mr. Uhuru Kenyatta in New Delhi. In his press statement, Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi said, expansion of bilateral trade, greater flow of capital between two economies and stronger developmental partnership is a priority. He said India is collaborating with Kenya to raise agricultural



productivity there. He said the Loan of Credit Agreement of 100 million dollars signed today for farm mechanisation will open a new dimension of engagement between the two countries. Mr Kenyatta was accorded a ceremonial welcome at the forecourt of Rashtrapati Bhawan this

morning. President Shri Pranab Mukherjee and Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi welcomed Mr. Kenyatta. He also laid a wreath at Rajghat.

**Virat Kohli Eyes Top Spot In ICC's ODI Rankings**

Dubai, Jan 11  
India's new limited overs skipper Virat Kohli will have a chance to climb to the top slot for on the International Cricket Council's One-Day Internationals (ODI) batting rankings when India take on England in a three-match series beginning on January 15. The Delhi batsman, who was named skipper of both the ODI and T20I teams recently, is on top of the Twenty20 International rankings for batsmen but is placed second in Tests and the 50-over format. The 28-year-old is only one spot behind the formidable South African AB de Villiers in ODI rankings.

David Warner, who destroyed Pakistan's bowling in Sydney, is ranked third – just two points behind Kohli. England's Joe Root is seventh, whereas Pakistan's highest-ranked batsman is Babar Azam in 15th position. Mitchell Starc, who was the Player of the ICC Cricket World Cup 2015, will start as the highest-ranked bowler in the upcoming One-Day International matches. He trails New Zealand's number-one ranked Trent Boult by 13 points. England's Adil Rashid will start in fifth position, India's Amit Mishra

at 12th and 39th-ranked Wahab Riaz of Pakistan is his side's highest-ranked bowler. Languishing at the bottom of ODI team ranking, Pakistan have set their sights on direct qualification for the ICC Cricket World Cup when they take on the in-form reigning world champions and number-one ranked Australia in a five-ODI series starting in Brisbane on Friday. Former world champions Pakistan are presently in serious danger of failing to qualify directly for the ICC's pinnacle 50-over tournament in the United Kingdom as they are sitting in eighth position on 89 points - two behind Bangladesh and two ahead of the West Indies.

**Boxer Manny Pacquiao set to return to ring on April 23**

Brisbane, Nov 11  
Manny Pacquiao will add another fight to his long career resume when he takes on Australian welterweight Jeff Horn on April 23 at a venue to be decided. Promoter Duco Events said on Wednesday the location for the fight involving the 38-year-old Manny Pacquiao could be in one of Australia's major cities, possibly Horn's hometown of Brisbane, or the Middle East or United States. "The preference for all parties is for the fight to be held in Australia, and we are working towards this outcome," said Duco director Dean Lonergan, who met with Top Rank chief Bob Arum this week to set up the fight.

**Leander Paes, Andre Sa knock out top seeds Treat Huey, Max Mirnyi to enter quarter-finals**

Auckland, Jan 11  
Leander Paes and his new partner Andre Sa shocked the top-seeded pair of Treat Huey and Max Mirnyi in the ASB Classic, recording their first victory together after joining forces for this season. Unseeded Paes and his Brazilian teammate knocked out the top seeds 7-6(3) 6-3 to make it to the quarterfinals of the USD 508,360 hard court event which is an Australia Open series tournament. Paes and Sa, who lost the first round at Chennai Open to eventual runners-up Purav Raja and Divij Sharan, lost their serve once and broke

their rivals twice in the match, lasting one hour and 14 minutes. They next face the wildcard pair of Marcus Daniell and Marcelo Deloliner. Since Daniell is likely to be in the New Zealand team which will travel to India for the Asia/Oceania Group I tie in February, the match will give Paes a chance to have a measure of him as they will be up against each other in the doubles rubber. Meanwhile, at the WTA Apia International, top seeds Sania Mirza and Barbora Strycova reached the semifinals with a 6-3 6-4 win over wildcard entrants Madison Brengle and Arina Rodionova.

**FIH makes Sreejesh member of Athletes' Committee**

New Delhi, Jan 11  
The Indian men's hockey team captain PR Sreejesh on Wednesday became a member of International Hockey Federation (FIH) Athletes' Committee. FIH Athletes' Committee comprises a total of eight current and former hockey players who have the responsibility to act as a liaison between the FIH and the athletes to make sure the players have voice in the FIH decision making process. Sreejesh, who led the Indian team to a historic silver medal feat at the FIH Champions Trophy in London last year, said he was looking forward to the responsibility bestowed

upon him by the FIH. "It's a great honour to be part of the FIH Athletes' Committee which comprises of legendary players like Moritz Fuerste and other international greats. I am looking forward to this new responsibility," he said. While Sreejesh's role will be to seek and provide feedback to the FIH on behalf of all athletes, the Committee also gets to interact with the current athletes in a number of ways including post event surveys for the athletes and coaches to get direct feedbacks from the FIH events. Organised meetings are also scheduled with the national teams at several events. The aim is to

communicate with the players, to update them on the different activities but also to hear from them. "We get to work together to develop the game and put forth players concerns and suggestions. It's a great initiative by the FIH to directly involve the players and I look forward to giving my suggestions with the inputs of our coaching staff, my team who I am sure will support me in this new endeavor. I see this as a great responsibility in terms of helping FIH develop the game globally," said Sreejesh, who is gearing up to play for the Uttar Pradesh Wizards in the Hockey India League, slated to begin on January 21.

**Jimmy Adams appointed new West Indies director**

Jamaica, Jan 11  
West Indies turned to former batsman Jimmy Adams to help rebuild the side as he was named their new director of cricket. Adams played 54 Test matches for the Caribbean side and will be able to draw upon from his vast experience as he turns his attention to overseeing the development of West Indies cricket at all levels.

The 49-year-old returned to Jamaica after ending a five-year spell as head coach of English county side Kent last October. He replaces Englishman Richard Pybus who had been in the position since November 2013. However, the West Indies are still without a head coach after the departure of Phil Simmons in September, just five months after their World T20 triumph.
