## Administration taking all possible steps to normalize power supply

# Minister of Power holds meeting in New Delhi; Lt. Governor, CS & others attend meeting

**NTPC to establish 15 MW Power Plant in South Andaman before 31st March, 2018 ■ Establish 50 MW Gas Based Power Plant in South Andaman & Petronet LNG Ltd. will be constructing the Floating, Storage & Re-Gasification Unit (FSRU) for supply of Gas to the 50 MW Power Plant**

**Port Blair, Jan 11**

The Administration is taking all possible steps to reduce the load shedding and normalize the power supply as early as possible. In this regard, a meeting was held by Minister of Power, GOI on Jan.10, 2018 on the request of Lt. Governor, A&N Islands regarding present power shortage in South Andaman and the Best Energy Mix for these Islands to provide 24x7 power supply to all as envisaged by Govt. of India.

The meeting was attended by the Lt. Governor, Chief Secretary, Commr-cum-Secretary (Power), wherein Secretary (MOP), Secretary (MNRE) GOI, CMD (NTPC), Chairman (CEA), Managing Director (PLL), Additional Secretary (MHA) along with other officials from Ministry of Power, Ministry of New & Renewable Energy, PGCIL, SECI and NLC etc. were also present. In the said meeting, it was decided that NTPC will establish 15 MW Power Plant in South Andaman before 31st March, 2018 as a short term solution to tide over the present power crisis. On long term basis, NTPC will establish 50 MW Gas Based Power Plant in South

Andaman and Petronet LNG Ltd., will be constructing the Floating, Storage & Re-Gasification Unit (FSRU) for supply of Gas to the 50 MW Power Plant.

In the Renewable Energy sector, the Minister directed NTPC & NLC to go ahead with the Solar Plants along with requisite Battery Energy

Storage System (BESS) to check the intermittencies due to cloud movement. It was also decided that PGCIL shall go ahead to establish Energy Management Centre (EMC) for which funds will be arranged by Ministry of Power, a communication from Electricity Department said here today.

### MP writes letter to Ministry of I&B for creation of supernumerary post for Tourism Deptt.

Port Blair, Jan 11  
The 32 workers of Department of Tourism in consonance with the GOIs OM.No. 490 14/2/86/Estt(C) dated 07.06.1988, working on daily wages since 1994-95 were allowed 1/30th Pay plus DA with effect from 01.01.1996 in compliance to the High Court Order date 16.02.2001. These workers are consistently demanding for regularization of their service. Since there was no vacancy in the Department of Tourism, the Administration

sometime in the year of 2015 has taken up the issue with the Ministry for creation of Supernumerary post to regularize the services of 32 workers. Meanwhile, the issue was brought to the notice of the Member of Parliament, A & N Islands, Shri Bishnu Pada Ray. Since, the issue concerned to benefit of low paid employees, Shri Bishnu Pada Ray in reference to his all previous letters/correspondences has once again taken up the

matter with the Ministry of Information & Broadcasting, GOI, new Delhi vide letter dated 04.01.2018. In the aforesaid letter, Shri B.P.Ray has impressed upon the Ministry to explore the possibilities for creation of supernumerary post in the Tourism Department, A & N Administration to regularize the services of 32 workers. The Ministry may take favourable decision in the matter, a communication from MP Bhawan said.

Former world champion L Sarita Devi (60kg) and Asian silver-medallist Sonia Lather (57kg) advanced to the semifinals after clinching facile quarterfinal wins in the National Women's Boxing Championships, here on Wednesday.  
Representing the All India Police, Sarita out-punched Arunachal Pradesh's Aquilla Dupak in the first round itself to make the medal rounds.  
Railway Sports Promotion Board's Sonia, on the other hand, defeated Uttarakhand's Kamla Bisht 5-0.  
Among other prominent names, former junior world champion Nikhat Zareen (51kg) sailed



past Chattisgarh's Abha to be assured of her second successive medal.  
Also entering the semifinals was RSPB's Pavitra (60kg), a former world championships quarterfinalist, got the better of Manipur's Chaoba Devi.

interacting with 'The Daily Telegrams' on the sidelines of his visit to the Islands to conduct a workshop on 'New Media' as an art form. The fortnight long workshop is being organized at Old Andaman Club here from Jan 2 by Kala Kendra - a Society under the Department of Art & Culture, A & N Administration in collaboration with Lalit Kala Akademi, Regional Centre, Kolkata on Community Based Art Activity with migrant communities of the Islands.  
Elaborating on the concept of New Media, Shri Sanchayan said it is a community based activity as art is always connected with personal or individual interpretation. It is also an inter-disciplinary practice of art where historical, scientific, anthropological and sociological inter relationship is done through art.  
This Art is more than 100 years old and it is all about aesthetic of electrical energy or electric as a source of projection. In 50's - 60's with the advent of electrical gadgets technology became accessible to human use and artists also started using it as a tool. He said music was also about hearing, then it became recording and finally it became hearing of archive. Artists used it as a medium to connect with the society. It was felt that personal interpretation can be connected. Earlier, happenings where in an isolated manner like music used electronic energy in one way, film and television in another way. Everything is finally expression of time (contemporary life). New Media created a certain temporality generating critical collective view points about an experience, it is an archive of both private memory and how it can reflect history as the experience of the present.  
For example, a person is using an android mobile and he has also the data like photos, videos etc. though it is personal, it can be documented and become a part of history. This is what precisely new media is all about, he said. The workshop is being held everyday in the afternoon where a collective process of mapping the landscape of Andaman will be explored from the point of view of migration and ownership, he added.

**Mithali to lead, teenager Jemimah in Indian team to South Africa**

Seventeen-year-old Mumbai's Jemimah Rodrigues has been named in the Indian women's squad for the three-match ODI series against South Africa in Kimberley (Feb. 5 and 7) and Potchefstroom (Feb. 10). The team will play a warm-up game at Bloemfontein on February 2.

**Rahul to replace Dhawan for 2nd Test: Rohit may get another chance**

Johnesburg, Jan 11  
In a Test match build-up, few elements make for a juicy debate the way dissecting a combination of the playing eleven does. Why this batsman and why not that. Why a five-bowler attack at the cost of an extra batsman. Why risk a debutant in place of an experienced Test cap. Experts rarely come to an agreement on these issues with opinions alone adding to the build-up of a game like little else. The Cape Town Test, one that India lost to South Africa by 72 runs in almost four days, with one of those days getting robbed by rain, led to one such build-up. The young debutant Jasprit Bumrah's selection over the more experienced Ishant Sharma and Umesh Yadav wasn't spared either, except that the bowler with the unorthodox action, mere 24 years of age, put an end to this one debate after bowling the spell of the Test match.  
Benching Lokesh Rahul to open with Shikhar Dhawan and Murali Vijay; benching Ajinkya Rahane at No. 5 and opting for Rohit Sharma; and not roping in the tall Ishant Sharma to take advantage of the Newlands wicket still remain a topic of discussion and will continue to, perhaps, until the start of the second Test.
