Indian Navy decommissions fighter planes 'Sea Harriers'

45 new generation Mig 29 K fighters inducted

New Delhi, May 11
Indian Navy has decommissioned its fleet of iconic Sea Harriers. The Naval Air Squadron 300 - I NAS 300, popularly known as 'white tigers', today de-inducted these fighter aircrafts and replaced them with new generation Mig 29 K fighters in a touching ceremony on INS Hansa near Vasco. Wing Commander Shikhu Raj, a Sea Harrier Pilot himself and the commander of the squadron handed over the command of the squadron to Captain KHV Singh in an historic ceremony and bid adieu to the Sea Harriers. The function was presided over by the Chief of Naval



Staff Admiral R. K. Dhowan. Called the glorious heritage of Indian Navy, Sea Harriers were inducted in 1983 and played a pivotal role in various operations. Designed and manufactured by British Aerospace, Sea Harrier is a

naval Short-Vertical Take-Off and Landing Jet Fighter, used for both reconnaissance and strike. The use of the ski jump take offs from a short flight deck with a heavier load was a specialty of these 33 year serving fighter jets. Chief of Naval Staff

RBI to issue Rs 1000 bank notes with inset letter R

Mumbai, May 11
Reserve Bank of India will shortly issue bank notes of 1000 rupees denominations with inset letter 'R' in both the number panels. In a release, RBI said that the banknotes will also have on the obverse, all the other security features, including ascending size of numerals, bleed lines and enlarged identification mark. It added that the bank notes bearing signature of RBI Governor Dr. Raghuram G Rajan, will also have the year of printing '2016' printed on the reverse. It also added that All the banknotes in the denomination of 1000 rupees issued by RBI in the past, would continue to be legal tender.

The Member of Parliament, Shri Bishnu Pada Ray along with three Councillors of PBMC, Shri Eswar Rao, Smt. Rubana Aziz and Smt. Vinita Malhotra met Shri Venkaiah Naidu, Minister of Parliamentary Affairs and Urban Development, GoI, New Delhi yesterday and shared the grievances related to PBMC. They discussed with the Minister regarding allocation of Plan fund. They stated that from the year 2011-12 to 2016 the allocation of plan fund was 8% on an average Rs.140

crores whereas it comes on an average Rs.500 crores which was recommended by the 3rd Finance Commission (UT) and approved by the MHA 25-35%. Accordingly, 4th Finance Commission recommended on an average 35% of Plan fund but District Planning Committee representing Municipal Council and PRIs alongwith MP demanded - 25% which comes for the year 2015-16 i.e. Rs.900 crores. 25% for Rs.2250 crores for the year 2015-16 is only Rs.169 crores i.e. 7.69%

(including PRIs and Municipal Council) out of which an allocation of PBMC is only Rs.39.08 crore i.e. 1.78%. UT Commission recommended for non-plan fund of 2% to PBMC for maintenance of work but is was not implemented. The Minister heard patiently and asked the delegation to meet the Home Minister and submit their demands and he would also personally talk to Home Minister to redress their grievances at the earliest, a communication from the MP Bhawan said.
