Aadhar will be optional for availing various govt schemes: SC

New Delhi, Aug 11

Aadhar card will be optional for availing various welfare schemes of the government. The Supreme Court today said this and ordered that no personal information of the holders of such cards shall be shared by any authority. A three-judge bench, said the Centre shall give wide publicity through electronic and print media that the card is not mandatory to avail the government schemes.

The court made it clear that even for PDS, kerosene and LPG distribution system, the card will not be

mandatory. The court was hearing a batch of petitions challenging the Aadhar scheme and the issue



whether right to privacy is a fundamental right. It directed that the information received by UIDAI shall not

be used for any other purposes, except in criminal investigation, with the permission of the court.

Two day seminar concludes CS underlines need for preparing plan of action for improving quality of education



Port Blair, Aug. 11

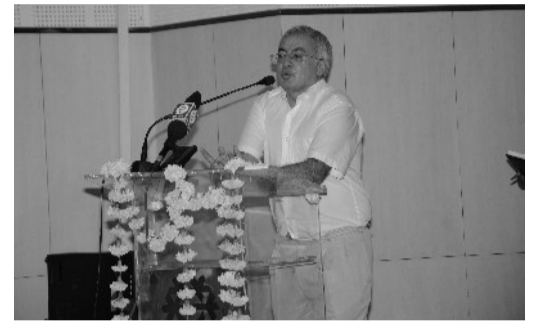
The two day seminar on "Improvement of Academic Standard and Quality of Education", organized by the Directorate of Education at DBRAIT auditorium, concluded with a valedictory function here this evening.

Addressing the gathering as the chief guest of the valedictory function, the Chief Secretary, Shri Anand Prakash underlined the need for preparing plan of action for improving the quality of education. "This is imperative because there is need to impart quality education to students for their better future", he said asking the Principals and teachers to give feedback/suggestions to the Directorate of Education for framing future plan. He urged the teachers to do their best in delivering quality education to students. The chief guest also gave away mementoes to the resource persons of the seminar.

Summing up the seminar, the Commissioner cum Secretary (Edn.), Shri Raajiv Yaduvanshi said that it is the collective responsibility of the

teachers to deliver quality education to the students. "They need to analyze each student so that any gap in the teaching could be located and accordingly, corrective measures can be taken up", he said. The vision should be to groom each and every student to excel in both academic and extra-curricular activities. However, efforts should also be made to introduce vocational education, which will help them gain employment in future, he said and called upon the Zonal Officers/Principals, to prepare short term, as well as long term plan for every school towards improvement in the quality of education in the Islands. This, he said, can be achieved, and the Islands can set example for the rest of the country.

The Secretary (Education), Ms. Tanvi Garg spoke about her student life experience and said every subject has its own importance. Every student should get equal opportunity in studying the subject of his/her choice and the attitude towards



undermining the importance of a subject, be it art, commerce or language, should change, she added.

The Secretary (Planning), A&N Administration, Ms. Ankita Mishra Bundela spoke on the topic 'Improving Quality of Education' and shared her observation and experiences in the field of education. She highlighted the basic premise of quality education and stressed on the need for ensuring the quality of learning rather than focusing on the input side. She also enlightened the gathering about various funds and flagship programmes launched by the Govt. of India for the purpose of imparting quality education, which, she said, should be implemented in the right earnest. She stressed on the need for team effort which is necessary for bringing about changes. She further added that

with the resources available, there should be proper implementation along with positive monitoring; which will give rise to quality in education.

The resource person, Ms. Neetu Kapoor, Principal of GD Goenka School, Noida, spoke on the topic 'Mentoring and Monitoring of Teachers' and said striving for excellence should be the priority of every head of the institution as well as the teachers. She deliberated on the roles and responsibilities of teacher as a mentor in paving way for students to realize their dreams. She highlighted the aims of education, which focuses upon making the student better, stronger and brighter. This, she said, should be the foremost responsibility of teachers. More than 3,50,000 toilets constructed under Swachh Vidyalaya Campaign

New Delhi, Aug 11

Government has said that more than three lakh 50 thousand toilets have been constructed across the country under the Swachh Vidyalaya Campaign as on 3rd of this month. Human Resource Development Minister Smti Smriti Irani yesterday informed Rajya Sabha in a written reply. She said, States and Union

Territories, Public Sector Undertakings from 15 Central Ministries and more than 10 private sector entities are involved in construction of toilets in schools.

Smti Irani said her Ministry has taken various steps to facilitate the construction of toilets within the time frame. She said, funds were made available to States under Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan and

Rashtriya Madhyamik Shiksha Abhiyan for taking up the programmes. The Minister also informed that the progress is monitored on a continuous basis at the national level. She said, in addition to this, about 310 central observers were deputed to visit districts to review the progress of the Swachh Vidyalaya Initiative.

India vs Sri Lanka: Virat Kohli looks to impress in first full series

Galle, Aug 11
Virat Kohli's aggressive strategy to deploy five specialist bowlers will be tested when India go into the three-match cricket Test series against Sri Lanka here on Wednesday, hoping to end a 22-year-old wait for a series triumph on Lankan soil.

While the baton had passed on to him from Mahendra Singh Dhoni in Sydney, this is Kohli's first full assignment in charge after the one-off-Test in Bangladesh.

Kohli has already promised to provide an aggressive brand of leadership and go into Test matches with five bowlers in a bid to take 20 wickets.

His journey as Test skipper had begun in Adelaide where he stood-in for Dhoni on account of injury, and led India valiantly to a 48-run loss, despite two sterling hundreds in both innings.

In Sydney, he was defiant in the mannerism of his team selection, chopping and changing a side worn down by poor form, injury and fatigue. At Fatullah, he

Michael Phelps sends message for Rio with epic effort at US meet

Moscow, Aug 11

Olympic swim legend Michael Phelps completed an epic effort at the US national championships Monday, having served notice he has the speed and skill to star at the 2016 Olympics. Phelps only finished fifth in Monday's 200-meter breaststroke final in 2mins 11.30 secs, well off winner Craig Benson's winning time of 2:09.68.

But Phelps seldom swims the event and was entered more as a challenge and training exercise rather than with a victory in mind, having won three events in the prior three days and beaten the winning time at the world championships in Russia in each.

Toronto, Aug 11

"I'm in a great place, a place where I haven't been in a long time, a place where I have confidence," Phelps said. "I've seen the work I've been doing, and done, has worked."

"I'm going into an Olympic year having something to build on and that hasn't happened in a while, probably since 2007. I'm excited to get back into it."

Nanjappa wins India's sixth shooting quota for Rio Olympics

New Delhi, Aug 11

India's Prakash Nanjappa has earned a quota place for the 2016 Rio Olympics after finishing eighth in the finals of 50-metre men's pistol event at the ISSF World Cup in Gabala, Azerbaijan.

The 39-year-old Bangalore-based shooter is the sixth shooter to have earned the country a quota place for next year's quadrennial extravaganza.

He finished the qualification with a score of 567 that put him in second spot. Nanjappa was eliminated after the eighth final shot with 70.1 points. Nevertheless, he won applause of the spectators crowding Gabala's finals hall.

hoping to leave Lankan cricket in good hands, and defying the Indian team one last time.

World Badminton Championships: PV Sindhu, Kidambi Srikanth surge ahead

Jakarta, Aug 11

Top Indian shuttlers P.V. Sindhu and Kidambi Srikanth earned contrasting wins in their respective categories to advance at the World Championships being held at the 9000-seater Istora Senayan here on Tuesday.

Coming back from a long injury layoff, 11th seed Sindhu had to work hard for 50 minutes to move past Danish Line Kjaersfeldt 11-21, 21-17, 21-16 in the women's singles second round. Though the two-time World Championship bronze medalist lost the first game, she found her rhythm to bounce back

and win the next two games. In the third round, the 20-year-old faces a tough task as she will go up against reigning Olympic champion and third seed Li Xuerui. The Chinese has a 2-1 advantage over Sindhu in career meetings.

Later, men's singles third seed Srikanth got off to a positive start with a 21-10, 21-13 win over Australia's Michael Farman in 24 minutes. The Guntur-born lad will next take on Chinese Taipei's Hsu Jen Hao against whom Srikanth won the only match played between them last year in Denmark.
