## Supreme Court's direction on use of horns Multi-toned horns to be removed from all vehicles within a month

Port Blair, July 11  
The Supreme Court, in 2013 had directed that no other vehicles except those specified in Rule 119(3) Rules or similar provisions contained in the rules framed by the State Governments or the Administration of Union Territories shall be fitted with multi-toned horns giving a succession of different notes or with any

other sound producing device giving an unduly, harsh, shrill, loud or alarming noise. Accordingly, the Registering Authority, Directorate of Transport, A&N Administration has asked owners/users of the vehicles fitted with multi-toned horns other than those allowed to use such horns under Rule 119(3) of

the 1989 Rules or corresponding rules framed by the State Governments and the Administration of the Union Territories, to remove the multi-toned horns, within a period of one month from today. The Officers authorized to enforce the provisions of the 1988 Act and the rules framed there under by the

Central Government, the State Governments and the Administration of Union Territories shall also ensure that multi-toned horns are removed from all the vehicles except those specified in Rule 119(3) of the 1989 Rules or corresponding rules framed by the State Governments and the

## ICC Women's World Cup 2017: India, Australia Look To Get Back To Winning Ways

London, July 11  
Their four-match unbeaten streak brought to a halt, India will be keen to bounce back and take a step towards securing a semifinal spot when they take on the mighty Australia in the ICC Women's World Cup on Wednesday. India were on a rampaging run beating England, West Indies, Pakistan and Sri Lanka before South Africa disturbed their momentum with a massive 115-run win.

Similarly Australia's four-match unbeaten run was stopped by England in the previous game and they would also look to get back to winning ways. Neither of the teams have yet qualified for the semi-finals but Australia are in a better position by virtue of a strong net run-rate. The Aussies lost to England by just three runs, while India were defeated by a huge margin. In the previous game against South Africa, India had a great chance of sealing a semifinal berth but now they have their task cut out in the remaining round robin games against two strong teams in Australia and New Zealand.



India's record against Australia is not great with eight wins in 41 completed matches, but skipper Mithali Raj's 89 set up a five-wicket win the last time the teams met. Shikha Pandey, who came back into the side against South Africa and took three wickets for 40 runs, said her team was aware of the precarious position they were in. "We need to play more attacking cricket and need to plan better. Even before the World Cup started, we said that we were going to do our best and not have to depend on other teams," she added. For Australia, tomorrow's game

is a return to Bristol where England sneaked a three-run win and skipper Meg Lanning said they would have to bounce back quickly and put on a strong performance. "Against England was not our best performance with the ball but hopefully we can learn from that pretty quickly and come back for India," said Lanning. ## Historic series win for Zimbabwe



Hambantota, July 11  
All-rounder Sikandar Raza starred with both bat and ball to help Zimbabwe beat Sri Lanka by three wickets and clinch a historic series victory in the fifth and final ODI at the Mahinda Rajapaksa International Stadium, Hambantota on Monday. Taking the series 3-2 in Hambantota, 11th-ranked Zimbabwe registered its maiden series win in Sri Lanka, and first overseas triumph in eight years. Raza took 3 for 21 in 10 overs with his off-spin to restrict the home side to 203 for 8 after Zimbabwe elected to field first. Hamilton Masakadza, the

Zimbabwe opener, top-scored with a fluent 73 before Akila Dananjaya, the rookie off-spinner, struck back with four wickets to rattle the Zimbabwe middle-order. The team slipped from 137 for 1 to 175 for 7 - losing six wickets for 38 runs - but Raza and Graeme Cremer, the skipper who made 11 not out, hung on for an unbeaten 29-run stand as Zimbabwe erupted in celebration. Raza, named Player of the Match, was complemented by Cremer, who took two wickets with his wily leg-spin, most notably the prized scalp of his opposite number Angelo Mathews (24).

## Roger Federer and Andy Murray reach Wimbledon quarterfinals

London, July 11  
Roger Federer and Andy Murray, much to the delight of the Centre Court crowd, both reached the Wimbledon quarterfinals on Monday. Federer is a seven-time champion at the All England Club and one of the fan favorites. He advanced to the quarterfinals for the 15th time by beating Grigor Dimitrov 6-4, 6-2, 6-4. Murray is also adored at the grass-court major. He is a two-time Wimbledon champion, but maybe more important, he is British and in 2013 became the first homegrown player to win the men's title in 77 years. On Monday, he beat Benoit Paire 7-6 (1), 6-4, 6-4. The first man to reach the



quarterfinals was Marin Cilic. The seventh-seeded Croat beat Roberto Bautista Agut 6-2, 6-2, 6-2. Cilic, who won the U.S. Open in 2014, will be playing the quarterfinals at the All England Club for the fourth straight year. In the women's draw, five-time Wimbledon champion Venus Williams won, and top-ranked Angelique

Kerber lost. Federer reached the Wimbledon quarterfinals in 2001 and then won the first of five straight titles in 2003. He will next face either Milos Raonic or Alexander Zverev. Murray will play Sam Querrey on Wednesday. The 24th-seeded American defeated Kevin Anderson 5-7, 7-6 (5), 6-3, 6-7 (11), 6-3.

## Rates of PDS kerosene oil revised

Port Blair, July 11  
All the SKO dealers, Kerosene oil beneficiaries and FPS Owners of Andaman and Nicobar Islands have been informed that on implementation of the Goods & Services Tax (GST) Act, 2017 w.e.f 1st July 2017, 5% GST is applicable on PDS kerosene oil. Consequently upon this, the wholesale & retail price of PDS kerosene oil have been revised by the A&N Administration for the entire Union Territory of A&N Islands. Accordingly, wholesale price of SKO per litre will be Rs. 22.72/- while the retail price of SKO per litre will be Rs. 24.10/-

The revised rates shall come into force with immediate effect, a communication said.

Administration of Union Territories.

As per Rule 119(2) of Central Motor Vehicles Rules, 1989, no motor vehicles including agricultural tractor shall be fitted with any multi-toned horns giving a succession of different notes or with any other sound producing device giving an unduly harsh, shrill, loud or alarming noise.

As per Rule 119(3) of Central Motor Vehicles Rules, 1989 nothing contained in sub rule(2) shall prevent the use of vehicles used as ambulance or for fire-fighting or salvage purpose or on vehicles used by police officers or operators of construction equipment vehicles or officers of the Motor Vehicle Department in the course of their duties or on construction equipment vehicles of such sound signals as may be approved by the registering authority in whose jurisdiction such vehicles are kept.

In view of this, all the vehicle owners have been advised to strictly comply with the directions of the Supreme Court and the provision of Rule 119 of CMVR, 1989 regarding multi-toned horn otherwise strict action as per the extant Rule provision would be initiated against the violators, a communication said.

Days will come when the Islands' economy will boom, he said. He also informed that small business men whose sales and services is less than Rs. 20 lakhs will not come in the purview of GST.

The MP also informed that in January this year, the Govt. has fixed the minimum wage of labour to Rs. 437/- per day. But owing to one reason or the other, the same could not be implemented for the past six months. The MP was of the opinion that the minimum wage in the Islands should also be fixed.

Australian Jeff Horn's shock welterweight title victory over Manny Pacquiao was confirmed today after a scoring review by the World Boxing Organization declared him the clear winner. The WBO took a close look at the fight after Pacquiao, backed by the Philippine government's sports regulatory body, criticised the referee and the judges and demanded a review after losing in Brisbane on July 2. Horn stunned the Filipino legend -- who has won world

titles in an unprecedented eight weight divisions -- with his ultra-aggressiveness to earn a unanimous 12-round decision. The WBO -- which does not have the power to reverse a decision unless fraud or law violations are proven -- set up a panel of independent judges who were asked to watch the bout without sound and determine who won each round. The results were tabulated to show clearly the rounds each fighter won using an average scale based on 60, 80 and 100 percent, with three

of the five officials needing to be in agreement. A similar method has been used to review WBO title fights before. "Upon the analysis, the findings stated that Pacquiao won the 3rd, the 8th and 9th by 100 percent; the 5th round was won by 80 percent; and the 11th round by 60 percent," the WBO said in a statement. "Horn won the 1st, 6th and 12th rounds by 100 percent; rounds 2, 4, and 7 by 80 percent; and then, the 10th round by 60 percent.
