New Delhi, Feb 11
 President, Vice President and Prime Minister have condoled the passing away of Siachen avalanche survivor Lance Naik Hanumanthappa Koppad. The brave Army soldier Lance Naik Hanumanthappa, who had miraculously survived after remaining buried under 35 feet snow for over five days after an avalanche hit Siachen, passed away at R&R hospital in New Delhi today following multiple organ failure.

In his message, President Shri Pranab Mukherjee said, Lance Naik Hanumanthappa was a hero who demonstrated exemplary will power and courage in the face of adversity and made the supreme sacrifice in the line of duty. ISRO to launch Cryogenic mark- III based GSLV satellite vehicle in Dec

Hyderabad, Feb 11 The Indian Space Research Organisation -ISRO will launch the Cryogenic mark-III based GSLV satellite launch vehicle during December this year. ISRO senior official and VSSC Director Dr K Sivan told reporters on the sidelines of the 10th High Energy Materials Conference and Exhibition held in Hyderabad this morning. He said the GSLV will be Stage-tested in two months and go for launching in December. He also said the electric propulsion will be used in the satellites for the first time in India. He further said ISRO will also undertake tests to bring back humans

safe to earth in case if sent to space and the moon. Defence laboratory - HEMRL Director K P S Murthy said extensive research is underway to develop the table-top Explosives Detector Kits to identify initially over 20 types of explosive materials. He said it will take about three years

to bring them into use. These single kits can be used anywhere such as Airports and fields for Defence and civil purpose. The three day International Conference on High Energy Material has witnessed about 600 researchers and academicians working in high energy materials.

Powerless Elephanta island to get electricity from I-Day

Mumbai, Feb 11 Nearly 1,200 residents of the Elephanta island, famous for its Hindu cave sculptures and located around 10 km off Mumbai coast, will have electricity from the Independence Day this year. Elephanta, a popular tourist destination, despite its proximity to the country's financial capital and housing caves which were designated as a UNESCO World Heritage site, is still without electricity.

Maharashtra Energy Minister Shri Chandrashekhar Bawankule said that the state government will lay an underwater power cable network between mainland Mumbai and the island at a cost of 28 crore rupees for electrification. This will be done with technical assistance from US and UK-based companies. The government has also decided to provide electricity supply to the Ajanta-Ellora caves.
